## ***Preface***

As we prepare to write the History of our School of Nursing's Alumnae Association celebrating its 100 year anniversary, we are caused to reflect on its beginnings!

Sister Martina, Sister Doethesis, Sister Isidore and Sister St Basil, all of the Order of St Joseph, created our school in 1911. Our school began because of a need for nurses to care for the sick at St Joseph's Hospital, Hamilton. Over the years students came to the school and were taught to become nurses. These graduate nurses became St. Josephs Alumnae members.

As Judy King-Siganski wrote at the Alumnae 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary, "thanks to each and everyone of you for daring to become a nurse, for having the courage to stand up for what is right for the patient, and for having the physical strength and the emotional stability to give excellent care, under less than excellent conditions on many occasions".

We feel it necessary to include all the foundations which have allowed our Alumnae to endure for 100 years. We hope that a brief history will allow you to sense our past, your place in it, and even perhaps come to understand the unique bond which ties each of our graduates together ... "Knowing Ourselves" and one another just a bit better!

As the hospital grew so did the school of nursing. Historical events like the depression, wars, as well as advances in medicine, all combined to increase the numbers of students being admitted to the school as well as job creation for new graduates.

As students of St Josephs School of Nursing we lived away from home, meeting classmates, educators and 'the Sisters'. Our formal education was unique... learning to meet and care for patients, growing in nursing education and practical hands-on intervention. This truly was a 'Co- op' education.

We grew in social graces and experienced the fun of living in residence. We became the adults of the future. To our classmates and to our educators, we are forever grateful!

Our Alumnae began as graduates who came together socially and went on to assist the School of Nursing and students through bursaries, classroom aids and equipment. The Alumnae supported organizations under the umbrella of St Josephs, such as the Villa and Pastoral / Spiritual care. They donated gift baskets and contributed to projects like "Out of the Cold" in the city of Hamilton.

As of 1978 our School ceased to exist. Yet our graduates chose to keep a strong bond and gather in celebration annually. We look back and reconnect.

We would like to thank those who previously penned histories of our Alumnae Association and current supporters Sister Virginia Hanlon '45, Sister Ann Marshall '56, Karen Wilson Martin '69, Pat Faulkner Duxbury '66, Marie Andreychuk Yakimoff '54, Dorothy Gleed Marshall '46 and Jean Maragno (hospital librarian), in keeping this information as factual as possible.

We hope that you enjoy reading this book, that it stirs some memories and emotions. We dedicate this book to the Sisters who had the vision to create our school and the collective patience to preserve it.

## **Jeanne Mance**



**1606-1673**

Born in France in 1606 Jeanne Mance saw war and epidemics first hand, and decided to dedicate her life “to extend the healing hand of Christ by becoming a nurse”.

In 1643 she came to Canada and began the foundation of the Hotel Dieu Hospital on the island of Montreal, with money provided by a wealthy French benefactor Madame De Bullion. She was also given money to form a religious order. She built the hospital, nursed the sick and the wounded and began the religious order of the “Daughters of St. Joseph” in 1658 (Notre Dame Sisters). She was the administrator of the Hotel Dieu Hospital until 1673. In short she was Canada’s first nurse!

As nurses we take the Jeanne Mance Pledge, which reflects our dedication to our profession and religion.

### ***Jeanne Mance Pledge***

*That I may be strengthened in my resolve to model my life of duty after that of Jeanne Mance, the first lay nurse of my beloved Canada.*

*I place myself in the presence of God and I pledge myself with the help of His grace to be faithful to the following ideals:*

*I will be true to the practice of religion, which is the inspiration of my noble vocation and while administering to the body, will serve the soul by observing the principle of right, ethics, and nursing honour.*

*I will be devoted to the profession that is mine, obeying the physician, within the sphere of his authority, and I will make my work a labour of love, rather than of profit, whenever the service of God or country requires it of me.*

## **Florence Nightingale**



**1820-1890**



**later years**

During the Crimean War 1854-1856, Nightingale spent every waking minute caring for the soldiers. In the evenings she moved through the dark hallways carrying a lamp while making her rounds, ministering to patient after patient. The soldiers who were both moved and comforted by her endless supply of compassion, took to calling her "the Lady with the Lamp."

Her work reduced the hospital's death rate by two-thirds. In 1860 she established St. Thomas' Hospital and the Nightingale Training School for Nurses in London England. She also vastly improved the sanitary conditions of the hospital. Nightingale created a number of patient services that contributed to improving the quality of hospital stay including a patient's kitchen, a laundry, a classroom and the library. Her writings sparked worldwide health care reform.

### **Florence Nightingale Pledge**

*I solemnly pledge myself before God and in the presence of this assembly to pass my life in purity and to practice my profession faithfully.*

*I will abstain from whatever is deleterious and mischievous and will not take or knowingly administer any harmful drug.*

*I will do all in my power to elevate the standard of my profession, and will hold in confidence, all personal matters committed to my keeping, and all family affairs coming to my knowledge in the practice of my calling.*

*With loyalty will I endeavor to aid the physician in his work and devote myself to the welfare of these committed to my care.*

## **Sisters of St. Joseph-- Historical dates**

**1650** Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph was founded in France. The spiritual director was a Jesuit priest, Jean Pierre Medaille.

**1778** Jeanne Fontbonne received the religious habit of the Sisters of St. Joseph and was given the name Sister St. John Fontbonne.

During the French Revolution Sister St. John Fontbonne was imprisoned and sentenced to death.

**1794** The revolutionary government fell from power and her execution was nullified.

**1808** Sister St. John Fontbonne was asked to establish a novitiate of women who chose a non-cloistered religious life.

**1836** First Congregation was established in St. Louis, Missouri.

**1851** First North American Congregation, established in Toronto Ontario.

**1852** Second Canadian Congregation, established in Hamilton Ontario.

### ***First Sisters to arrive to Hamilton were***

Sister Delpine Fontbonne  
Sister Martha Von Bunning  
Sister Aloysius Walker  
Sister Joseph McDonnell

Sister Delpine Fontbonne

She was the niece of Sister St. John Fontbonne.

At age 22 she went to St. Louis, Missouri to care for orphans and teach the deaf. In 1850 she moved to Philadelphia to take charge of an orphanage and a novitiate. A year later she transferred to Toronto to do the same work. In 1852 she was sent to Hamilton to establish the Order of the Sisters of St Joseph. In 1856 she died of typhoid fever.

Sister Martha Von Bunning

She was born in Hanover, Germany. She emigrated to St. Louis, and at age 24 she entered the convent and followed Sister Delphine to Toronto in 1851.

She became Sister Martha the first General Superior of the Hamilton Sisters.

Sister Aloysius Walker and Sister Joseph McDonnell were novices who had joined the order in Toronto.

These four women in identical dress of long black wool skirts, white linen head-dress and black veils, bundled themselves to board a ferry to cross Lake Ontario from Toronto to Hamilton.

They were relentless in their efforts to care for the city's poor, to organize fund raising, to canvas for food, clothing, fuel, and to establish schools and homes for the orphaned children and the elderly.

They were met by Father Gordon the city's only priest. They were given housing in a family home at the Corner of Cannon and MacNab Streets.

**1854** The Sisters continued caring for victims of a cholera epidemic in sheds behind the Great Western Railway (located near Barton and Victoria Streets).

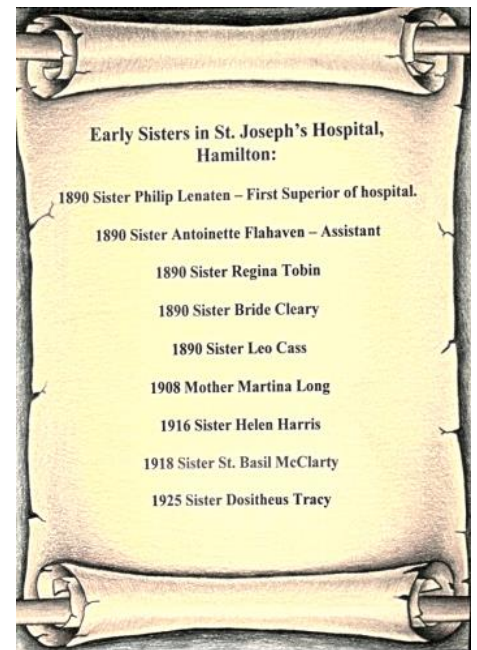
**1857** Convent was built at 204 Park St N. The Sisters lived there for 95 years.

**1855** Typhus struck. Again the Sisters cared for the sick and dying.

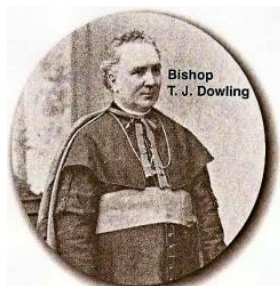
**1862** Sister Philip Lenaten came to Hamilton at age 26 to help care for the orphans. She was elected Superior General of the Hamilton Congregation. St. Joseph's Hospital opened under the direction of Mother Philip. She was the hospital administrator from 1890-1894.

Through her efforts The Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph was incorporated by the Provincial Legislature in December 30, 1879.

**1890** Hamilton was the 4<sup>th</sup> largest city in Canada. With an urgent request from the medical community and citizens of Hamilton, the Community of the Sisters of St. Joseph established a hospital with 25 beds.



The Sisters purchased Bishop Dowling's residence called the **Undermount** on John Street South for \$10,000.



**1890 Undermount building**

St. Joseph Hospital with a capacity of 25 beds was formally opened and operated under the direction of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Hamilton, Ontario.

**1894 St. Ann's Addition**

St. Ann's wing was erected increasing the accommodation to 55 beds. The Sisters now recognized a pressing need for additional trained nurses.

The 1<sup>st</sup> floor had an operating room with gas light fixtures for operating at night.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> floor had an operating room with 8 windows and a skylight. There was an additional room to administer chloroform.

A donation of \$2000 provided an electric elevator.



**1911 Adam Brown Residence / New School of Nursing**

The hospital was now staffed with Sisters who had received their training under Sisters Martina Long and Leo Cass who had gone to Mercy Hospital, Kalamazoo, Michigan.

They returned to open a School of Nursing in Guelph. So numerous were the applications to that course that some were referred to St. Joseph's in Hamilton.

As the hospital increased in bed capacity the Sisters made the decision to open a school for lay nurses.

The Sisters bought Adam Brown's residence at the corner of St. Joseph's Drive and Mountwood Avenue.

On September 8, 1911 the first students were enrolled. They were Sister M. Gerard Moran and Miss Ada Eagan. Seven more candidates followed at intervals.

St. Joseph's approached the city for \$50,000 financial assistance. With the Hamilton General also requesting monies for a nurses residence, a divided loyalty arose among the tax payers.

The building was later demolished to build a new nurses' residence called "Undermount" under the direction of Mother Mary Thecla and Sister St. Basil. While construction was underway students were displaced in scattered living arrangements and some students lived in the hospital itself.

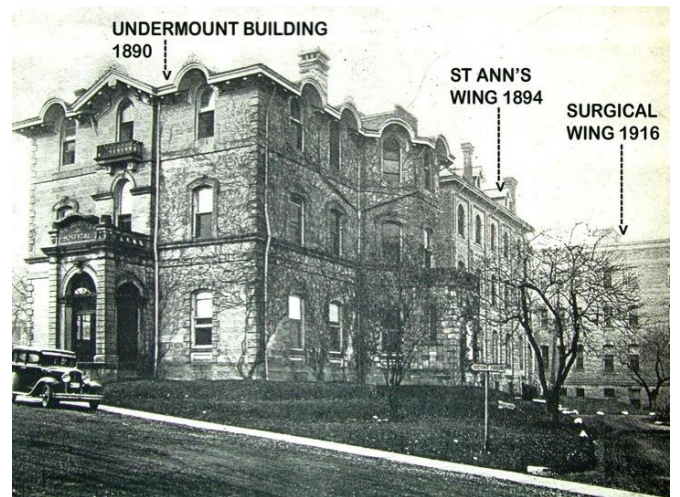
## 1916 Surgical Wing

Addition of a new surgical wing increased patient accommodation to 155 beds.

The new wing consisted of an X-ray department, laboratory space, a new chapel, and 3<sup>rd</sup> floor operating room with the latest in sterilizing equipment.

