

FOREWORD

I am pleased to have this opportunity of extending my hearty congratulations to the Sisters of St. Anne on the magnificent work done in St. Joseph's Hospital ever since its foundation sixty years ago. True, they enjoyed the co-operation of devoted and zealous members of the Medical Profession, but none realize better than these that the achievements of the past sixty years would bave been practically impossible without the spirit of generous self-sacrifice so characteristic of the Sisters in charge.

The care of the sick had always been considered among the noblest works of mercy. Those who ministered to them during the early stages of the Christian era, or erected hospitals for their welfare as Fabiola did, were merely endeavoring to exemplify in their own lives the practice and teaching of their Divine Master. The same Divine example has been, down the centuries, the inspiration for nearly all the devotion of physicians and nurses to suffering humanity. The constant aim of the Sisters of St. Anne has been to maintain these principles and traditions unsullied and unbroken in all the hospitals under their care. Their labors in this respect have been most successful.

They were great men, these doctors who were associated with the founding and development of St. Joseph's Hospital. Their faith taught them reverence for the rights of human life, no matter to what stage of existence it might belong. No mercy killing was recognized in any Christian country in those days. Their business was to save human life, to alleviate pain as much as possible, and to encourage those whose sufferings were intense, to bear them with fortitude and resignation. Here again the Saviour's example was both the ideal and the inspiration.

The founding of the School of Nursing doubtless provided added opportunities for the extension of hospital service, especially as nurses were not so numerous then as in more recent years. The excellent reputation for character and ability which its graduates have always enjoyed proves sound judgment in both selection of candidates and the training afforded. The progress of Science in recent years, along with the higher scholarship required for admission to the Nursing Profession, should mean better educated nurses; but unless the old-fashioned virtues of honcsty and patience, charity and kindness, continue to be stressed as in days of yore, the value of the Nurses' services to stricken humanity will not be correspondingly increased.

May God bless all those charged with the care of the sick, and the training of nurses for that particular work. I feel sure that the principles of Christian ethics will always be observed by physicians and nurses alike at St. Joseph's Hospital; and I trust that both the Hospital and its School of Nursing will continue to share in the enjoyment of public esteem as well as in the satisfaction that comes from the consciousness of work faithfully done.



A Page of History


The year 1935 marks the sixtieth anniversary of the founding of St. Joseph's Hospital and the thirty-fifth anniversary of the opening of St. Joseph's School of Nursing.

St. Joseph's Hospital, in its inception, was the dream of Bishop Demers, but it was left to his successor, Archbishop Charles J. Seghers, to see this dream realized. The Sisters of St. Ann who, since 1858, had been conducting a Boarding and Day School in Victoria, frequently extended their works of mercy to the sick.

Recognizing the need for an organized hospital in Victoria, the Sisters acceded to the requent of the Hon. Dr. John S. Helmcken, and prepared to undertake the work.

In 1867 St. Joseph's Hospital was opened, affording accommodation for thirty-five patients.

In 1888 and 1897 additions to the original Hospital were built. In 1900 the School of Nursing was opened; in 1908 the Humboldt wing was bulit; and finally in 1929, the Surgical and Maternity Unit completed the hospital as it stands today.

In 1926, "Vernon Villa" was acquired as an annex for the treatment of tuberculous patients. This ideal place of rest is set in a garden where sunshine and fresh air, coupled with scientific treatment, bring health and strength to many.

In 1930 the Nurses' Residence was built.

In 1920 St. Joseph's Ladies' Auxiliary and Alumnae Association were formed. In 1927 the Junior Auxiliary was organized. In 1932 Vernon Villa Ladies' Auxiliary was organized.

In 1919 St. Joseph's was officially approved and recognized as a Standardized Hospital, and in 1920, it was ranked Class "A" Hospital by the American College of Physicians and Surgeons. The minimum standard required to obtain this classification is as follows:

- 1. That physicians and surgeons privileged to practice in the hospital be organized as a definite group or Staff.
- 2. That membership upon the Staff be restricted to physicians and surgeons who are competent in their respective fields.
- 3. That the Staff initiate and, with the governing Board of the hospital, adopt rules and regulations specifically providing:



- (a) That staff meetings be held at least once a month.
- (b) That the staff review and analyze, at regular intervals, the clinical experience of the staff in the various departments of the hospital.


