Our gratitude also to the hospital administration and the Sisters of Mercy for accepting the challenges of this education program and supporting its work and mission.


1989 is also a time to look ahead to review our commitment to excellence in nursing education and pledge ourselves to help find new ways to meet the challenges which face us during the next fifty years.





# SCHOOL OF NURSING HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS



St. Clare's Mercy Hospital, School of Nursing was officially opened in 1939 by his Grace Archbishop E.P. Roche. The motto chosen for the school was "Misericordia Super Omnia", (Mercy Above All). The school's first director was Sister M. Stanislaus Parsons.



The first graduation was held on February 19, 1941. Five graduates comprised the first class: -

Lillian Coleman  
Ethel Goff  
Ann Hogan  
Eileen O'Brien  
Margaret O'Reilly

In the early forties, affiliations to other city hospitals began.

- Hospital for Mental and Nervous Diseases
- St. John's Sanitorium
- Fever Hospital

Throughout the forties and into the early 1950's, the nurses' examinations were set and corrected by a committee of medical doctors through the Department of Health and under the control of the Newfoundland Government. This system of academic evaluation continued until the Association of Registered Nurses was inaugurated in 1953.

In 1944 Sister M. Xaverius (Sister Catherine Kenny) was appointed Director of the School and shortly afterwards, Emily Neville became the first full-time Instructor in the School.



The Alumnae Association was formed on April 25, 1944. The first President was Lillian Coleman, a member of the first Graduating Class.

The first School Yearbook, The Claretian was published in 1953. The editor was Margaret Lynch.

The sisters who taught in the school during the early 1950's, Sister M. Fabian Hennebury, Sister M. St. Joan McDonnell, and Sister M. Calas Sanctus Power would later be appointed Administrators of the hospital and Directors of Education of the School of Nursing.

The Residence and School, Our Lady of Lourdes Hall was officially opened on September 24, 1958 by His Grace, Most Reverend P.J. Skinner. The new accommodations allowed the school to increase annual enrollments from thirty-five (35) to fifty (50).

1958-59 - The School's Organizational plan was systematically developed, an executive committee was formed, the additional affiliations were organized and the student Government Association was inaugurated.

During the late 1950's, affiliations with the V.O.N. and St. Patrick's Mercy Home were introduced.

In 1960 Sister M. Xaverius was granted sabbatical leave to complete her B.Sc. in Nursing at St. Louis University. In her absence Sister M. Calas Sanctus Power served in a dual capacity of Director of Education and of the School.

1961 - Students completing the nursing program, wrote the American State Board Test Pool Examinations. This practice continued until 1970 when a National Canadian Examination was developed.

1961 - First Glee Club was initiated under the Directorship of Sister Mary Edward, R.S.M.

1962 - In keeping with the by-laws of the hospital, an advisory committee to the School of Nursing was established. The first chairman of this committee was Msgr. J.J. Murray.

1963 - First student Health Program was organized. The school's first Student Health Nurse was Gertrude Sullivan.

1963 - A ten month Nursing Assistant Course began. The coordinator of the program was Isabel Fennessey.

1964 - marked the Silver Jubilee of the School. A number of special events marked the occasion and a special edition of the Yearbook was issued.

1965 - Arrangements were finalized for clinical placements of Memorial University nursing students at St. Clare's Hospital.

During the 1960's new affiliations at Janeway Child Health Centre, Cottage Hospitals and The General Hospital were organized, while affiliations in Tuberculosis and Communicable Diseases were able to be discontinued.

The 1960's brought many changes, increased demands for health care services and facilities necessitated the need to further develop nursing programs. A two year plus one program offering two years of theory and one year nurse internship was developed and approved by the Association of Registered Nurses of Newfoundland and Labrador.

In 1966 Margaret Scott, a graduate of the School of Nursing became the first nurse in Newfoundland to receive her M.D.

1966 - The Legion of Mary was formed and Rita Dobbin was elected the first President.

In the early 1970's, the three nursing diploma programs in St. John's established a joint curriculum committee to organize collaborative programs in Maternity, Pediatrics and Psychiatric Nursing. The programs were offered in the city hospitals utilizing faculty from the three schools.