1<sup>st</sup> floor had 8 bed wards and a sun porch on either side of the main hall to increase accommodation.

2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> floors had private rooms, semi-private rooms, and 4 bed wards.



**1922** This new residence was called “Undermount” and was opened November 28, 1922 .

Student enrollment was 50 and the building could accommodate 100 students.

The school had an up-to-date teaching unit, libraries and reception room.



## 1923 Casa Maria (or House of Mary)

The Sisters purchased Casa Maria on Charlton Ave. for \$30,000 and had it renovated for the Maternity and Obstetrics patients, increasing the bed complement to 200 patients

Underground pipes carried steam heat from a central boiler in the hospital.

It had its own kitchen with gas and electric ranges, a refrigerator, and an ice box. It had an electric elevator and an electric signal system so patients could summon the nurses.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> floor was for mothers and babies.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> floor had the Operating Room, doctors change room, and a room for sterilizing instruments.



### 1941 **Our Lady of Victory Wing**

According to our historian Sister Virginia, the name was given to this wing of the hospital “because they hoped to win the war”. Her description is, as you exited the chapel this wing was to the left facing St. Joseph’s Drive. There were private and semi-private rooms on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> floors.

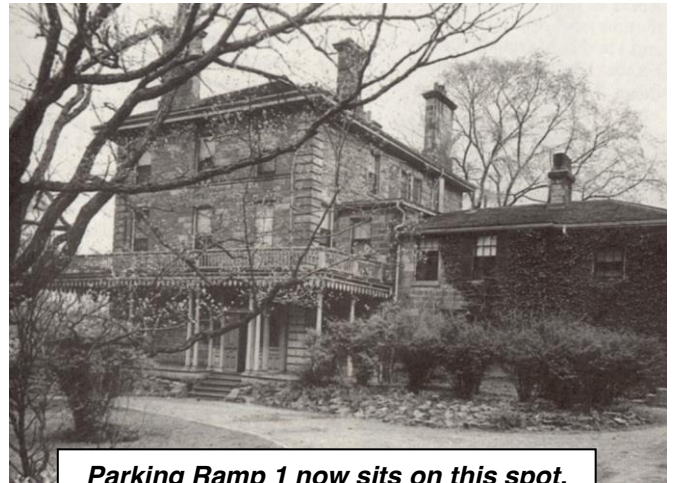
### 1947 **Oak Bank Residence**

Located at 301 James Street South (corner of James St. and St. Joseph’s Drive),

This home was originally built for John Stinson in the mid-1850s. It was named for the huge, very old, oak tree on the front yard.

Edward, the Prince of Wales, stayed at Oakbank in 1860 when he attended the opening ceremonies of the city’s waterworks system.

Oakbank was purchased in 1947 and used as a nurses residence until it was demolished in 1960.



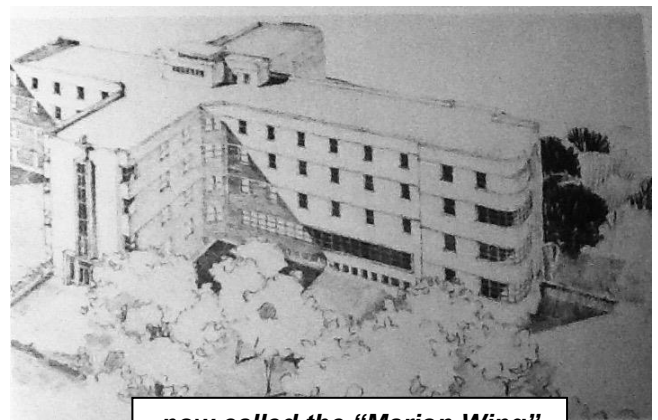

### 1947 **“Cross shaped” Hospital Addition**

Is located between Charlton Avenue, John St. S. and St. Joseph’s Drive.

The John St entrance has a statue of St Joseph above the doorway. The new addition increased accommodation to 394 patients.

Patient rooms were in the 4 wings with a central rotunda which housed elevators, nursing stations, kitchen, utility and storage space.



*now called the “Marion Wing”*

There was a tele-autograph system. When a message was written at switchboard it was recorded at all nurses stations.

Food left the kitchen piping hot on trays, along an electric conveyor to dumbwaiters, and up to the wards.

- 2 ground floor “dumb waiters were installed”
- ..1 for clean supplies to be sent to patient areas.
- ..1 for soiled articles to be returned for processing.



There were 7 air conditioned operating rooms where instruments were sterilized in a high pressure autoclave. There was also a 6 bed recovery room and an x-ray suite with portable units. There were night lights in patient rooms and corridors. Patients rooms were painted in restful colours with drapery to match. Rooms were furnished with metal furniture that was easily cleaned.



### 1947 Marygrove Residence

Was located at the corner of James St. and St. Joseph's Drive.

The hospital purchased this property for use as a nurses residence.

In 1960 it was demolished when construction of the new surgical wing began.



### 1950 New Maternity wing was opened.

It was 4 times the size of the Casa Maria located on Charlton Avenue and was built in an L-shape around the Casa Maria.

Patient accommodation was now 457 and 102 bassinets.

The Casa Maria building was demolished.



Now called the "Martha Wing"

### 1962 Mary Grace Wing

The hospital address was now "**50 Charlton Avenue East**".

This wing is an 8 storey building with 800 patient beds.

The Sisters lived on the 8<sup>th</sup> floor.



### 1963 Fontbonne Hall Residence was opened

- 8 storey building.
- floors 2, 3, and 4 had private rooms and were occupied by the senior students.
- floors 5, 6 and 7 had double rooms and were occupied by the second year students.

## ***Sister Mary Grace Stevens***

A native daughter of Hamilton Sister Mary Grace Stevens graduated from St. Joseph's Hospital, Nurses' Graduating Class in 1934.

She was an instructor of Nursing and in 1940 was appointed Superintendent of Nurses.

Sister Mary Grace was a woman ahead of her time, visionary, fair minded, with a talent for administration.



**1954-1960** Hospital Administrator, St. Joseph's Hospital, Hamilton

**1960-1963** Hospital Administrator, St. Mary's Hospital, Kitchener

**1963-1970** Hospital Administrator, St. Joseph's Hospital, Hamilton

During her time as administrator, she worked with some of the most advanced ideas being introduced in hospital management. She was known as a forward thinker. She set in motion the plan to build the new surgical wing in the late 1950's based on the Freisen Concept.

In the late 1950's she worked with Piggott Engineering in the planning and construction of Fontbonne Hall, which opened as a Nurses' Residence in the early 1960's.

In 1958 Sister Mary Grace advertised for the position of a Medical Director. Dr Ken Williams was hired as the first Medical Director of any of the 285 Catholic Hospitals in Canada.

Sister wanted a hospital committed to quality patient care in order to meet Hospital Accreditation Standards. Working together with Dr. Williams, they achieved this goal.

The large surgical building in the present hospital, "The Mary Grace Wing" is named after her,

Sister Mary Grace entered eternal life on November 13, 1999.

Sister Joan O'Sullivan graduated from St. Joseph's School of Nursing in 1943. While working private duty in Hamilton she also worked as a staff nurse at Christie Street Military Hospital in Toronto.

**1946** Joan entered the Convent located on Park Street.

**1951** She was a nursing educator at St. Mary's School of Nursing in Kitchener, Ontario, teaching Nursing Arts and Science until 1955, when she was assigned to St. Joseph's School of Nursing in Guelph.

**1952** Known as Sister Celestine she pronounced her final vows as a Sister of St. Joseph in July.

**1961-1964** She obtained her Bachelor and Master of Nursing Science from the University of Western Ontario.

**1964-1969** Following Vatican 2, Sister Joan returned to her baptismal name "Joan" and was appointed Director of Nursing at St. Joseph's School of Nursing Hamilton.

**1969-1972** Sister was appointed Director of Nursing Service, St. Joseph's Hospital, Hamilton.

**1972-1973** Sister was appointed Director of Education at St. Joseph's School of Nursing, Hamilton.

**1973** Assistant Executive Director at St. Joseph's Hospital, Brantford.

**1975-1979** Executive Director of St. Mary's General Hospital, Kitchener.

**1979** Chief Executive Officer of St. Joseph's Hospital until her retirement on December 31, 1988.





**1988** In an article announcing her retirement Sister Joan was quoted as saying “We go where the need is, and try to encourage unity and reconciliation in the community”.

The same article stated the following things:

- As a member of the Order of the Sisters of St. Joseph, Sister Joan has used the mandate of the Order throughout her career.
- She is well known in the community for slugging a bat at a hospital baseball game.
- Known for grappling with the government officials over an inadequate global hospital budget.



Under her direction, the hospital:

- has added a 20 bed Dialysis Centre.
- established such programs as the East Region Mental Health Services.
- First Place Family Medical Centre.
- The Hamilton Women’s Detox Centre.
- \$5.5 million dollar building program.

Other quotes from Sister Joan in the article are

- “Most of my time is spent dealing with people, in committee meetings and board meetings, and trying to set policies within the philosophy of the Sisters of St. Joseph”.
- “We’re an acute-care hospital but on any given day, we have 60 patients who don’t need hospital-level care, but have no other facility to go to, so we keep them”.

Sister Joan’s career included functionary roles in federal and provincial governing bodies and organizations. Her achievements included:

- President of the Catholic Hospital Association of Canada.
- President of the Catholic Hospital Conference of Ontario.
- President and C.E.O. of St. Mary’s Hospital, Kitchener, Ontario.
- President and C.E.O. of St. Joseph’s Hospital, Brantford, Ontario.
- Honorary Doctorate in 2002 by the University of Toronto – St. Michael’s College, for her vocational commitment to the Order, at the intersection of healthcare and community service.

Following her retirement in 1988 Sister continued with many acts of goodwill, charity and support.

- Congregational Liaison for Pastoral Care to the Directors of St. Joseph’s Healthcare System.
- Chair of the Board of Directors to the executive operation of the Good Shepherd Brothers of Hamilton.
- Member of the Board of Directors of St. Elizabeth Visiting Nurses Association.
- Member of the Board of Trustees (Executive Committee and Finance Committee) of St. Joseph’s Hospital, Brantford.

**1990** She was awarded “Women of the Year” for the health care category by the Hamilton Status of Women. She was recognized for her leadership, education and administration.

**1998** Hamilton Gallery of Distinction inducted Sister Joan (and 5 others) for their outstanding leadership and contribution to the City of Hamilton.

Sister Joan's role with the Congregation, has also been one of leadership and inspiration.

- 1989-1994 First Councillor to the Congregation.

***Sister Virginia Hanlon***

***Director of Nursing 1956-1964***

***Nursing Educator and Visionary***

***“I surround myself with smart people  
and delegate”***



Mary Clair Hanlon was born September 1, 1923 in Guelph, Ontario. She attended Loretto Academy graduating in 1942.

During her youth Mary Clair attended a summer camp where she met Margaret Schnitzler R.N., the camp nurse. Margaret made a deep impression on the young camper who admired her uniform and cap and thought nurses must be something special.

**1942** Mary Clair visited her cousin then an intermediate student at St. Joseph’s School of Nursing, and knew that was her calling. She subsequently entered the program in September of 1943.

Mary Clair fondly remembers Undermount, roll call and uniform inspection at 6:30am, Mass and breakfast, and on duty by 7am.

Food for the patients came from the kitchen on big carts. Students served the patients, returned empty dishes to the kitchen and then washed the dishes. Their patient assignment was to “Do them up”.

At 7pm, report was given to the night nurse. If your work was not finished you did not leave.

Many of Mary’s student experiences had a maturing influence on her, giving her confidence for situations that she would encounter in the years ahead. Of her thirty six months in the School of Nursing thirteen were spent on nights---definitely a maturing experience.



***Mary Clair Hanlon

Nylons were not available and students had to wear cotton stockings. Belts, collars and cuffs were made of hard plastic. Many food items were rationed.

World War II affected many changes in nursing. Interns were few and nurses had to take up the slack. Blood pressure and intramuscular injections once the purview of doctors, became nursing functions. Penicillin was administered for the first time in the late 1940’s to patients Q4h. An ice pack had to be applied to the site for 20 minutes, before and after the injection, as it was painful.