That accurate and complete case records be written for all patients, and be kept in an accessible manner in the hospital.

That clinical laboratory facilities be available for the study, diagnosis, and treatment of patients.



The Sun Deck

Atop the new wing of the Hospital is a great stretch of sun deck, with an uninterrupted view of the sea and the snow-capped Olympics in the distance. The hospital beds have special rubber wheels so that the patients can be wheeled to the elevator and conveniently conveyed to the roof, where they receive the therapeutic benefits of the direct rays of the sun. The elevator that leads to the roof deck is one of the latest achievements of the Otis-Fensom Elevator Company. It is a full-automatic micro-levelling car, with a floating platform, and is equipped with every possible safety device.



The Nurses' Residence

The Nurses' Residence is a four-storey brick and concrete structure with accommodation for one hundred and thirty students. It is equipped with class-rooms, dietetic and chemical laboratories, library, readings rooms, demonstration rooms, besides a beautiful large living room and three smaller sitting rooms, and a kitchenette. A large Auditorium and a roof deck afford excellent facilities for entertainments, games, etc.

The School of Nursing

The School of Nursing was opened in 1900. It granted to the Sisters of St. Ann the opportunity of carrying on within hospital walls the chief work of their Institution, the education of youth, and afforded to girls special training for the scientific and intelligent care of the sick.

Each succeeding year. St. Joseph's School of Nursing presents a graduating class, who, going

forth, are expected, true to the teaching of their Alma Mater, to carry into the homes of the sick and afflicted, not only professional skill, but also Christ-like care, comfort and consolation.

The diploma of the School admits the graduate to examination for registration in the Province of British Columbia.

Besides registration according to the Regular Course prescribed for Schools of Nursing in British Columbia, St. Joseph's provides Post-graduate Courses in X-Ray Technique, Pathological Laboratory Technique and Surgery.

Since the opening of the School of Nursing, Members of the Victoria Medical Profession have given generously of their valuable time to provide lecture courses for the students.

Graduate Nurses of St. Joseph's School of Nursing are eligible for membership in their Alumnae Association. This Association forms a strong bond between the Graduates of the School and their Hospital.

To Mother Mary Bridget, who was associated with St. Joseph's Hospital for over sixty years.

EDITORIAL-Victoria Daily Times, January 14th, 1933

"MOTHER MARY BRIDGET was a conspicuous member of the band of pioneer nuns whose services to this province transcended all material considerations and calculations. With the same self-sacrificing zeal which inspired the Sisters of earlier generations to give their lives to the alleviation of suffering and spiritual uplift in Canada when it was peopled almost entirely by aborigines, these remarkable women, turning their backs upon worldly comforts and pleasures, devoted themselves to the welfare of British Columbia in early days, attending suffering and distress, and imparting very necessary mental and spiritual stimulus to those who otherwise would have given up in despair.

To this noble service Mother Mary Bridget consecrated herself some sixty-five years ago, and undeviatingly carried her cross in its behalf to the end of her life. She was intimately connected with the founding of St. Joseph's Hospital, under the direction of Mother Mary Providence as Provincial Superior. She was an accomplished nurse and it would be impossible to overestimate the contribution she has made to the relief of human suffering in her long association with this fine institution. Likewise her connection with St. Ann's Convent and her interest in the cause of education will long be remembered. Indeed her whole life, exceeding eighty years, has been a challenge to the materialistic philosophy which for a generation has outwardly dominated the earth, but which is passing away under the pressure of social and economic distress.

Her life just closed is an inspiration to humanity, a reminder that the justification for our civilization, as well as its only hope of survival, lies in the measure in which mankind exalts the things of the spirit over the things of the flesh.

Mother Mary Bridget's career represents much more than that zeal of a venerable Sisterhood in a great Church. In many of its respects it furnishes a key to the solution of the grim problems which are now distracting the world. The qualities of self-sacrifice, human sympathy and unselfishness, must be in the ascendant throughout the world before mankind will be able to escape from the predicament into which it has plunged itself by its negation of these elementary requirements."

Valedictory of 1933 Graduating Class

"No greater heroine could be placed before us as our model than Mother Mary Bridget. Never did this dear Mother falter before the trials that met her at every turn, be those trials financial or other. Was there a pain-racked body to be relieved? Then it must be relieved regardless of cost or time. Was there a work of charity to be performed? Then with never a moment's hesitation, the work was done. Far too busy doing things, she had neither the time nor the inclination to record them, but the grateful hearts of her beneficiaries could not forget the cheerful unceasing labor of so many years, and today, as in days agone, "Many rise up and call her blessed."