The history of the School of Nursing and the Hospital are so closely linked that it is difficult to discuss one without reference to the other. In 1972 St. Clare's Mercy Hospital again expanded with the opening of a new wing which improved support services and increased the hospital bed capacity to three-hundred (300).

1973 - The graduation of St. Clare's first male nurse, Aloysius Hawkins, from Admiral's Cove, Southern Shore.

In 1974 Sister Catherine Kenny who had been Director of the School for thirty (30) years retired. Under her direction, the school became an educational institution whose graduates were recognized across the country and elsewhere as competent nursing practitioners. Katherine Daley was appointed to replace Sister as Director of the School.



In 1974 the organizational structure of the school was changed and four Curriculum Co-ordinators were appointed: Isabel Woodford, Margaret Ryan, Charmaine Davis (later in the decade replaced by Mary Keiley) and Mary Barron (to be replaced by Frances Chaytor).

In 1976 at the commencement program and during the Graduation on June 9th, Theresa Hartery from Trepassey became the one-thousandth graduate of the school.

In 1977, The Canadian Nurses Association released the blueprint for the first Canadian Comprehensive Nursing Examination to be written in 1980. This year was significant also because the school graduated its largest class of sixty-four (64) students.

During the 1970's individuals closely associated with the School of Nursing were called to Eternal Life: -

Sister M. Loretta MacIssac  
Sister M. Joseph Byrne  
Lillian Coleman

One extremely valuable contribution to the school was made by Sister Calasanctius Power in 1979 when she researched and wrote a historical account of the schools' first forty (40) years.



1980 - Isabel Woodford later in the decade to be appointed Assistant Director of the School, received her Masters Degree in Educational Administration, from Memorial University of Newfoundland.

In the early 1980's two scholarships were established:

The Sisters of Mercy Anniversary Scholarship was in recognition of the 150th. Anniversary of the founding of the congregation of the Sisters of Mercy in Dublin Ireland in 1931. The first recipient was Eva Nash a 1963 graduate of the school.

The Doctor Francis O'Dea Scholarship was established by the O'Dea Family and would be awarded annually for post graduate studies in Maternal/Child Nursing.

The first recipient was Wanda Earle a 1980 graduate.

In 1981 Sister Catherine Kenny returned to the school to establish the School of Nursing Archieves. The Archives located in Our Lady of Lourdes Hall is filled with school records, photo albums and mementos of the past, all reminders of great memories and traditions.

In 1981 Sister Mary Fabian retired as Executive Director of St. Clare's, having held the position for twenty-six (26) years (1955-1981). Sister Mary Lucy Power (Lucy Dobbin), who has been Associate Executive Director was appointed Executive Director.

In 1982, the Hospital celebrated its 60th. Anniversary and the school began celebrations for the anniversary of the opening of Our Lady of Lourdes Hall.

In 1982, affiliation with Memorial University began. For the first time the University approved credit courses to be offered in the school.

Beginning in the 1980's and continuing throughout the decade, the profile of students entering the school changed. Fewer high school students and more mature students became interested in nursing. By the late 1980's, almost one half of the student population was over twenty-one (21) years of age.

In 1983, two faculty members, Deborah Duff and Joan Marie Aylward, wrote and published "A Metric Guide for Health Professionals on Dosages and Solutions". This text was a first for Canada and is presently in its second edition.

In 1983 a Master Plan for Systematic Program Evaluation was developed by Margaret Ryan. This master plan of evaluation is essentially a Quality Assurance Program for the Nursing Education Department. The plan was implemented in 1984.

In 1984, Theresa (Downey) Smith (Class of 1951), presented her youngest daughter and fifth St. Clare's graduate with her diploma.

In 1986, Sister Elizabeth Davis was appointed Executive Director of St. Clare's Hospital.

In 1986, a Faculty Workload Index Study was completed by Isabel Woodford. The project was a comprehensive study of all professional functions of faculty in the school.

1986 - Holistic Health Care: *The Role of the Nurse, The Role of Self-* an article written by Mary Keiley, was published in Newfoundland, Hospital and Nursing Home, 25th Anniversary publication and selected for publication in Dimensions.