There were three instructors who left an impression on Mary Clair:

- Sister Mary Grace was an excellent teacher and mentor who guided her as student, teacher and Director of Nursing.
- Sister Eileen an interesting teacher, taught her how to make a proper bed. To this very day Sister Virginia thinks of her every time she makes her bed, as she feels that a comfortable bed makes for a good night's sleep.
- Sister Ursula hired the 1<sup>st</sup> Clinical instructor at the School of Nursing, towards the end of Mary Clair's 3<sup>rd</sup> year. Sylvia Hallman a graduate of Toronto General School of Nursing, was a gracious lady who encouraged her students to whet their appetites for learning and reading.



**1945** When the war was over Mary Clair entered the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph in Hamilton, September 8. She credits her decision to become a nun from working the night shift on B floor, a Medical unit. She was concerned when terminal patients had no one with them when they were dying to comfort and support them.

**1951-1957** Staff Educator at St. Joseph's School of Nursing.

**1957-1964** Director of Nursing at St. Joseph's School of Nursing, Hamilton.

With the advent of OHIP established in 1966, Government grants became available for education. The Congregation sent Sisters to University. Sister Virginia earned her B.Sc.N. from St. Francis Xavier University in Antigonish, Nova Scotia. Hospitals became less dependent on students for service and this dramatically changed nursing programs.



**1964-1967** Member of the teaching staff at St. Mary's Hospital, Kitchener.

**1967-1972** Director of Nursing, St. Mary's School of Nursing, Kitchener. During this time the 2 year program was successfully launched. Sister Virginia admits that she thrives on challenges. She describes herself as "avant garde" in her ideas for better education for students.

The Weir Report of 1927 stated that "nursing should be education, not slave labour". Most wards were staffed by a Sister Supervisor and students.

**1956** An innovative health program for students and staff was launched.

**1959** Employee Health Service hired a full-time nurse, Irene MacInnis DeCoste '56 and a full time Medical Doctor, Dr. McHarg for all employees. Their 1<sup>st</sup> office was located next to the trunk room in the basement of Undermount.

**1984-2005** Administrative staff St. Joseph Villa, Dundas.

**2005** After long and impressive years of service, Sister Virginia retired to the Mother House in Dundas.

### ***Sister Bonaventure Fagan***

#### ***Director of Nursing 1950 - 1957***

Sister Geraldine Fagan was born in Caledonia, Ont in 1914. She entered the Sisters of St. Joseph in 1932 and took the name of Bonaventure.

Sister graduated from St. Mary's School of Nursing Kitchener, Ont. the class of 1942. She nursed at St. Mary's Hospital from 1942-1948.

**1949-1957** Director of Nursing St. Joseph's Hospital Hamilton

**1958-1968** Administrator St. Joseph's Hospital Brantford

**1969-1973** Director of Nursing Service St. Joseph's Hospital Guelph

**1974** Enrolled in Pastoral Care Service at St. Michael's Hospital Toronto

**1973-1984** Served in Pastoral Care Services

Sister Bonaventure was respected as kind, gentle, humble and supportive of patients, staff and students. Sister was everyones friend.

During Sister Bonaventure's time as Director of Nursing, classes were larger and there was more emphasis on nursing education, as opposed to nursing service. "Time off" improved from 1 day to 1 ½ days to 2 days a week. Education was improved with more qualified staff in the School.





## ***Sister Maris Stella (Ann Marshall)***

***Director of Nursing  
1969-1972***

Ann Marshall was born November 28, 1931, at St. Joseph's Hospital in Hamilton. Upon graduation from Cathedral Girls High School in Hamilton in 1950 Ann entered the Sisters of St. Joseph, and was known as Sister Maris Stella.

Upon the completion of the Novitiate in 1953 she began her studies in the Nursing Program at St. Joseph's in Hamilton.

Ann's dream was to become a missionary. After graduation in 1956 however God and her Superiors had other plans.

Sister Maris Stella supervised the Pediatric ward when she was not the Night Supervisor.

In those days nurses worked 12 hour shifts, as they do today, with one difference. Sisters worked 7 days a week with ½ day off a week.

In the early 1960's bursaries were offered to nurses teaching in all Schools of Nursing in the Province, to upgrade the standard of the teaching staff.

**1964** Sister earned her B.Sc.N. in Nursing Education at University of Western Ontario.

**1964-1966** Following Vatican 2, Sister returned to her baptismal name "Ann" and was appointed to the staff of the School of Nursing.

**1966-1969** She was the Assistant Director at St. Joseph School of Nursing, Hamilton.

**1969-1972** She was the Director at St. Joseph School of Nursing, Hamilton.

Her legacy includes:

- Updating the school uniform.
- Revamping the 3 year nursing diploma program.
- Instrumental in developing the 2 year program for classes of over 100 students.
- Introduced Independent Individualized Learning Programs.
- Introduced male students in the School of Nursing in 1964.
- Introduced student representatives on the Board of the School of Nursing.
- Introduced Liberal Arts into the program through Mohawk College.
- Introduced Audio-Visual teaching tools into the program.



Sister credited Dr. Galloway and the Board of the Trustees of the Hospital for allowing her to make these changes to education. The hospital provided a salary for 3 registered nurses to work in the “learning lab” until 10:30 pm each evening with the students.



Philosophy of the School of Nursing was “Know Thyself”, a life long journey for anyone in the Service Profession.

**1972-1980** She was elected 1<sup>st</sup> Councillor to the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph, Hamilton.

**1980-1989** Sister was elected General Superior of the Sisters of St. Joseph, Hamilton.

Some of her attention was focused on drawing the Health Care Institutions of the Congregation into closer alignment, in policy and procedure, under a Lay Health Care Coordinator.



She ensured that younger sisters were educationally well prepared for any ministry they were asked to accept.

**1990** Sister Ann was missioned in Annotto Bay, St. Mary’s Parish, in Jamaica. She worked to educate children who did not have an opportunity to go to school, visited the sick and was responsible for creating appropriate housing for destitute men and women.



**2007** She returned to Canada. She has been a volunteer at St. Brigid’s School, an inner city school in Hamilton.

**2014** Sister Ann Marshall was honoured by Pope Francis with the **Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice Cross Medal**. (*Latin for the Church and the Pope*). It is also known as the “Cross of Honour”. It is currently given for distinguished service to the church by lay people and clergy. It is the highest medal that can be awarded to the laity by the Papacy.

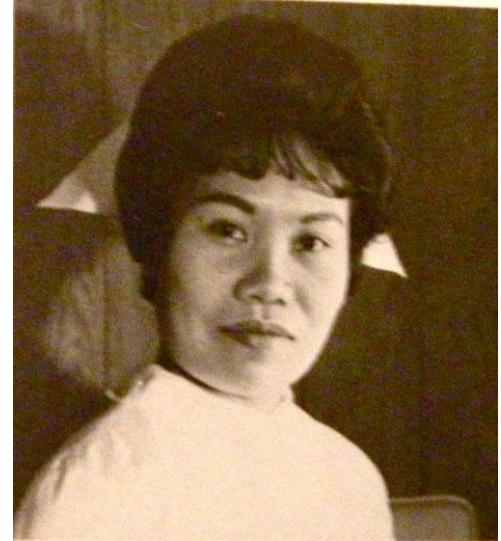

## **Virginia Frere**

**Director of Nursing - Mohawk  
1973-1978**



Virginia was born on October 20, 1936, in Tubao, La Union, Philippines. She experienced hardship and fear when the Japanese army invaded her country. When they took over the public schools she learned to speak the Japanese language. On October 20, 1944, General MacArthur returned with the American forces and the Island was “liberated”.

**1952** She finished her education both elementary and high school, in Mindanao (Southern Philippines). She learned to speak English as it is the medium of instruction in the schools. She states that the nurses would pass by the school in their crisp white uniforms. She recalls admiring the women in uniform. The nurses were well respected, “put up on a pedestal”, very special and could do no wrong. They loved their jobs and were well respected in the community. “I want to be like them”.

She entered Manila Central University, College of Nursing in Manila, in 1952 and graduated with her B.Sc.N. Degree in 1956. Nursing, Medical and Pharmacy students co-existed in an area called the “compound”. The residence, classroom buildings, General Hospital and chapel were in this area. Her teachers were head nurses and doctors. There were a few classroom teachers and some of them had been to the U.S. for graduate studies.

**1956** She started working as a non-registered nurse in a small private Maternity Hospital. After passing the registration exam she then accepted a position as a teaching Assistant in Nursing Arts and after 1 year became the Nursing Arts Instructor with her own teaching assistant for the next 2 years. She lived in the Nurses Residence.

**1959** She joined the Exchange Visitors Program and took a 3 month post-graduate course in Obstetrics in Chicago. She then worked as a staff nurse in labour and delivery. One of her instructors encouraged her to look to Canada.

She was accepted by three hospitals: Toronto General, Vancouver General and Kingston General.



**1961** She worked as a staff nurse at Kingston General on a Medical ward. After 2 months the Director of the Hospital and School offered her a position teaching Nursing Arts. Before long she was also teaching Pharmacology and Medical nursing.

**1963** Virginia married a school teacher and moved to the Niagara Region. She worked as a staff nurse on a surgical ward at the Hotel Dieu Hospital, St. Catherines.

- 1964** She applied for a teaching job at St. Joseph's School of Nursing, Hamilton. She taught Nursing Arts and in the skills lab. She later taught Microbiology and Medical nursing as well.
- 1967** After the birth of her second child she returned to work part time. She taught 3 days a week teaching and co-ordinating Maternity Nursing. She was also assigned to do Clinical Placement for the students. This included communicating with various agencies for clinical experience.

- 1969** Virginia returned as a full time instructor at the start of major curriculum changes. Administration provided funding for professional development. These included courses, seminars, and conferences on Individualized Independent Learning, use of Audiovisual material, communications, learning objectives, and cognitive mapping to list a few.



She gives credit to Sister Ann Marshall (Sister Maris Stella) and Sister Joan O'Sullivan (Sister Celestine), for establishing a relationship with Mohawk College on the topics of the general education component required by the College of Nurses.

The Individualized Independent Learning Program was one of a kind in the country and many visitors came to learn about it.

- 1973** Sister Joan O'Sullivan encouraged Virginia to apply for the Director of Nursing Position. The school was now known as "Mohawk College, St. Joseph's Campus". Virginia's title was now "Administrative Head".
- 1978** All three Hamilton nursing campuses amalgamated at the Chedoke Campus. The hospital continued to provide students with clinical experiences.
- 1980** Virginia graduated from Niagara University, Lewiston New York with a Masters of Science in Education, Majoring in Administration.
- 1985** She left Administration and returned to teaching in both the classroom and clinical areas.
- 1996** Virginia retired on her 60<sup>th</sup> birthday. She volunteered at St. Joseph's Villa.
- 1998** Virginia moved to Niagara on the Lake and was a member of the Executive of Niagara on the Lake Hospital Auxillary. She volunteered for the Shaw Guild, was a member of the Lions Club, and the New Comers Club.
- 2007** She returned to Hamilton and does volunteer work at St. Joseph's Hospital. She states that she intends to continue volunteering for as long as she can.



**Isabel Kerr  
Class of 1960**

**Educator  
1962-1997**



Isabel was born on August 22, 1938 in Hamilton at the Salvation Army Hospital.

She remembered having ration books for various foods and tokens for meat. When the city tore up the old street car tracks they would gather the wooded blocks to use as fuel.

As a child she dreamed of becoming a baby doctor. Her grades and family finances would not allow that so she decided to go into Nursing and eventually did work with children.

**1957** Entry requirements into the School of Nursing were grade 12 with a science subject, a letter stating why they wanted to be a nurse, and \$85.00 for uniforms. Her family was supportive of her decision to enter St. Joseph's School of Nursing.

Isabel talked about her student days. The 1<sup>st</sup> night in residence she met her big sister, had a pleasant evening, followed by lights out and prayers. The Sisters walked the halls of Undermount for bed check and if you were not in your bed you were expected to kneel in the hall as they approached.

She lived a few months in Undermount then moved to Parham staff residence and then to Oakbank. Her class spent the last few months in Undermount. She stated that every time she moved she lost a shoe. She asked if we had ever tried to move an old fashioned sewing machine with little wheels up James Street. She said it was not an easy job but the students helped each other.

She remarked that while the Catholics were praying the rest of the students went to roll call, then breakfast, and then took all the patient temperatures.

