ST. JOSEPH'S HOSPITAL

—A Page from the Past

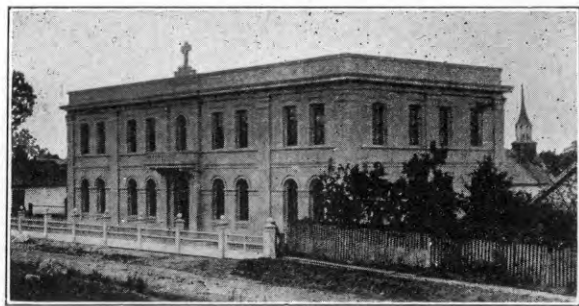
St. Joseph's Hospital has reached its seventy-fifth year. On an August day in the year 1875, His Excellency Most Reverend Charles John Seghers and the Honourable Dr. John Sebastian Helmcken stood side by side in the midst of an enthusiastic assembly of Victoria's citizens to lay the corner-stone of the original unit on Collinson Street.

Addressing the distinguished gathering, His Excellency pointed out the significance of the event which was to give to the City a permanent institution for the care of the sick. This institution was to be, through the Sisters of St. Ann, a gift to charity and to service. He then invited Dr. Helmcken to initiate the work, in the name of the physicians of that day, by performing the symbolic ceremony. The Archbishop's words have been preserved:

"In selecting you, Honourable Sir, to lay the corner-stone of this charitable institution, our object is to honour, in you, the friend of the poor and the humane reliever of human suffering and misery in its multiple forms. . . .

"Therefore, for the greater glory of God and of His Saints, for the relief of suffering humanity, and in the name of heaven-born charity, I have the pleasure of requesting you, assisted by the members of the medical profession, to lay the foundation stone of St. Joseph's Hospital. . . ."

Responsibility for the erection of the building was undertaken by the intrepid Mother Mary Providence, without any financial reserve. Her confidence and her faith were rewarded. Generous donations enabled the work to proceed. The two-storey, 35 bed brick structure stood ready, at a cost of \$13,900 to receive patients on June 25th, 1876. It did not have

to wait long. While opening festivities were in progress, while guests were still admiring the modern facilities for the care of the sick, a seriously injured stretcher-borne Chinese workman was carried into one of the immaculate rooms for treatment. The work of nursing in St. Joseph's Hospital had begun.

The decades that follow tell a story of expansion and of achievement while the keynote of efficiency, in building and in service, has been sustained. In 1884 a third storey was added to the first building; in 1897 and in 1908, extensions were made that linked Collinson Street with Humboldt; in 1929 the surgical and maternity annex widened accommodation to two hundred fifty beds. This seventy-fifth anniversary finds the hospital plant in the throes of further structural development while broader fields of nursing care, of medical, surgical and radiological treatment are continually opening out.

As part of the price to be paid for renewal and expansion, the old must go. The original unit has been demolished and a new section is rising upon the corner-stone set with hope and trust in 1875.

The valiant Pioneer and Foundress of the West, **Mother Mary Providence**, was still at the helm when St. Joseph's School of Nursing was organized in the year 1900. Her successor in 1904, was **Sister Mary Bridget** whose long and zealous career as a religious and as a nurse was given to the development of St. Joseph's Hospital and School of Nursing. When she retired in 1917, **Sister Mary Margaret of the Sacred Heart** assumed Superiorship for a short period.

In 1919 a new era dawned. To the far-sightedness and organizing ability of **Sister Mary Mark**, Superior of the institution for six years, and Provincial Superior between the years of 1934 and 1941, St. Joseph owes much. Standardization of the hospital, building expansion, the or-

ganizing of Medical and Advisory Boards, of Auxiliary and Alumnae Associations, were a part of the development.

The successive administrations of **Sister Mary Mildred**, **Sister Mary Ludovic**, **Sister Mary Alfreda** and **Sister Mary Kathleen** have registered growth not only along the lines established, but in the meeting of newer requirements in keeping with scientific and medical progress.

Now, as the Golden Jubilee of the School of Nursing calls former students to their Alma Mater, to live again the years that saw them doing their part in writing the history of development, **Sister Rose Mary** is the Superior, and again new fields are opening up.

THE SCHOOL OF NURSING

Looking back over the history of hospitalization and nursing in British Columbia, we pause at the year 1900. In Victoria, the aging Mother Mary Providence and the Sisters of St. Joseph's Hospital, as well as the members of the Medical Profession, were viewing with satisfaction the rapid and beneficent development of the service to which the Sisters of St. Ann had pledged themselves in the year 1875,

but their satisfaction was not entirely complete. The long dream of establishing an institution for the sick had seen fulfilment, but now something further was needed. Advances in medical science and surgery required that nurses be trained to combine skill and efficiency with science and

knowledge. The establishment of St. Joseph's School of Nursing was to be the answer.

Among the Sisters was one whose old-world education, whose womanly intuition, and whose master mind fitted eminently for the task of organizing a programme and initiating the school. She was Sister Mary Gertrude of Jesus.

