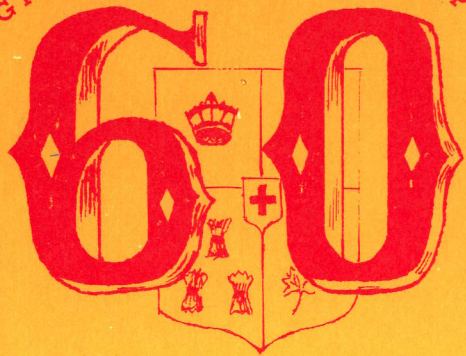

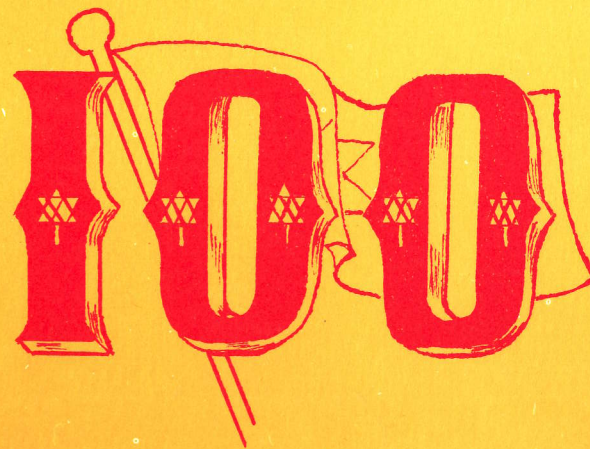

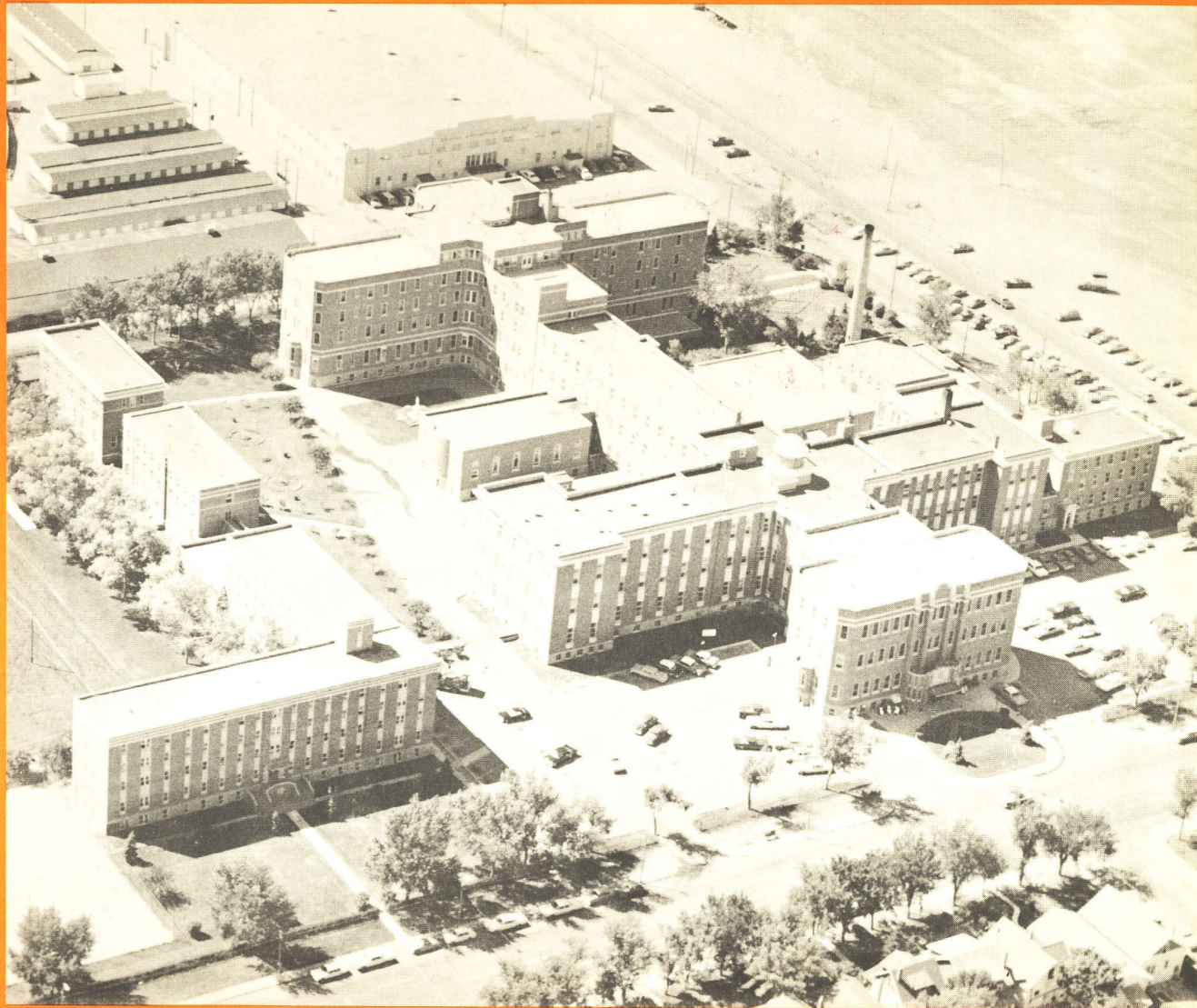

1967 marks a century of growth for Canada and the sixtieth anniversary of our hospital. ## Medical Staff Presidents

Our hospital has given sixty years of devoted service to this community. From the very humble beginnings in 1907, we have now grown to a very complicated medical organization. However, the first requisite of any good medical unit is sound nursing care, which our Sisters of Charity at the Grey Nuns' Hospital have given the citizens of southern Saskatchewan for the past sixty years. The Medical Staff has grown from a few individuals to well over a hundred and seventy Doctors on staff at the present time. The Medical Staff is always desirous of looking after the community to the best of its ability and feels that, with the growing needs of this community, our hospital should be up-dated and modernized. With the double celebration of our Canadian Centennial, as well as the hospital's Diamond Jubilee, it is only fitting that the Medical Staff feels that the Sister Superior's plans for the future of the hospital will be finalized and well on the road to successful completion.

# School of Nursing

The period between the golden and diamond jubilees of the Hospital and School of Nursing, 1957–1967, has witnessed marked changes in the nursing education program.

A total of 2,136 students have graduated from the School of Nursing since its inception in 1907.

Under the directorship of Sister T. Castonguay, the first two-year program in the prairie provinces was initiated in 1962 at the Regina Grey Nuns' School of Nursing; 51 students have graduated from this program.

The last decade has brought about major changes in the program, including more teaching in the behavioral sciences and an increase in community health experiences.

The total faculty now numbers 23, including a psychiatric nursing instructor at Saskatchewan Hospital, Weyburn.

In 1967 the class at the Grey Nuns' School of Nursing will be enrolled in a two-year nursing education program.

Future plans for the School of Nursing include phasing into the Regina Central School under the Department of Education.