Isabel talked about her education. They had the block booking system going to class for a few weeks and then on the wards after. They were assigned different tasks. When you were on the unit you were there for the whole shift. They had two closed rotations Gyn and Paeds, where they had classes and worked at the same time. This was the first transition from the block booking system. A lot of their learning was "on the job", and from a senior student.

When you were to perform a new skill you had to call the school and the teacher on call, who would come and supervise them. She remembered calling a teacher to supervise her giving an enema. Betty McInnes came. The equipment came apart, soaked Miss McInnes, the patient and Isabel. Miss McInnes said it was not Isabel's fault, the rubber hose was old.....just clean up. Isabel thought she was finished, but Betty saved the day.



Many of their classes were taught by Doctors. She remembered Dr Downes parading up and down the classroom drilling the students..."What is the most important thing when a patient has a heart attack?...ease the pain".

**1960** Isabel graduated from St. Joseph's School of Nursing, Hamilton, Ontario. The ceremony was held at Cathedral Girls High School.

**1961-1962** She earned her B.Sc.N. at the University of Western, Ontario. She told us that Sister Virginia had spoken with her father. Sister then cornered Isabel in a closet on Paeds, to convince her to attend University. Isabel stated that next to being a nurse, she wanted to be a teacher. This was a way of fulfilling both her goals and there is a lot of teaching in nursing. Sister Mary Austin and Marie Yakimoff were her mentors.



**1962-1978** Isabel worked General Duty on Pediatrics. As an instructor she taught the following subjects, Nursing Arts, Sociology, and Psychology. She assisted Betty McInnes in anatomy classes when the students were doing dissections. When the Dietitian gave lectures Isabel followed with Pediatrics and Nutrition related to Nursing.

She talked about teaching individualized groups of students. You taught them for seven weeks, had small classes, quizzes, demonstrations, and accompanied them on the patient units. "This was the best", as an instructor she was more involved with the unit, and often did classes for the staff.

Isabel talked about the transition of nursing education. It went from the block system to closed rotations, to independent individualized programs. There was always change and they needed to write objectives, change curriculum, and develop other ways of learning using audiovisual equipment and test situations.

She felt these independent individualized programs were the "best thing since sliced bread". People came from all over the world to learn how the program worked. Instructors went to the University of Western, Ontario, to present the program. She thought a school in British Columbia purchased the program for their students. As recruitment the instructors went to high schools to talk about nursing and nursing at St. Joseph's



**1978-1997** Isabel discussed the Ontario government and their decision that education should be at the college level. They declared that all Hospital Schools of Nursing should close. A committee was formed from Mohawk College, and St. Joseph's School of Nursing, Hamilton. They held many meetings to combine the schools. There was not enough room and a common curriculum needed to be developed. They were ordered to stay where they were and were now called St. Joseph Campus, Mohawk College. They finished the program for the students while a new common program was developed. The last graduation class based at the St. Joseph's site was 1978.

**1960-2014** Isabel was an active member of St. Joseph's School of Nursing, Alumnae Association.

**1984-2014** Isabel worked with Karen Martin to organize reunion dinners. Together they organized table arrangements and class seating. Isabel organized issues related to the facility, set-up of dining room, foyer, etc, and Karen organized ticket sales.

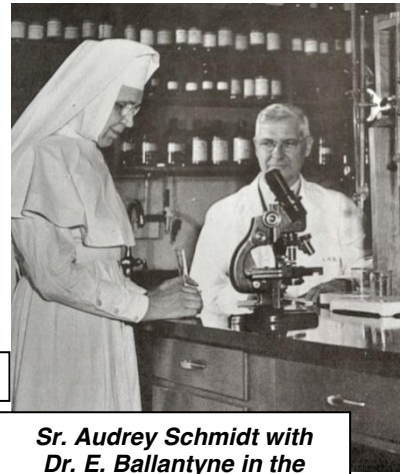

## Residence Life

### Typical Day (Circa 1940-1960)

- 06:00 am** a merciless bell rung by hand and could be heard ringing up and down the halls.  
**06:30 am** uniform inspection and attendance was taken. Everyone went to Mass.  
**07:30 am** breakfast before going on 12-hour ward duty.

- 13:00-15:00pm** students were relieved for 1 ½ hr-2hr break.  
**1500-19:00** classes began.

Each week students had a half-day off starting at 3:00 pm if their work was completed. In second year the ½ day off started at 1:00 pm. Residence curfew was 10 pm. meaning all students had to be in their bedrooms. One night a month there was a late leave of 11:30 pm. It was compulsory for nurses to sign in at the hospital office and return to residence via an underground tunnel ...a dreaded walk at that hour because they passed the morgue en route.

### Stipend

Stipends began in the 40’s and were gradually increased over the years. In the first year the student received \$6 per month with a one dollar increase each year. By the 60’s a student received \$15 per month. Anything broken or damaged was deducted from this stipend.

### Protocol

There was a strong sense of seniority among students – doors had to be opened for senior students in the cafeteria, elevators etc. Seniors went ahead of juniors and intermediates. Lipstick nail polish and rouge were not permitted. Hair was kept off the collars.

Each student wore a crisp starched blue and white cotton uniform, made at home according to strict specifications. On laundry day the garments were starched to perfection.

The same uniform was worn until 1965 with only some minor changes. Generations of students remember them as uncomfortable to wrestle into, with stiff collars and long sleeves held together with shoe laces. Later the uniform had shorter sleeves with stiff cuffs. Students wore white shoes with Cuban heels and white stockings.

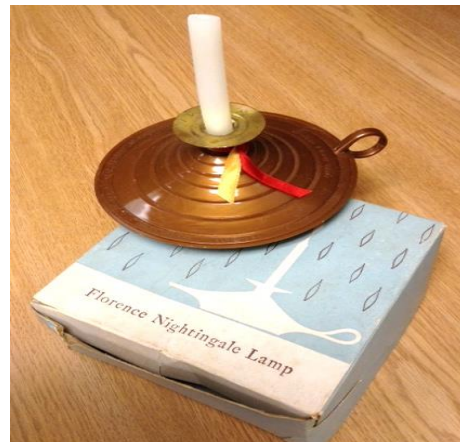

By presenting it to the student nurses it congratulated them for choosing a profession with high standards in service to humanity. It was meant to be an inspiration to the young nurse.

### ***The nursing student of the 70's-80's***

## GRADUATION PIN



St. Joseph's pin was designed by Sister St. Basil of the Sisters of St. Joseph while she was the Superintendent of Nurses in 1915.

The pin is gold with a white enamel beveled edge which bears the words St. Joseph's Hospital, Hamilton, Ont. In the center is a red cross.

The student's name and graduation year is engraved on the back of the pin.

The pin is worn on the left side above the heart and has served as a bond for all St. Joseph's nursing graduates.

The graduation pin was redesigned in 1971

It was changed from St. Joseph Hospital Hamilton to St. Joseph School of Nursing Hamilton.

## **ST. JOSEPH'S SCHOOL OF NURSING TRANSITION...**

**FROM A HOSPITAL DIPLOMA SCHOOL...**

**TO A COMMUNITY COLLEGE...**

**TO AN ACCREDITED DEGREE AT UNIVERSITY**

### **1911: ST. JOSEPH'S SCHOOL OF NURSING OPENED**

Prior to and during 1920s'

The course was a 3 year program. Students were admitted to the school and immediately assigned on the wards to 12 hr shifts. Formal teaching was incidental.

After a 3 month probation period the student nurse could be assigned to night duty. During the night shift the hospital was staffed by students with 1 Sister Supervisor. At that time 90% of the graduate nurses did private duty nursing and the students did patient care.

Students were responsible for the housekeeping in each clinical area and replaced the maid on her ½ day off to transport, serve, and clean the patients food trays.

In 3<sup>rd</sup> year the senior nurse was responsible for incidental teaching on the wards.

In 1920 the Ontario government required all nursing students to write departmental exams. Dr. Downes gave intensive review courses for the first class to write the R.N. exams in 1926.

### **1930's-1940's**

The number of lectures increased and classes were no longer given in the off-duty time.

Sisters taught 90% of the nursing content and there were more lectures given by doctors.

Dr. I. Olmstead, Dr. J. Edgar, Dr. H. Balfe and Dr. H. Sullivan are credited with laying the foundation for the School of Nursing.

In 1944 Miss Sylvia Hallman the first clinical instructor at St. Joseph's, was assigned to assist the students in their clinical areas. Clinical Instructors were on the wards and case studies were introduced.

During WW2 the numbers in the classes increased as did residence accommodation.

The hospital started to employ graduate nurses removing service responsibilities from the students.



## 1950's

In the early 1950s the block system of teaching was initiated. This new philosophy of education was met with resistance by the hospital but was finally accepted. The preclinical period was extended with less service and more education.

### Block System was as follows:

7:00am to 10:00am	students were on the wards
10:00am to 4pm	was set aside for classroom instruction
4:00pm to 7pm	students back on the wards.

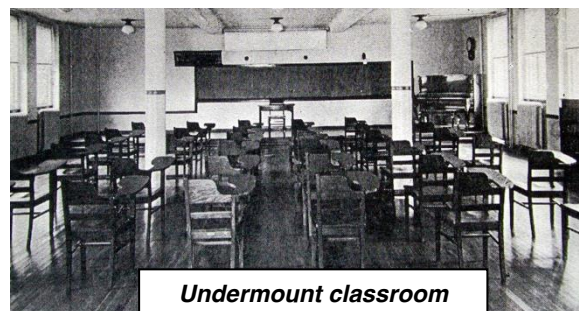
**1956** Ward assignments were reduced from 12 hours to 8 hour shifts, initiated with the class of 1958. Second year students were off the wards for longer periods with no commitment to service. All formal classes were completed in the first two years. The third year was dedicated to service.

Sister Virginia was instrumental in obtaining more educational class time for the nurses and the hiring of more clinical instructors. Instructors were sent to University for Diplomas in Nursing Education. More qualified teachers became available for clinical teaching. A great deal of the teaching took place in the hospital setting.

With increased concentration on education rather than service, new facilities were provided for the students, an expanded library, emphasis on research and more audio/visual equipment. There was a separation between service and education with a director for each area.

## 1960s'

Nurse's education reflected and responded to the many new specialties that had developed in medicine. The emphasis shifted to acquiring theory before applying the knowledge to the hands-on care of the patient .

Sophisticated curriculum was developed into neurological, cardiovascular, respiratory, gastro-intestinal and genito-urinary training as well as sociology, psychology, language and communication skills.

### Classes of '69, '70 and '71A

Were 2 + 1 programs. The first 2 years of classroom with related clinical experience was supervised by the faculty. The third year was a practicum year with a class held once a week.

### The class of '69

Students lived in residence throughout their third year. They received \$15 a month from the January of their first year until they graduated. In their third year the students could work in the hospital as an unlicensed practical nurse on their days off for \$15 per shift.

### Sister Ann Marshall

School of Nursing Director in 1971 said "We found that most of the students by working at their own speed learned faster than ever before".



## Class of 1973-1978

A new self-directed two year program began at St. Joseph School of Nursing in 1971. Students were given modules with objectives requiring knowledge, comprehension and application of information. They identified what they needed to learn in biology, nursing and clinical nursing.

They were evaluated by pre- and post-tests based on these objectives. The pass was 100% demonstrated in discussion with their nursing teacher as well as written exams.

Students acquired the required information through large group sessions (usually at the beginning of the semester/course) and smaller group sessions throughout the semester/course, as determined by the group members.

Beginning in the early '70s, students wrote a 3 hour test which assessed their learning styles. Cognitive mapping helped students identify their learning styles, allowing them to utilize their strengths but also making them aware of other ways of learning which they could utilize and develop. Prior to this time most students acquired knowledge through reading and attending lectures. With the beginning of the new program there was increased utilization of audiovisual alone and in conjunction with practicing skills as well as group work and discussion. While exams were still written, more testing of comprehension was done orally for small groups with faculty.

To facilitate self-directed learning Betty McInnes developed many slide-tape programs and videotapes on anatomy and physiology and nursing skills to facilitate independent learning. As well, she wrote two books "Medical Asepsis" and "The Vital Signs" which students used as independent resources to learn the theory and skill of handwashing, isolation techniques and each of the vital signs.

