APRIL 24, 1974 -- Sister Marion Barron, CSJ, PhD, Director of Nursing at the St. Michael's School of Nursing, now known as the St. Michael's Campus of The George Brown College of Applied Arts and Technology, has been appointed the first Dean of the newly-formed Division of Nursing at George Brown College.

The appointment was announced today by George Brown College President Clifford Lloyd.

The Nursing Division at George Brown College consists of five former Toronto Schools of Nursing -- Nightingale, St. Joseph's, St. Michael's, Toronto General and Toronto Western -- the administration of which was transferred to the College on September 1, 1973.

Sister Marion Barron will assume the Deanship on June 1, 1974.

A renowned figure in the world of nursing, she brings to the position a wealth of knowledge and experience. Her educational background is diverse, covering the arts, nursing, education and administration. She is the recipient of numerous certificates and degrees, including a Bachelor of Science from St. Louis University, a Master of Arts and Master of Education (Nursing) from Columbia University and a Doctor of Philosophy from The Catholic University of America. With typical foresight, her PhD thesis (1971) focused on the move of diploma nursing education into the Colleges of Applied Arts and Technology.

Sister Marion Barron has been the director of two schools of nursing: St. Joseph's, 1951 - 1964, and St. Michael's, 1964 until the present time. She was instrumental in organizing the highly successful Quo Vadis School of Nursing in the 1960's, and her proposal for a BScN program at York University is a matter of record.

In addition to her academic and administrative skills, Sister Marion Barron enjoys the support of her peers within the nursing profession. Recently elected to membership in the College of Nurses of Ontario, she presently serves as chairman of two important committees: the Complaints Committee and the Committee on Admission to the Registrar and Accreditation. She has been a member of the Registered Nurses' Association of Ontario since 1938, Vice-Chairman of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Schools of Nursing (a division of the Catholic Hospital Association of Canada) from 1960 - 1964, and a member of the Committee on Nursing, the Ontario Conference of the Catholic Hospital Association, from 1961 to 1964 and again from 1971 to 1973.

She has been concerned with innovation and professional development in nursing education throughout her long and varied career, and her present contribution in developing contemporary Operating Room Nursing and Critical Care Nursing programs is of major significance.


Editor's Message