These were the days of beginnings. Textbooks on the science and practice of nursing were not to be had. Neither had any general programme been determined. Sister Mary Gertrude planned both, and took upon herself as well, the office of instructor. She is remembered not only for what she accomplished, for what she envisioned in the future, but for the ideals which permeated her lessons and influence, and the devotedness that mirrored a soul determined to make the art and science of nursing a sublime adventure for her students.

Sister Mary Anna was Sister Mary Gertrude's successor in 1913. From 1924 until 1949, except for short intervals, Sister Mary Gregory has been director, carrying on the noble tradition of her predecessors and sending forth with hope and promise from St. Joseph's School of Nursing, at least twenty-three graduating classes. It is with joy that she welcomes them now as they gather for the Golden Jubilee Reunion.

This joy is echoed sincerely by Sister Mary Claire who, for twenty years, had charge of the nursing education programme and has now replaced Sister Mary Gregory as Director of the School of Nursing. Old-time heads of departments or supervisors of wards, and all those who have been actively associated with the school of nursing participate in the Golden Jubilee rejoicing. Graduates of the years in passing will recall with grateful pleasure the names of Sister Mary Peter, Sister Mary Yolande, Sister Mary Leo, of Sisters Mary Modeste, Mary Barbara, Mary Henrietta, Mary Noemi, Mary Faustina, Mary Alena, as well as those of Sisters Mary Patrick, Mary Joseph, Mary Anne Gabrielle, . . . and then there are those who have entered the field of nursing in more recent years . . . and those engaged in the routine of hospital maintenance, as Sister Mary Marcelle in the culinary department, and a host of others.

All give welcome to the home-coming alumnae and graduates IN THIS FIFTIETH YEAR.

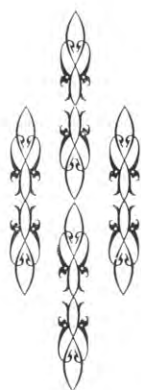

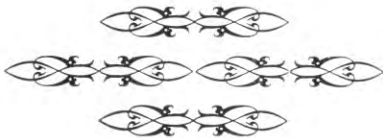


CURRICULUM

St. Joseph's School of Nursing has always offered its students the unique advantage of a combination of the "old" with the "new" in education . . . old, in its unaged tradition and culture, new in its facilities, hospital departments, equipment, and curriculum, embracing, as it does, all the essentials of modern nursing education, in theory and technique.

The course of instruction covers three years. A preliminary period of four months tests the student's aptitude for the work she wishes to undertake, and her ability to meet its particular demands.

The curriculum allows for a continuity in the development of courses that enables the student to grow professionally, and to adjust herself appropriately to each stage of her training. The alternative system provides for four periods of theory alternating with four of ward practice, allowing the student first to concentrate on the study of curriculum subjects and classroom demonstration, and then to put the knowledge and experience so gained into actual bedside nursing practice under the direction of the ward supervisor.



The faculty is made up of members of the Medical Profession who complement with lectures the classes taught by the Sisters and Nurse instructors. Rev. Dr. A. J. MacDonald is Professor of Psychology, Ethics and Religion.

The Public Health course is under the direction of the B.C. Provincial Department of Health and Welfare. Field experience is given by the Provincial Health Units and the Victorian Order of Nurses.



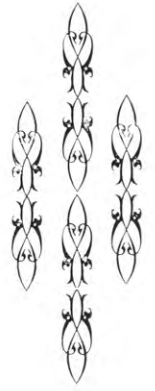

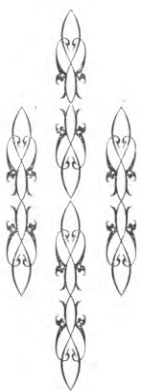
Student Council

Non Nobis Solum

"Non Nobis Solum" is the motto of St. Joseph's School of Nursing. Red and White are the colours on her standard. Neither motto nor colours signify much to the high school graduate who makes eager application for entrance to the school of nursing. However, as the young student is swept through the period of adjustment that preludes the "capping" into the continuity of actual nursing procedures, and the pattern of advancement grows clearer in the web of progress towards the end in view, she finds herself lingering musingly over the "Non Nobis Solum," and, to herself, she whispers: "True enough. I have entered a profession where self must not be sole. If I am to become a NURSE, I must bind the true White of my devotedness with the brave Red of nobility!"

The art and practice of nursing is as old as human-kind. It took upon itself new beauty and significance when Christ walked the ways of Galilee and taught men love and mercy towards his fellow-man. In early Christian days, bishops, priests and deacons were literally followers of Christ in His care for the unfortunate, setting up dispensaries in their own homes. To this day the Church considers the profession of nursing hallowed by Christ's own Charity, and is much concerned with hospitals and the care of the sick.

The Knights of St. John of Jerusalem, later called the Knights of Malta, initiated special training for those engaged in nursing and this programme of nursing education was extended before the sixteenth century, to not less than 460 institutions for the care of the sick and destitute in England alone.