Learning Resource Centre provided two components for learning. Audio-visual resources such as slide-tapes and videos provided information to assist students to answer the objectives. Skills Laboratory were opened to 10:30 pm to provide an area to learn and practice skills. Three registered nurses assisted students in their learning. The first three technologists were Karen Wilson Martin '69, Ellen Zavitz Kenyon '68 and Dorothy Yelland (a graduate from Victoria Hospital, London)

Nurse Technologists were available Monday to Friday from 8 am to 10:30 pm and weekends from 12 pm to 4 pm to assist students to practice skills. They also tested them prior to their performance of the skill in the clinical area.

Clinical experience allowed students to demonstrate the use of knowledge and skills learned within their small group.

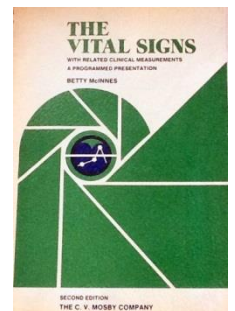

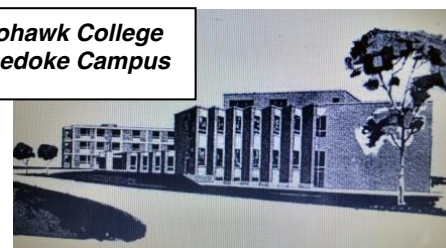

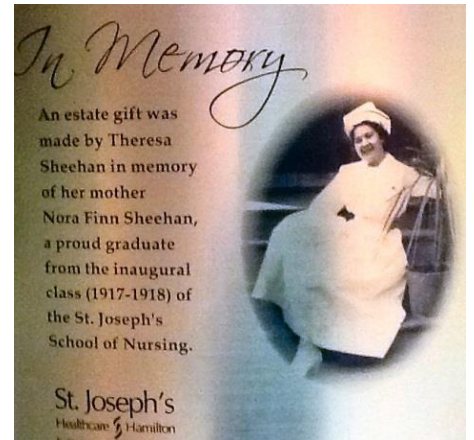

## ***The birth of St. Joseph's School of Nursing Alumnae Association***



The St. Joseph Hospital Alumnae was organized in 1915 under the convenorship of Misses Ada Egan and Jean Morin, assisted by Mother Helen Superior of the Hospital and Sister St. Basil Superintendent of Nurses.

After much planning and formulating of the constitutions and by-laws the nucleus of the present association was formed, with Miss Ella Kelly as president.

The Alumnae grew and progressed over the years always working hand in hand with the School of Nursing. The graduates of the School form the body of the alumnae today.

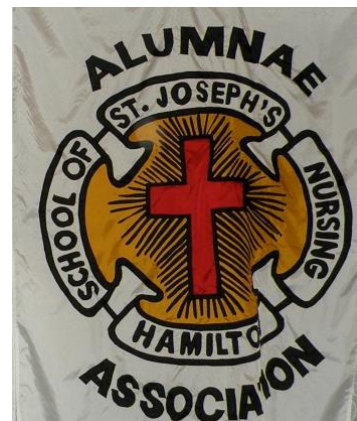
It's objective was to keep the graduates in friendly touch with each other and with their Alma Mater, and further to maintain the very highest of standards of professional nursing.

That the graduates may belong to an organization which can broaden their scope professionally.

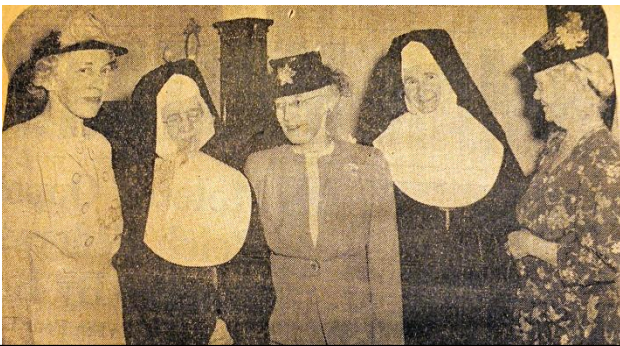
That they can share in helping in the growth of the school from which they graduated.

## ***Historical facts about the Alumnae ..... 1915 to the 1940's***

**1915** Alumnae members were kept informed of meetings by face to face communication, telephone call lists and mail. The early Alumnae meetings were held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of every month from September to June. A business meeting was held attended by Alumnae members and the executive, followed by a guest speaker. A silver collection was taken at meetings and this was discontinued in 1964.

**1933** Alumnae Meetings and special events were advertised in the Canadian Nurse Journal. The printing of births and marriages was discontinued in 1944

**1934** Membership fees were dispensed with for the entire year.

**1935** Graduate nurses were notified that "Nurses could not nurse in St Joseph's Hospital after February 1, 1935 without their registration cards with the Alumnae".

**1942** On completing her course of training a student nurse will become an associate member of the Alumnae, until such time as the first Provincial exams are held. After successfully completing her exams she will make an official application to become an Alumnae member.

The Alumnae passed a motion that married nurses be accepted as members of the Alumnae for one year, terminating in June 1943. They would be able to vote after paying the fees.

**1942** It was a requirement to belong to the Alumnae as part of the working conditions set down by the hospital. In order to become a member of the nursing register a nurse had to be in good standing in her Alumnae Association.

The Alumnae asked that all nurses that had been employed (going back as far as 1929) be required to pay back their alumnae fees.

The first annual Requiem Mass for deceased members was held in St. Patrick's Church.

**1943** Established an annual Memorial Service for Florence Nightingale. The first service was held May 9, 1943 at Christ Church Cathedral and in the hospital chapel. This celebration was discontinued in 1951.

Sister Mary Grace encouraged Alumnae members to take advantage of the bursary granted by the Government for University courses in Public Health and Nursing Education.

**1944** Sister Mary Grace stated that a nurse could not belong to the registry unless she joined the Alumnae. She also had to become a member of the R.N.A.O. and the International R.N.A.

**1944** Incentives were organized to increase Alumnae membership including

- Hospital equipment donations
- A room for sick nurses
- Small socials e.g. bridge card parties
- Each nurse was required to bring items to raffle off at the meetings
- Scholarship presentations

**1945** Membership committee was initiated that would be responsible for contacting members from each graduating class. Each member was asked to bring another member in order to increase attendance at meetings.

A registered nurse had to apply in writing to the Alumnae to be accepted as a member.

### 1950's & later

A convenor and a nominations committee were created for the Alumnae.

Representatives were sent to R.N.A.O. and C.N.A.

Nurses who were recently engaged or married received a small gift from the Alumnae.

At the annual Christmas party members brought small gifts to exchange.

**1955** Sister Mary Grace approved Associate membership in the Alumnae. She noted that  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the hospital staff were not alumnae members.

Sister Mary Grace directed the executive to organize a disaster committee. The Alumnae members created an updated list of addresses and phone numbers with call-in groups to quickly contact all members.

**1956** Membership tea was initiated to increase membership.

**1960** Entire graduation class was accepted into the Alumnae Membership.

**1964** Sister Celestine Acting Director of Nursing attended an executive meeting and requested that the name of the Alumnae be changed from "St. Joseph's Hospital Nurses Alumnae Association" ..to.. "Alumnae Association of St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing".

The reason for this change was that *"an Alumnae member is a member of the School of Nursing and not of the hospital"*.

**1984** Phone Committee was operational for "shut in" Alumnae members.

**1990's** Alumnae had communications posted in the "**Hospital Monitor**".

## Constitutional Revisions

**1944 / 1955 / 1958 / 1975....** Ongoing revisions of the By Laws were recorded in the minutes including 2015.

**1963** The executive was being expanded and the duties of the officers were being changed.  
1<sup>st</sup> V.P. responsible for special events and was a member on all committees.  
2<sup>nd</sup> V.P. arranged all programs, meetings and social functions.  
3<sup>rd</sup> V.P. responsible for newsletter and publicity.

Recognized the need for a multi-signature bank account Treasurer + President or V.P.

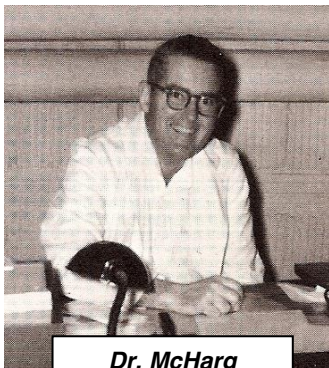
Financial Audit done and also changed the fiscal year to be June 1st to May 31<sup>st</sup>.

**1990's** When new members are needed on the executive the second Vice President selects two members from outside the present executive to be members of a nominating committee. They will present a list of candidates for positions needing replacements. If there are more than one candidate in any position an election will be held at the reunion dinner.

**1991** Monthly meetings and spending budgets were planned one year in advance.

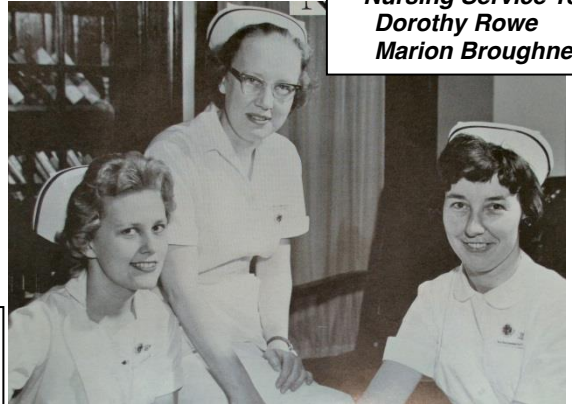

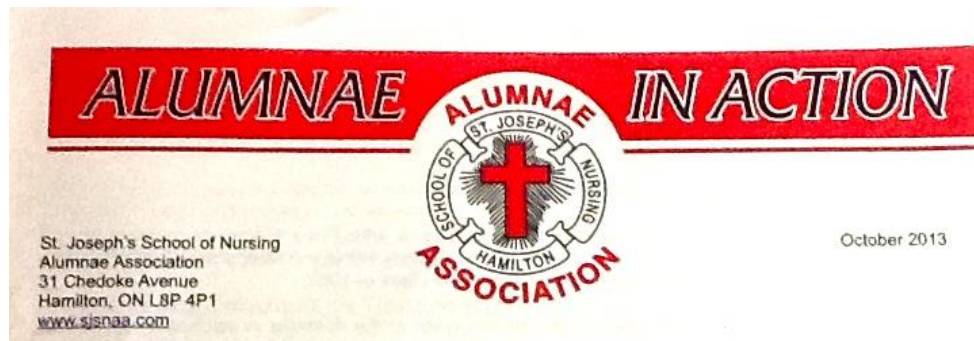

## Newsletter



Originally the published bulletins were replaced with newsletters circulated monthly to members.

**1962** The Burlington Gazette and the Hamilton Spectator published accounts of monthly Alumnae meetings and Alumnae functions.

**CHIQ, CHCH-TV, CHML, and CKOC** made announcements of Masses, scheduled general meetings and coming events.

Present day newsletter was sent to paid members including a message from the President and the newsletter editor. Highlights include achievements of individual members, notices of re-union dinners, and an obituary column.

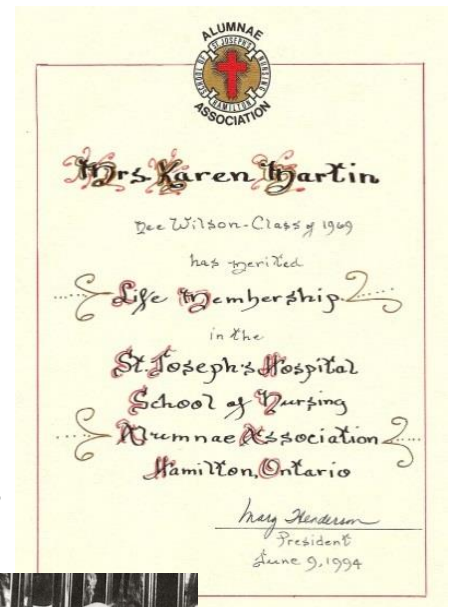

## **Alumnae Membership**

Membership criteria in the Alumnae is contingent on payment of the annual membership fee. All St. Joseph's School of Nursing graduates from the classes of 1915 to 1978 are granted eligibility for active alumnae membership. Sister Ursula was the 1<sup>st</sup> Sister Liaison to the Alumnae executive followed by Sister Virginia Hanlon in 1985 until she retired.