1987 - The school was assessed by external evaluators and granted full approval by the Association of Registered Nurses of Nfld.

Throughout the 1980's, the School applied for and received numerous grants to support projects for our educational program. The projects were mainly coordinated by our Librarian, Dora Braffet. The awarding of one educational grant from Apple Canada, allowed us to begin many computer projects - a computerized Testbank, Dosages and Solutions, computer program and student record system. Patricia Harkins, a faculty member instrumental in the development of our computer programs, was subsequently invited to present the work done with our Testbank at a National Symposium on Computer Applications for Nursing.

# New St. Clare's Hospital Opened by His Grace

October 29th, the Feast of the Kingship of Christ, the day on which he inaugurated the work just two years ago, saw the blessing of the completed new St. Clare's Mercy Hospital by His Grace the Archbishop. In the simple ceremony His Grace was attended by Rt. Rev. Magri, Kitchin and Flynn and his Chaplains at the Mass were Revs. R. McD. Murphy and R. J. Greena. Representatives of the Congregation of Mercy and of the Sisters of Presentation, as well as the Sisters and nursing staff of the Hospital, were present at the Mass which preceded the blessing. When Sisters and nurses had received Holy Communion at the hands of the Archbishop, His Grace addressed those present. Reading the Epistle and Gospel of the twenty-second Sunday after Pentecost he referred to their peculiar appropriateness for this occasion. Continuing His Grace spoke as follows:

"On the 31st of May, in the year 1922—17 years ago last May, St. Clare's Mercy Hospital was opened with a simple religious ceremonial similar to that which has brought us together this morning. The object and ends which we had in view in inaugurating this work at that time were expressed in a brief address which I delivered to the Sisters on that occasion from which I read the following extracts:

"We have long had in view to open a Hospital under the direction of the Sisters of Mercy. Up to the present the obstacles have been insurmountable, and even as it is we are beginning the work in the face of great difficulties—difficulties from which we might well shrink if the enterprise were merely a human one. The work, however, is something more than this; is a work very near to the heart of the Church, some of whose highest and noblest endeavours have been always directed to the alleviation of human suffering. It was with that end in view that many of the Church's Religious Orders were founded, and one of the most important works of the Sisters of Mercy, according to their Institute,

is the care of sick in hospitals. Their hospitals are famed on both sides of the Atlantic and their Sisters rank with the Sisters of Charity in their ministrations to the sick and suffering. We feel that this work so eminently in harmony with the spirit of their Order, will grow and prosper. They are beginning, in a very humble way, a philanthropic work which has vast possibilities for good: they are planting a tiny grain of mustard seed which, we hope, will grow into an immense tree. Year by year, many precious lives are being lost, and much unnecessary suffering being borne through

very inadequately equipped, and managed by a staff on which there was only one trained nursing Sister.

"Today we are opening a large modern Hospital with accommodation for one hundred patients, built on the most approved scientific lines, equipped with everything that modern hospitalisation requires, under the management of a staff that comprises eight trained Nursing Sisters, competent and experienced lay graduates, and a training school of some 30 nurses. Verily, my dear Sisters, the acorn has developed into a mighty oak, the tiny grain of mustard seed has grown, as

of all such sufferers, without distinction of race or creed. For she remembers that her divine Founder, Jesus Christ, deigned to make His own the cause of the sick, and identified Himself with them. And though she has also learnt from Him the providential role often played by suffering, through which man is able, while expiating his faults, to ennoble his character, nevertheless she fully shares her divine Master's compassion for all human misery. She regards it as her mission to continue the campaign which He began here on earth, not only against sin but also against physical evil. This

lack of adequate hospital facilities. We hope that the future will see an extension of hospital work throughout the country, and, in the meantime, we feel it is the duty of the Church to do something, in however small a way, in this great Christian and humanitarian work'.

"More than 17 years have elapsed since these words were spoken, and today we are assembled in this splendid new Hospital to see the completion of the work which was then begun. Those who were present on that day in May, 1922,—and there are some here this morning who will recall it vividly—cannot but contrast the humble beginnings of the work with the consummation which we have reached today. The Hospital was opened in a small building which had been a private residence, ill adapted to Hospital purposes,

we had hoped it would, into an immense tree whose healing branches will soon spread over all sections of this land.