Her life has taught us:



Ceremony for the Conferring of the Cap on the First Year, First Term Students

EXTRACT:—Victoria Daily Colonist, January 4, 1935.

There is something touchingly sublime in the mission of a nurse. This intangible something was strikingly evident in the simple ceremony which marked the completion of the first semester for a class of students in St. Joseph's School of Nursing on Saturday evening.

Presiding on this occasion were Mother Provincial, Sister Superior, the Director of the School of Nursing, the Instructor of Nurses, and the Supervisors of the Departments.

Following the processional march, Miss Alice Tevini, Miss Elizabeth Mc-Leod and Miss Louie Duggan, in the name of the Class, read papers which they prepared stressing the special virtues of the true nurse: Purity, Loyalty and Truth These papers showed an understanding of the virtues which fit the nurse for her noble profession and which draw to her the confidence and respect of patients and physicians, and moreover merit for her the eternal recognition of her devoted works of charity.

At the conclusion of the reading, the Class, joining hands to form a large circle, took the following pledge:

We as loyal daughters of our Alma Mater, pledge ourselves to strive to remain faithful to her ideals of Purity, Loyalty, and Truth.

Purity

Purity renders one's soul beautiful in the sight of God and even in the sight of men. It sets one apart, with its rare and unmarred beauty, and is in itself, because of the influence and respect it evokes, a sort of protection for the soul. To win the respect of others one must respect herself—purity is the essence of self-respect.

A pure soul reflects the image of the Creator and makes one realize in some slight degree the essential beauty of an immortal soul. Though our realization be at its best but a dim vestige of the truth, it is only in a chaste soul that we can catch even this glimpse of its beauty.

In these days, when youth is assailed on all sides by insidious attacks, every precaution is necessary to guard purity. If minds would remain untainted by the subtle onslaughts of the new paganism, unmoved by its plea for frankness, its appearance of virtue, they must reject from the first its main tenet which holds that all that is natural is right and good.

Naturalism claims honesty and courage as its characteristic virtues and thus makes a special appeal to the enthusiasm of youth. In its desire to attain freedom of nature, youth would do away with all restraint and self-control, thus denying the very virtues it would assume; for what is more courageous than self-control, what more essentially true than purity?

Purity is absolute truth and absolute beauty—unattainable, of course, in its perfection, but none the less to be upheld and striven for courageously. It is the greatest ornament of youth, its infallible guide and highest ideal. "Blessed are the pure of heart for they shall see God" not only in the next world, but in this life, in the innumerable manifestations of His truth and beauty, and mirrored in chaste souls.

Loyalty

Loyalty is the virtue of consistent and persevering fidelity to the persons, causes and institutions to whom one gives allegiance or pledges her service. It is manifested in thoughts, words and actions, and is an infallible mark of true nobility of character.

Loyalty above all means fidelity to God, our Creator and our hope of salvation. It is shown by obedience to God's commands. The nurse deals not with human bodies alone, but with human life, with body and soul. She must recognize the spiritual life of her patient and minister to the whole individual, else her service becomes materialistic and mechanical.

In entering a School of Nursing the Student carries with her the pledge of loyalty. This is shown by a ready observance of the school regulations. It is admitted that no Institution is perfect, not through the fault of the institution, but because the individuals who comprise it are human and hence liable to err. Student nurses should be loyal to their Alma Mater and defend her interests as their own; they should treat all persons with respect and courtesy. Each student holds the reputation of the Hospital and School in her keeping. "A chain is only as strong as its weakest link."

Loyalty to physicians requires that their orders be implicitly and punctually obeyed, and that care be exercised to preserve the sacred relations that exist between a patient and his physician. Loyalty to patients demands that the nurse hold in trust all that comes to her knowledge in the exercise of her profession.

Loyalty is a contagious spirit, therefore, let us each and all resolve to support our dear St. Joseph's by the whole-hearted loyalty it deserves.

Truth

Truth is the real foundation of character. It is defined as the object of the intellect, the ultimate state of perfection sought by the mind and soul of man.