**There are 3 categories of Alumnae membership:**

- 1) **Active Member** A graduate of St. Joseph's School of Nursing and/or St. Joseph's Campus of Mohawk College, Hamilton, Ontario who has paid the Alumnae membership fee for the current fiscal year.
- 2) **Honorary Member** A member who has maintained an active membership for 25 consecutive years and continues to pay the Alumnae membership fee for the current fiscal year.
- 3) **Associate Member** A graduate nurse who has had an affiliation with St. Joseph's Hamilton and has paid the membership fee for the current fiscal year. The following information is required: Name and City of School of Nursing and Year of Graduation. The Executive holds the responsibility of awarding the Associate Membership.
- 4) March 1958..... Life Membership on certain Alumnae members was established. After 25 years of paid membership the Alumnae member was exempt from paying any more fees. This changed in 1990 to Life time members paying yearly membership fees and receiving a Life time membership pin. Sister Mary Austin used her calligraphy skills to create the scrolls presented to new Life Members each year.

- 1965--- 374 active members, 27 life members,

- 2009--- 425 active and life members, 5 associate member
- 2014--- 613 members in the Association.

## ***Charitable Projects Sponsored By The Alumnae***

**1920** to present time the goal of the Alumnae Association has been to provide monetary donations to accredited charities.

**1920** \$1,000.00 was raised by 49 graduates for the furniture in the new Undermount residence.

Donations of \$5.00-\$20.00 came from the private duty nurses who were only making \$3.50 for a 12 hour shift.

To complete their objective they held a dance at the Royal Connaught hotel.

**1928** A hospital bed was procured for an Alumnae member who was very ill at home.

**1940's & 1950's**... 2 nurses were sponsored at the R.N.A.O. conventions.

**1946** \$1000.00 raised by social events and given to furnish the new hospital opening in 1947.

**1949** \$500.00 was donated for the purchase of a pediatric cystoscope and a child inhalator.

**1955** \$500.00 was donated for the window in the new Chapel.

**1958** Christmas hampers were organized for needy families. This became an annual event. It was discontinued in 1972.

**1961** \$1,000.00 was donated to the new hospital to furnish two private rooms.

**1968** Reunion Dinner tickets were given to 8 graduate nurses to promote the Alumnae.

**1996** Yearly donations to St. Joseph's Villa for the use of their facilities by the executive.

### ***Bursaries and Scholarship Funds***

**1933** Education Fund was set up for the School of Nursing.

- 1948 \$500.00 scholarship was initiated on a yearly basis for a member of graduating class.
- 1951 \$500.00 scholarship were available to any member of the Alumnae in good standing filling the educational requirements of the School of Nursing. \$500 scholarships were available to members to attend University to become educators and head nurses.
- 1953 The Alumnae set up a monthly \$10.00 cheque for a nursing student in dire need.
- 1962 Benevolent Fund of \$500.00 yearly was set up for a deserving student of St. Joseph's School of Nursing who was unable to pay for books or uniforms. It also provided extra allowance every month.
- 1963 \$3,000.00 was allotted to sponsor an African student into the School of Nursing.
- 1968 Interest free loans and scholarship funds for post graduate studies up to \$2,000.00 were available to an Active or Life Member who had maintained current membership for three years and would continue membership for the duration of the loan.
- 1974 Student aid fund closed.
- 1990 The Alumnae offered a new graduate or an Alumnae member a \$1,000.00 education loan available interest free. Repayment must be made within one year of completion of course.

***Donations to the School of Nursing***

- 1934 The Alumnae purchased a mannequin and books for the School of Nursing.
- 1944 Donated mirror and lamps for student nurses recreation area.
- 1948 \$50.00 to nurses residence.
- 1952 \$200.00 donation for recreational and locker room improvements.
- 1957 \$500.00 to the Fontbonne School of Nursing building fund.
- 1960 \$1,000.00 was donated to the Fontbonne Hall nurses residence.
- 1963 The Alumnae joined the Golden Book for charity by saving labels from canned food products in order to purchase a Hi-Fi, TV, iron and lamps for the new residence.

**1964** \$100.00 was donated in the name of the Class of '64 for supplies for Fontbonne. The Alumnae collected Jello instant pudding labels to purchase an iron and a sewing machine needed by the students.

**1968** Year book was dedicated to the Alumnae by the Graduating Class in appreciation for the items that they had received (card tables, stereo Hi-Fi and piano).

**1969** \$700.00 to the School of Nursing for the purchase of Audio-Visual teaching aids.

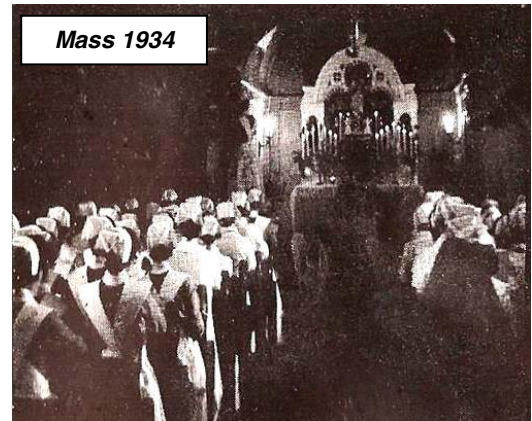

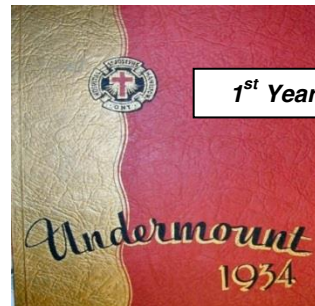

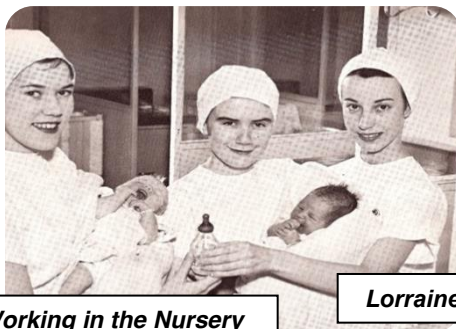

In the early 60's a group of physicians representing a variety of clinical specialties visited Nigeria, Angola in Africa. The purpose of their trip was to visit the African Missions and assist physicians there with care of their patients and families.

The need for an educated nurse was evident. After much planning a decision was made to bring a young woman to Canada for her nursing education.

- Claribel Marchie was selected. She arrived at St. Joseph's School of Nursing in 1963 with the finances and support of our Alumnae, St. Joseph's School of Nursing and hospital.
- A contract was drawn up between the hospital and the Alumnae. Sister Virginia stated that the hospital would cover her books and uniforms.
- The Alumnae dedicated \$3,000.00 to sponsor the project. This included air flights, to and from Canada, along with living allowance and graduation fees.
- Agnes Smith Muir '34 and her husband Don, undertook the role of "surrogate parents" for Claribel and opened their home and hearts to her providing support during Claribel's "cultural shock" and separation from her biological family.
- Claribel graduated in 1966.
- Since graduation Claribel married Gaius Igboeli, professor of Animal Genetics in Zambia. Claribel studied at McGill and received her B.Sc.N. in Nursing and later went to achieve her Masters Degree in Public Health Nursing. Claribel was teaching nurses at the University of Nigeria.
- In 1996 Claribel wrote to Agnes, "please tell the Alumnae that I will always be grateful for the opportunity I was given! The nursing training was a terrific professional experience and it has had a tremendous impact on my life both professionally and personally".





## Other Donations

**1923** A linen campaign was launched. Embroidered Altar Cloths were purchased by the Alumnae and the Sisters. They were sent to a mission in western Canada.

**1942** Collected \$1.00 from each member for the “Bombed War Victim” or the “British Nurses Relief Fund”.

To follow there were annual fashion shows sponsored by Eames, Merle's, Raphael Mack, Hendry's Shoes and fall hat designers to mention a few. Proceeds from these fashion shows were given to the Hospital Foundation.

**1950's** Annual Christmas Raffles for turkeys and for \$100.00 and \$50.00 Victory Bonds.

**1957** Membership Tea combined with Tea for new Graduates.

**1965** The first Graduation Tea was held April 25<sup>th</sup> 1965. The Alumnae could no longer afford to sponsor the entire graduating class at the annual dinner.

At the reunion dinner the Alumnae had items for sale. This included 100 mugs with the crest of the School of Nursing, stationary with Alumnae letter head, key chains, pens, sweatshirts etc.

## ***Graduation Dinner and Dance***

- 1943** Dinner was held in the Crystal Ballroom of the Royal Connaught Hotel. Dinner was \$1.50 a plate, followed by a dance in the Starlight Room.
- 1940's** Graduation dinner was held on a Thursday and dance was held the following day. These events were often held in different hotels including the Brant Inn, Royal Connaught, Fischer Hotel, Prudhommes, the El Morocco and on occasion in the Basilica auditorium.
- 1949** The Alumnae voted to have the reunion be combined with the Graduation Dinner.
- 1950** Graduation / Reunion dinner was held on Thursday at Fischers Hotel, dance was held on Friday at the El Morocco and Graduation tea on Saturday at Mary Grove.
- 1964** Combining the reunion with the graduation dinner was discontinued. Graduation dinner was replaced with the Mother and Daughter tea. The Alumnae continued to sponsor the Graduation Dance until 1972.



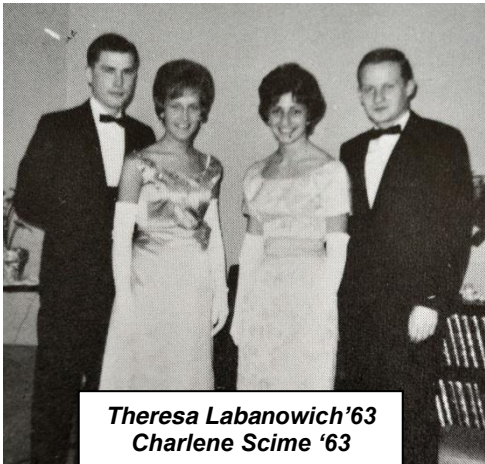




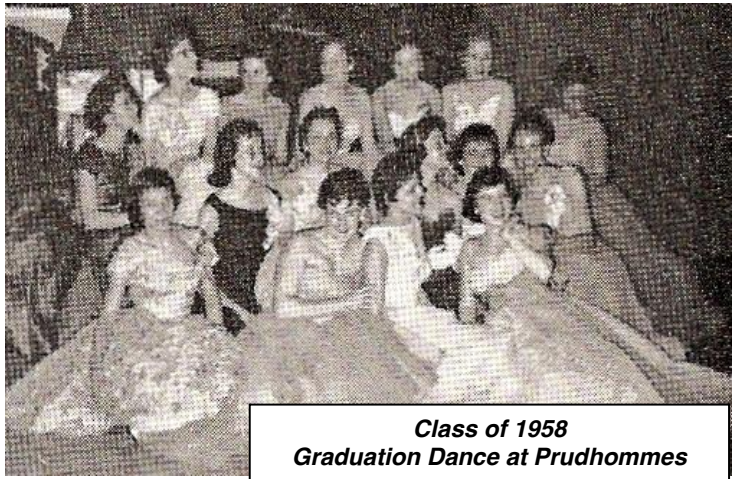

## Evolution of Reunion Mass / Dinner



### Reunion Day Mass

- **1933** Mass for deceased members was conducted originally on Remembrance Day. There were two Masses conducted
  - 1-In October for our living members
  - 2-In November for the repose of souls of our deceased members
- **1985** When Sister Virginia Hanlon '45 became the Sister Liaison to the Alumnae, the mass was changed to the Annual Reunion Day.

- Sister Virginia Hanlon, Sister Liaison played an important role in the planning of the annual Reunion Day Mass and Reception.

- A "Reunion Day Liturgy of Thanksgiving" booklet was published every year.



- Mass of Remembrance over the years was celebrated in various sites:

- 1985** Last Reunion Mass in the old Hospital Chapel.
- 1986** Stelco Amphitheatre.
- 1987-1988** celebrated in the New Chapel. Catholic Books of Worship were donated by Alumnae.
- 1990-2000** celebrated in Fontbonne Hall Gymnasium.
- 2001-2013** celebrated at St. Charles Garnier Church.
- 2014** the Reunion Mass was amalgamated with the Reunion Dinner at Carmens Banquet Centre.