"I do not need to stress this morning the place of the Hospital in the work and mission of the Church. I have already done that in my letter read to the people on the Feast of Christ the King two years ago, and on many occasions since. This morning, at this opening ceremony, I will merely quote to you from a letter written on behalf of His Holiness Pope Pius XII by the Cardinal Secretary of State to the Congress of the International Hospital Association in Toronto:

"Among the works of charity enjoined by the Gospel, the Church has always had most at heart the alleviation of bodily suffering and the care


explains why the Catholic Church has always regarded hospital work, in all its forms, as an activity profoundly religious, and why she considers the care of the sick as an admirable exercise of piety and means of Christian sanctification. Following the example of the Divine Redeemer, who cured bodily maladies without forgetting those of the spirit; she is careful not to separate care of the body from care of the soul."

"In these words which interpret the mind of the Holy Father and of the Church, you have the ideals that should inspire you in the work that lies before you

in this Hospital. You all know that there are many factors and elements that are indispensable to the successful functioning of any Hospital. These are the material Hospital building and its equipment, favourable financial conditions, efficient management, skilled medical and surgical attention, and lastly the service of the Hospital Staff.

"This latter I regard as being by far the most important, and when I say service, I mean unselfish, disciplined, competent, conscientious, and devoted service. That is an element that you, Sisters and Staff of the Hospital, alone can supply. I say to you with all the earnestness at my command that the future of this Hospital lies in your hands, and is placed largely in your care and keeping.

## Description Of New St. Clare's Mercy Hospital

### Work of Healing Begun

COMPLETED, and its new era of service already begun, the new St. Clare's hospital stands as a triumph of construction and a lasting monument to His Grace Archbishop Roche and all who have shared the gigantic task. Last week the new hospital received its first patient and doctors and nurses put its modern equipment into operation. The new hospital is a building of reinforced concrete that combines the latest and best building materials and the highest quality of architecture and workmanship.

The pictures of the various rooms, wards and equipment taken of the new St. Clare's Hospital, illustrating the various views shown on the front page of this issue, were developed and made possible only by the Philadelphia and Freezing Departments of the Daily News.

open new—palea poster, electric heater, radiator, hot water, and service, etc. On the main level is a double kitchen with similar facilities on all other floors.

All the windows are weather shielded and operate with chain hoisted of one pulley. The window shades are metal and the door locks, high doors in windows, handrails throughout are made with every scrap of scrap of the same material. Practically the entire array of things and equipment is of metal or stainless steel, the latter being of wood. The founding Sisters of St. Clare's Mercy Hospital identified the need to educate their own nurses, and in 1939, the School of nursing was opened. With an initial enrollment of nineteen students, the school presented a three year nursing program of concurrent work and study.


During the first ten years of operation, the nursing school provided students with learning experiences primarily through direct patient care. Student nurses were rotated to the various departments in the hospital and performed nursing duties under the tutelage and guidance of the dedicated sister supervisors and head nurses.




Our Lady of Lourdes Hall, the present school of nursing and residence, was opened on the 24 September, 1958 the feast of Our Lady of Mercy. In addition to residential rooms, this new building provided an educational facility conducive to learning and professional development. However, as was acknowledged in the 1958 Claretian:

"The strength of any school depends basically on the competence and devotion of the faculty. It is to the faculty that the fulfillment of the purpose of the school is committed. It is to them that the work of the institution is given. It takes no great experience in teaching to know that however beautifully planned a teaching program may be, it never exists on anything but paper unless it is brought to life by effective teaching."

In 1980, the Canadian Nurse's Association replaced the traditional five part specialty examinations with a comprehensive intergrated approach to the evaluation of candidates seeking licensure to practice nursing in Canada.

By means of "Summer Canada: Student Employment Programs", in the early 1980's, the faculty began to develop their own instructional materials such as slide tapes and video tapes.

Additionally, a grant from the Apple Canada Foundation enabled the faculty to implement a computerized test bank.

Later, a textbook for dosages and solutions was written by two faculty members.




