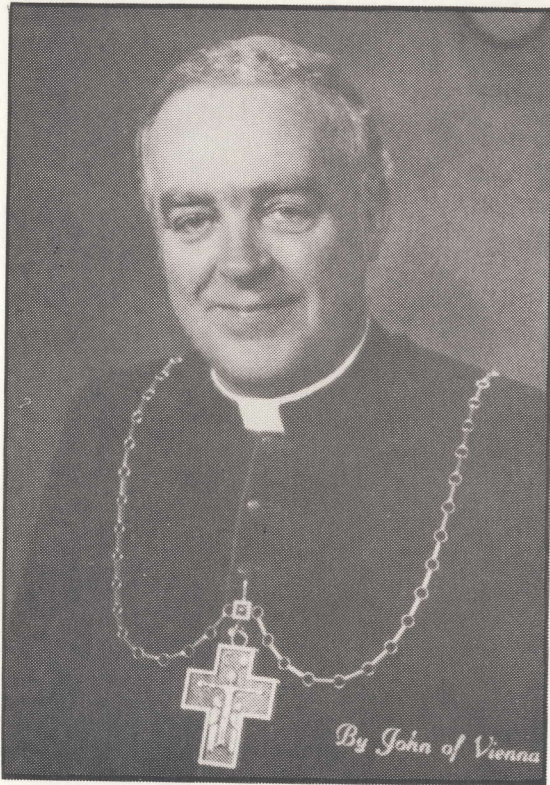

ST. PETER'S HOSPITAL

St. Peter's Hospital, Melville, Saskatchewan, was originally founded as a municipal hospital on June 29, 1940 by the Sisters of St. Martha, Antigonish, Nova Scotia. The Sisters accepted the ownership of the hospital at the request of the Town of Melville and the Archbishop of Regina. Since September 1, 1980, the hospital has been owned and operated by the Catholic Health Council of Saskatchewan. This council is an entity which was formed in 1976 for the express purpose of maintaining the Catholic identity and philosophy in Catholic Health Care facilities no longer operated by religious orders.

The Catholic Health Council of Saskatchewan approves the appointment of a Board of Trustees, representative of the community served, and entrusts in them the responsibility for the operation and direction of the hospital.