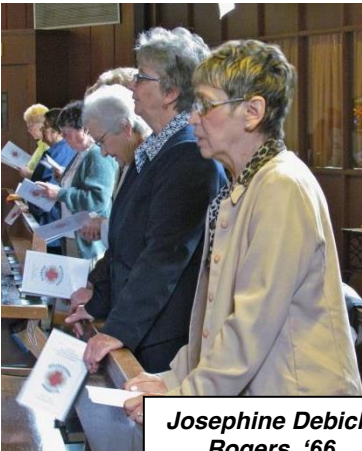

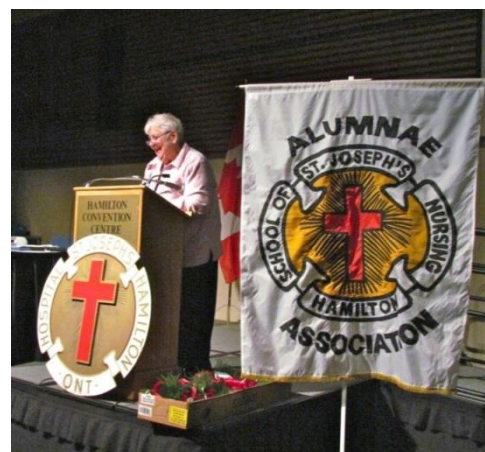


## **Reunion Day Dinner / Luncheon**

The St Joseph's School of Nursing Alumnae Crest Banner was purchased in October of 2002 and first presented at that years Mass. The cost of this banner and stand was \$347.69.

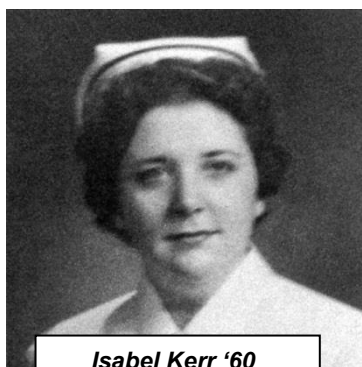
**1949** Reunion combined with the Graduation dinner in May. Annual reunions/business dinner gatherings continue to this day.

**1964** It became difficult to find a location which could accomodate the 300 plus Alumnae members as well as over 100 members of the graduating class. As a result the Alumnae Dinner became a separate event from the Graduation Dinner. In 1964, 300 Alumnae members attended the dinner at the Royal Connaught Hotel and in 1965, 252 Alumnae members attended at the same location.



**1965-1984** Dinner was held in the Pavilion Ball Room at the Holiday Inn. Katherine Towler '47, Winnie Walker '47, Ada Campbell '47, Marion Langballe '51, Shirley Rumbles '52, Pat Duxbury '66, Mary Hastings '32, Cathy Munro '57 and Pat DiCiommo '65 convened and sold tickets for the dinner in the early years and many others were involved. Subsequently, Nancy Melnyk and Sonja Klein, both '65, organized the event for several years. The baked Alaska with sparklers alight was always a highlight as the wait staff would parade out of the kitchen and around the dinner room holding the dessert overhead before being returned to the kitchen to be sliced and served to the members.

**1984-2014** Reunion dinners were organized by Isabel Kerr and Karen Martin. Together they organized table arrangements and class seating. Isabel organized issues related to the facility, set-up of dining room, foyer, etc. Karen organized ticket sales. In 1985, the dinner was moved to the Hamilton Convention Centre where it was held until 2013.

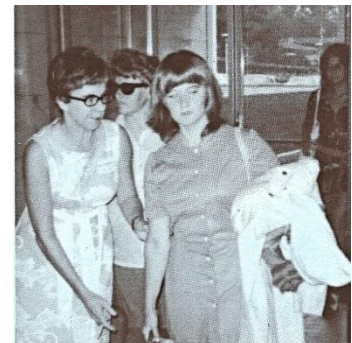
Sister Joan O'Sullivan and Sister Virginia Hanlon were the editorial advisors.

Prayers answered of mothers unable to enter into nursing programs themselves, whose two sometimes three daughters have become RNs and Life Members of St. Joseph School of Nursing Alumnae.



Pride felt by families when the Alumnae Association and the St. Joseph Hospital Women's Auxillary awarded a small scholarship to deserving graduate nurses. Sadness when it was apparent that these monies supplemented by small salaries were insufficient for full-time attendance in an University Education-Administration Program.

Glee experienced by parents and daughters when informed by knowledgeable Sisters-Sister Bonaventure and Sister Virginia of Bursaries available to fund an entire year in a post RN University Program.

1955-1956 at least 9 Alumnae members were enrolled in and were successful in obtaining Post Graduate Certificates in Nursing Education-Administration. Three others received certificates in Public Health Nursing. Those who wished to obtain credits towards a BScN were encouraged by the Sisters to attend classes during the summer and night school.

That so many St. Joseph's School of Nursing graduates were accepted into credited University Programs post Graduation, speaks well of the sisters, Lay teachers and their hospital mentors who guided and taught them during their 3 year program.

Most post RNs would hesitate to consider attending University full time had they not received some encouragement by the "small seeds" sewn by our Alumnae and the Woman's Auxillary of the hospital.

Alumnae members have continued to upgrade their educational and Nursing skill qualifications. They have traversed the world by "serving, teaching and caring".

**1880's** the 'Sister-Teachers' of the Sisters of St. Joseph's:

- went to the 25 bed hospital to do the hospital laundry each weekend.
- provided the manual labour after a day of caring for their patients
- kept laundry bright by boiling with homemade soap in copper pots on the stove. Other items were individually done in a tub and scrubbed over a board.
- kept hospital charts, accounts and business transactions.
- manually prepared food and served patients.
- did their own baking, preserving and canning to stock the larder.

Did you know that Sister M Ursula was the niece of Ada Egan.....one of the graduates from the class of 1915.

**1920** The Ontario government began plans to enact a registration law which required all nursing students to write departmental exams on the completion of their course. This would provide extensive improvements in all schools of nursing seeking provincial approval.

**1926** Scarlet fever epidemic closed St. Joseph's Hospital to visitors and struck a number of its nurses. The General Hospital treated the nurses at the General Hospital at no charge.

**1916** Dr Downes was St Joseph's 1<sup>st</sup> intern.

**1926** Dr. Downes gave intensive review courses to the class of 1926 to write the first set of R.N. exams. All the students passed and for years St. Joseph's nurses did not fail their exams. Special efforts were made to prepare its students for advanced work and in choosing candidates with superior qualifications.

**1934** Dr Downes became Chairman of the executive at St Joseph's.

Alumnae meetings had guest speakers. Topics included obstetrics and gynecology, anaesthetics, shock treatments, importance of charting and keeping medical records, Cancer of the larynx, neurosurgery, and hypnosis.

**1951** Alumnae members in full graduation uniform gave tours of the new maternity wing when it opened.

**1962** The nurses in full dress uniform were the honour guard for the opening of the Mary Grace Wing.





**1965** The Globe and Mail featured an article about nursing in the late 1800's. Nurses salaries are \$30.00 /month with a 50¢ increase in five years provided the hospital isn't in debt.

**2014** The first year to hold a Reunion Day Luncheon following the the Reunion Day Mass in the same facility.

Sister Rita graduated from St. Michael's School of Nursing in Toronto in 1941. She worked as a stewardess for Trans Canada Airlines (now known as Air Canada). At that time a stewardess must be a registered nurse. She logged more than 1 million flying miles. She went on to be the Chief Stewardess of 200 people helping to choose new personnel and ran the training school near Montreal. She also helped design their uniforms used in the early 1960's.



Sister Ann Marshall (Sister Maris Stella) was the night supervisor at age 24. She spent 17 years doing mission work in Jamaica. The class of 1956 donated \$100 a year towards her work.



## 1989 Office of the Mayor Proclamation

Wednesday May 31, 1989 was proclaimed “**St. Joseph’s School of Nursing Alumnae Hamilton Day**” by the City of Hamilton.

His worship Mayor Robert M. Morrow, presented Jackie Wade ’71A, the President of the Alumnae, with a framed plaque to be displayed in the hospital.

In his remarks to the Alumnae he made reference to the high esteem St. Joseph’s Hospital and it’s nurses enjoyed in the community.

Irene Guay Bayliss, Class of 1931, was the Mayor’s mother-in-law.

**1856** The Diocese of Hamilton was established.

**1861** St. Joseph’s Hospital and Home for the Aged in Guelph welcomed the sick poor. The School of Nursing admitted the 1<sup>st</sup> class of student nurses in 1904.

**1924** St. Mary’s Hospital in Kitchener opened. The 1<sup>st</sup> nurses graduated in 1927.

**1955** St. Joseph’s Hospital in Brantford opened. The 1<sup>st</sup> R.N.A. program was established.  
St. Joseph’s Home Care, formerly St. Elizabeth Nurses Association, joined the Health System.

In a presentation given by Sister Ann Anderson in 2010, she remarked that “Interesting to note that all the above were opened with trust in God, with gifts from benefactors, and generous support financially and in kind, by the Laity of the Diocese”.

**1986** The International Outreach Program was initiated. The Sisters 1<sup>st</sup> program was to Dominica, WI. In the following years assistance was given to Montserra, St. Kitt’s, Jamaica, Russia, and Romania. Currently the International Outreach Program extend its educational and training trips to Uganda, Sudan, and Haiti only.

**2009** The Sisters relinquished the sponsorship of the Health System due too age and declining membership in the Congregation.

**2011** New governance structure was in place in accordance with Canonical requirements. The Bishop of the Diocese will be responsible for the “Juridic Person”, who will oversee all things Canonical, for the St. Joseph’s Health System of which there are 7 members, and the International Outreach Program. The Congregation will no longer be responsible for these ministries.

Cheryl Gravelin McQueen '66 provided the following information about the Ville Marie on the Island of Montreal and 4 of its residents.

- In 1666 the population was 627 people.
- **Urbain Gravelin** (Urbain Baudreau dit Graveline) was Cheryl's great, great, great, great, great grandfather. In 1663 he was elected the 1<sup>st</sup> Mayor / Trustee of Ville Marie on the Island of Montreal for a term of 3 years.
- **Jeanne Mance**, the 1<sup>st</sup> lay nurse, founded Montreal's 1<sup>st</sup> hospital the Hotel Dieu, which was completed in 1645.
- **Marguerite Bourgeoys** founded the Congregation de Notre Dame, a religious community devoted to education in Montreal.
- **Paul Chomedey**, Maisonneuve, founded the Island of Montreal on May 17<sup>th</sup>, 1642. He founded a city that was then called Ville Marie. He was the 1<sup>st</sup> Governor of Montreal.

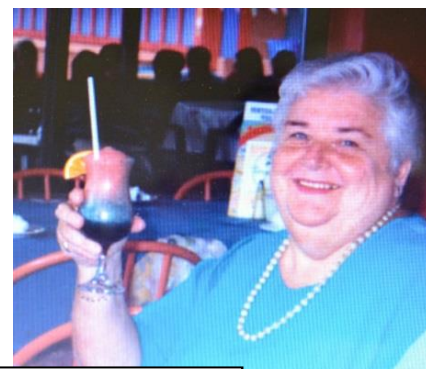

**1879** The House of Providence

With the approbation of Bishop Peter F. Crinnon of Hamilton, Reverend John McNulty purchased property in Dundas and presented it to the Sisters.

He asked that the Sisters of St. Joseph care for the poor and the aged.



The original building was destroyed by fire in 1900 and was reconstructed within 1 year. This was replaced in 1970 with a new modern building and renamed St. Joseph Villa.

Two new additions were completed in 2002. Donations from Margaret and Charles Juravinski, and the Neil and Anne McArthur family in 2005, ensured the completion of the new building.

**1890** June 20<sup>th</sup> saw the 1<sup>st</sup> operation, a repair of a vesico-vaginal fistula, using chloroform for the anaesthetic. The patient went home in 1 month.

**1890** December 10<sup>th</sup>, an “attending staff” of physicians was formed.

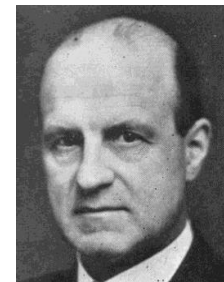


1923 Dr Fred Bowman was the 1<sup>st</sup> physician at St. Joseph's Hospital to be trained in the use of Insulin.

1923 Dr. J. H. Sullivan was the 1<sup>st</sup> chairman of the medical staff. St Joseph Hospital was recognized by the American College of Surgeons ,,, "Grade A".