The life of a Nurse based on Truth is a harmony like unto the melody of a great orchestra where many instruments must blend together. Just as the conductor must conceive a finished melodious symphony and train each member to know and understand his instrument and music, so must a nurse conceive an ideal of truth and train her intellect and will to be in harmony with it. There must be no discord between these two great faculties of the mind. The outer expression must be in harmony with the inner conviction set by the highest ideal of Truth of which the nurse is capable.

The forming of this ideal depends upon the heredity, environment and personal traits of the nurse. Her conception of Truth will differ from that of her neighbor just as the lilt of Irish music differs from the proud strains of the German opera. It is not usually a conscious process. It is the result of continuous action and of admiration of good and noble people and things.

The soul of man tends in its aspirations towards eternal Truth, eternal Love and eternal Beauty. Finite reasoning cannot grasp the meaning of the word Eternal, nor can it hope to fathom the depths of Truth. Man's conception of truth may be faulty, hedged in by limited intellect and weakness of humanity, yet, if a nurse brings, as an offering, unswerving devotion to Truth as it is given to her to understand it, she may safely leave the rest in the Hands of God whom she daily serves.

School Song


With clasp of hand and with a friendly greeting, O come and join in festive song,

Through the generosity of the friends and well-wishers of St. Joseph's Hospital the following Bursaries are awarded to deserving students:


Ten dollars presented by the Victoria Graduate Nurses' Association for the first year student who excels in the practice of nursing.

Extra Curricular Activities

Physical Education is a necessary part of the Nurses' training, promoting the co-ordination of mind and body. It is a powerful means for the fostering and the strengthening of worthy attitudes and developing naturally the social, moral and spiritual qualities of the individual.

The School of Nursing has opened classes in Physical Education under the leadership of Mr. I. C. Basanta. Mr. Basanta enjoys a splendid record in this field of education, having been for seven years Supervisor of Physical Education in Halifax, and Instructor in Summer Schools in several provinces of the Dominion, including British Columbia.

St. Joseph's is admirably situated for recreational pursuits. The nearby Crystal Gardens and swimming pools, the golf links and tennis courts provide ample opportunity for physical culture, the Provincial Museum and St. Ann's Academy Museum afford intellectual entertainment, while the restful beauty of Beacon Hill Park and the invigorating breezes of the Pacific invite the student to a quiet hour with Nature in her many moods.

Dramatics

The value of Dramatics as a phase of hospital study and training is evident. Drama is a representation of life in its various moods. The nurse must be a student of life, not only as an analyst but also as a dramatist—she must not only be able to recognize character as a type but also be prepared to enter sympathetically into it, to feel its needs and know how to answer them.

The freedom of imagination which makes play-acting so natural to a child is revived on the stage. This free imagination, coupled with adult understanding of the vital elements of life worked out in dramatization, is of practical value to the nurse.

St. Joseph's School of Nursing has made history for itself in this field by the annual presentation of Christmas and other concerts. Active plans for the further development of this important branch of student activity includes the formation of a debating society, for the study and practice of Public Speaking. A Course in Parliamentary Law, and the Study Club method employed at present in some of the Classes of the regular programme, tend also towards this end.

The Students of Today Greet the Students of Yesterday

What we are and what we do depends to a great extent on the experiences and example of those who have preceded us. You, the students of our School for the last thirty-five years, have blazed for us a trail, sometimes deep and rugged, it is true, but always straight and well-defined. You have chosen diverse paths in life and have made the name of St. Joseph's nurses known and respected in many countries. As students we realize our responsibility in upholding the reputation you have won for our School. We pledge ourselves to be true to the standards of Alma Mater and to be loyal to the profession we have chosen.




With the death of Miss Mary Macnamara, September 19, 1935, there passed away from our midst a figure for many years familiar to all associated with St. Joseph's. Miss Macnamara was born in Ireland and took her course in nursing in Edinburgh, Scotland. After graduating, she nursed for a few years in England before coming to Victoria. Her first connection with St. Joseph's was as night supervisor in the first Hospital on Collinson Street. Later she went to San Francisco and there became Super-


intendent successively of St. Winnifred's Hospital, the California General Hospital, the McNutt Hospital (now Trinity Hospital). After the San Francisco earthquake in 1907, Miss Macnamara returned to Victoria and, when the Maternity wing of St. Joseph's was opened, she took charge of the nursery until organization of the Department was complete. She continued as a resident of the hospital until her death in her seventy-seventh year, esteemed and beloved by her many friends.