***The following guidelines applied to maintain accreditation***

- Careful, fully documented, diagnosis prior to surgery.
- Recording of details of each operation performed.
- Improved qualifications for anaesthetists.
- Laboratory services run by a competent pathologist.
- Radiology department supervised by a qualified radiologist.
- Clinical records of all patients were to be completed.
- Doctors who failed to comply, would have their privileges suspended, until the requirements were met.
- Medical staff was to meet once a month to review all hospital deaths and the number of autopsies in relation to the number of deaths.
- Food services had to be under the supervision of a trained dietitian.

1924 Sister Monica's Ward for children was established. Sr. Virginia described it as a large room, down 5 steps from the kitchen on "C" floor. It accomodated up to 15 patients (toddlers and older children).

1924 1st Medical staff drew up by-laws, rules, and regulations, governing both staff and visiting physicians.

1929 **"Parham" Residence Built**  
*A 4-storey building constructed as a residence for staff & employees.*

1929 Dr. A.D. Unsworth set up the laboratory.

1929 Interns earned \$600 a year.  
Registered Nurses salary ranged from \$1,000 to \$1,825 per year.  
Hospital engineer earned \$1,560  
Dietitian earned \$900.  
Maids were paid \$216 to \$420 per year.

**1929** Bed capacity of 185 patients.  
Hospital provided medical, surgical, obstetrical and gynecological care.  
Eye Ear Nose and Throat clinic.  
Urological, Orthopedic, Pediatric, and Dermatological departments.

**1938** St Joseph Hospital had approval from the Canadian Hospital Association for the training of interns. Interns studied diseases of the chest through affiliation with the Hamilton Sanatorium.

Nurses received pediatric training at the Children's Hospital in Detroit, Michigan.

Doctors had monthly meetings and discussed advances in anaesthetics, improved x-ray equipment, diagnostic tools such as ECG, shock therapy for schizophrenics, and pertussis vaccines to mention a few.

Sulpha drugs were introduced at the hospital.

**1943** Penicillin was administered in the hospital. It had been previously used only in the armed forces.

**1944** Bishop Joseph Ryan gave approval to build a new 400 bed hospital.

**1945** Saw the formation of the Hospital Auxillary. Proceeds from events such as teas, card parties, dances, bazaars and tag days, enabled the auxillary to make contributions.



The Auxillary bought linen for the hospital, purchased equipment, and made cash donations. An instrument costing \$1,800 was donated to the pathology lab for use in preparing samples for post-mortem examinations.

Central oxygen system was installed to deliver oxygen to the patient's bedside.

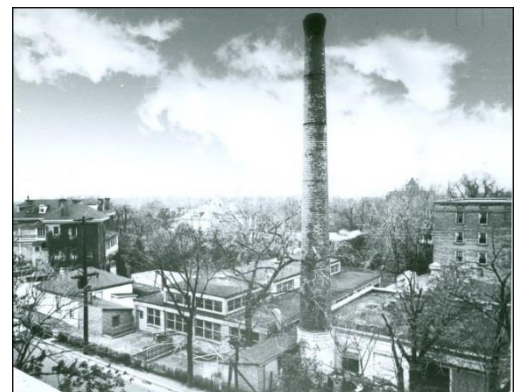
They awarded a scholarship annually to a deserving student in the nursing school and needy families received clothing.

**1949** St. Joseph's built an air conditioned laundry building linked by a tunnel to the hospital. It was located on St. Joseph's Drive.

It had terrazzo floors, buff-coloured tile walls, and pale green woodwork.

It was efficient, sanitary, and practical, with the most modern equipment.

(It would have been located on the roof top deck outside the cafeteria, near the old Centre building).





**1951** The new Mother House was built off Hwy 6.



**1952** The Lay Advisory Board was formed.

**1955** New Chapel built in the hospital in the Centre building.



- St. Joseph's Hospital received a 3 year accreditation.
- Space from the old chapel, became the Physiotherapy department.

**Late 1950's** Provincial government introduced the Hospital Insurance Program.

**1958** Established isotope laboratory. Dr. C. Jaimet was named Canada's 1<sup>st</sup> Professor of Nuclear Medicine and was certified by the Atomic Energy Commission of Canada to administer radio-active materials to patients. He helped to forge the link between fundamental research at McMaster University and practical application of tests and treatments at St Joseph's.

***St Joseph's was the first Canadian hospital to engage in research. St Joseph's made medical history with 3 nuclear scientists on staff (1 physicist, 1 biologist, and 1 chemist)***

**1959** Canadian Program of Accreditation began and St. Joseph's Hospital met the standards.

**1960** Dr Kenneth Williams became the 1<sup>st</sup> Medical Director, and held this position until 1965.

- His goal was to maintain "accreditation". Surgery would be deferred, excluding emergencies, until the physician had written necessary records.
- Under his guidance committees relevant to credentials were formed for anaesthesia, interns, medical records, tissue, patient admission and discharge.



- Monthly mandatory meetings were held with the Medical Advisory Committee (MAC).
- Adherence to basics of patient safety was stressed, writing of medical records, pre-surgical diagnoses, completely documented histories and physical exams of all patients in the hospital
- St. Joseph's was the 1<sup>st</sup> hospital to participate in Professional Activity Study in Michigan, auditing medical records. This program developed in Canada was called Hospital Medical Records Institute until 1990. It is now called Canadian Institute of Health Information. It measured the hospital's willingness and ability to compare its performance with that of other hospitals participating in the study.
- A data storage and retrieval system (medical audit plan) with monthly readouts to profile physicians' patterns of practice was installed. The medical staff would investigate, discuss, and judge them with a goal of self-improvement.

**1960** Construction for the new surgical wing began. Total amount needed was \$8,450,000.00. Grants of \$3,050,000.00 were obtained from federal and provincial government. \$1,000,000.00 donated by the Sisters of St Joseph. \$2,000,000.00 donated by the City of Hamilton. There was a public appeal made for the rest of the money.



Less than 2 years later, the objective was reached.

Sister Mary Grace had been transferred to St. Mary's Hospital in Kitchener before construction began. The new building was officially opened on October 17, 1962, under the administration of Sister St. Paul Lardie.

***Interesting to note that rather than financial reward for their work the Sisters set aside an amount, equivalent to their salaries, each year. They applied this amount of money to enlarging and improving the hospital whenever necessary.***

**1962 Mary Grace Wing**

Hospital had diesel auxiliary power in event of power failure.

- ***1<sup>st</sup> floor housed facilities and departments with related functions grouped together***  
Outpatients department, 33 beds for Intensive Care Unit and Recovery Room.
- Sister Mary Daniel was in charge of the Operating Room since 1950. She approached Sister Virginia to have specialty charge nurses.





- There were 12 operating rooms with their own delivery service for clean and contaminated items. Combustible gases were used in OR. Thus a machine was installed at doorway to detect static electricity. 2 rooms had built in overhead x-ray equipment.
- Patient bedside had push button controls for radio, TV, and music.
- Patient rooms on 2 outer corridors with a Nurse Server at entrance to each patient room

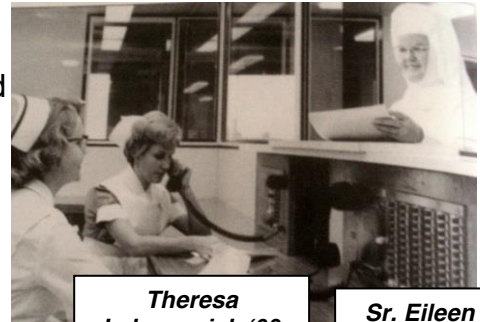

**1963 Fontbonne Hall** Residence was opened

- 1<sup>st</sup> floor had classrooms, offices for administrative staff, a fully equipped laboratory for scientific experiments, and a large library covering all fields of medicine and nursing.
- front entrance was on James St. South with a waiting room for friends and visitors.
- switchboard was located near the front entrance.
- large gymnasium on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor.
- on each floor there was a lounge and a fully equipped kitchen.
- the roof was divided into games and T.V. areas. A television and stereo had been donated by the Alumnae.

The Board set the rules, regulations and by-laws by which the hospital operates, answerable to the Sisters.

As owners, the Sisters determine policy and a mission statement that governs how the hospital should be run.



**1969** Affiliation agreement was signed with McMaster University by Sister Mary Grace. St. Joseph's was the 1<sup>st</sup> hospital in Hamilton to establish formal Accord with the medical school. Later this affiliated with Mohawk College. It included practical and clinical experience in physiotherapy, nursing, occupational therapy, radiology, and medical technology.

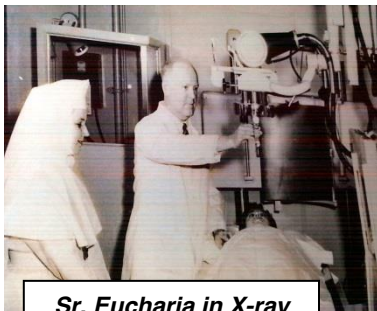

**RN gets Indspire Award**

Ruby Jacobs says she is thrilled to receive a 2013 Indspire Award. Formerly known as the National Aboriginal Achievement Award, it recognizes indigenous professionals and youth who demonstrate outstanding career achievement. Jacobs – who joined other honourees in Saskatoon in February – is credited with revolutionizing health care on Six Nations of the Grand River First Nation, near Brantford. As former director of health services, a position she held for 13 years, Jacobs led in the development of almost two dozen community health initiatives, all of which she says were born out of a community needs assessment in the early 90s. The number of health professionals for Six Nations has grown from just four when Jacobs began in 1994 to over 200 today, serving almost 24,000 band members. Her leadership has also resulted in expanded programs for long-term care, mental health, child health, social development, and sexual health. Jacobs' 48-year nursing career includes over two decades as a teacher. After retiring in 2007, she began serving as a board member for the Niagara Haldimand Brant LHIN. She joined Six Nations by serving as president of the board.

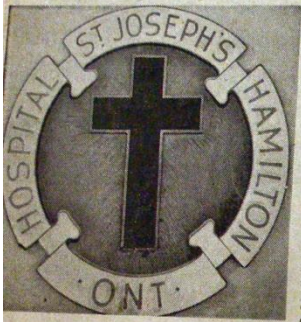

**Nurses' Pins A Bond With Past**

**Gold Emblem Marks A Dream Come True**

This is the season of nursing school graduations. To every girl who has successfully completed the requirements of a school of nursing, a little pin which is presented to her at graduation time represents the achievement of her ambitions.

THROUGHOUT her life, very few of her possessions will be prized as highly as her nurse's pin. Much hard work and many dreams are bound in the small golden emblem.

Of the three schools of nursing in Hamilton, the oldest, that of Hamilton General Hospital, has had five pins. The first design, dated October, 1891, was created by the late Mrs. Moss Olmsted, mother of the late Dr. Ingersoll Olmsted, at that time medical superintendent of the hospital. It was a large square gold pin with a maple leaf in each corner, bearing on its face the city's coat of arms with the words "Prudence, Commerce and Industry."

IN 1893 the pin was made shorter and wider, and the inscription was engraved around the centre design, which was flatter than previously.

In 1906 this pin was made smaller, because some of the nurses objected to its size. It was then similar in size and design to the present pin except that Hamilton City Hospital Training School was lettered in blue enamel on a gold circle around the centre design.

Another change was made in 1924, when the name Hamilton General Hospital Training School was inscribed in gold lettering on a circle of blue enamel, a reversal of colors.

The last change was made this year. The design of the pin was not changed, but the inscription now reads "St. Joseph's School of Nursing."

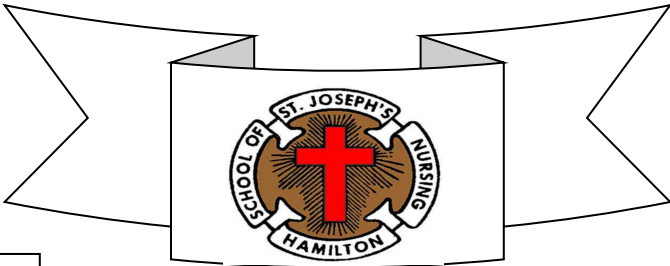