Then came the spoliation of religious houses and the darkened period for nurses and the nursing profession. Out of it rose St. Vincent de Paul and the Sisters of Charity founded by him. It was their work, both in England and on the Continent that won the admiration and esteem of Florence Nightingale. It was they who were with her to care for the wounded on Crimean fields of battle. They were likewise inspiration for her work in organizing schools of nursing on her return to England.

The Quebec of 1639 brought the Sister Hospitallers of St. Augustine from France to open the first Canadian hospital. Three years later, Jeanne Mance, a lady of Old France filled with the spirit of the New, organized "Hotel Dieu" in Montreal and herself led in the nursing and training of the little staff. She is, therefore, hailed as Canada's first lay nurse. . . . The history of nursing in Canada during the past century wins the just admiration of Canadian people, and reflects honour on a noble past. . . .

And so, as the young nurse finds herself a part of a great tradition in Christian service, with her ability and her experience dedicated to a worthy cause, and her Alma Mater ready to fasten upon her snow-white gown the Maltese Cross of gold, she remembers the Motto of her school and, remembering, she reaches out her hand and heart to receive the White and Crimson symbol of her dedication. She has become a NURSE.

The Congregation of the Sisters of St. Ann was founded as a teaching Community, in the little town of Vaudreuil, one hundred years ago. The Motherhouse is now at Lachine, Quebec.

In 1858 the young Community embarked enthusiastically upon the missionary endeavour of the far West. In a little log cabin which still stands witness to pioneer days when the City of Victoria was but fifteen years removed from wilderness conditions, the nucleus of St. Joseph's Province was founded.

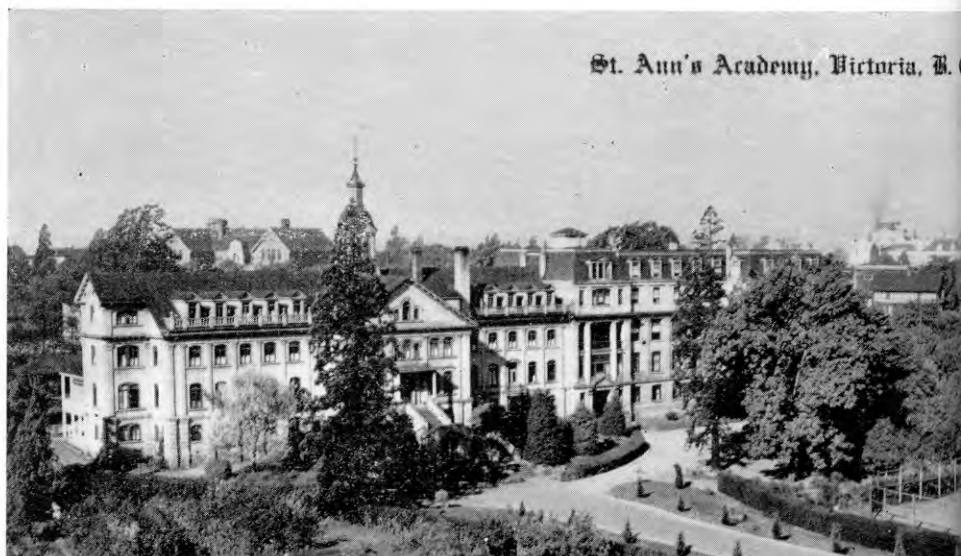
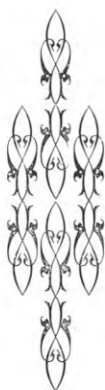
As years passed, St. Ann's Convent, the first to be established in the Canadian West, extended its facilities and increased its personnel to cover more fully the scholastic fields of education in British Columbia.

Saint Ann, Mother of the Immaculate One, who is "our life, our sweetness and our hope," had been chosen by the Foundress, Mother Mary Anne, to guide the destinies of her daughters in the fields of teaching and of service. Though this heavenly Patroness is invoked as "Admirable Model of Christian Teachers," she is also hailed as "Cure of the Sick," "Health of the Infirm" and "Comforter of the Afflicted."

It is not surprising, then that from the very first, the Sisters of St. Ann linked the two great works of teaching and nursing. The first four Sisters came in answer to the appeal of a missionary bishop, Most Reverend Modeste Demers, to do whatever tasks lay before them. They soon found that these included nursing the sick and caring for the afflicted. When the hospital

was opened, and later the school of nursing, and still later, Mount St. Mary Infirmary, for the care of the aged and infirm, the links of service were bound still closer, with Saint Joseph the Guardian of all.

But, as St. Ann's Convent has been the Mother of schools in the West, so has St. Joseph's been the Mother Institution of hospitals. To Juneau, Alaska, in 1886 and to Dawson, Y.T., in 1898, the work of nursing was first extended. And now, Campbell River's "Lourdes," Smithers' "Sacred Heart," Oliver's "St. Martin's" and in this Jubilee Year, Nelson's "Mount St. Francis" carry on the work the Foundress had in mind when the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Ann was recognized by Mother Church on a bright September morning in the year 1850.

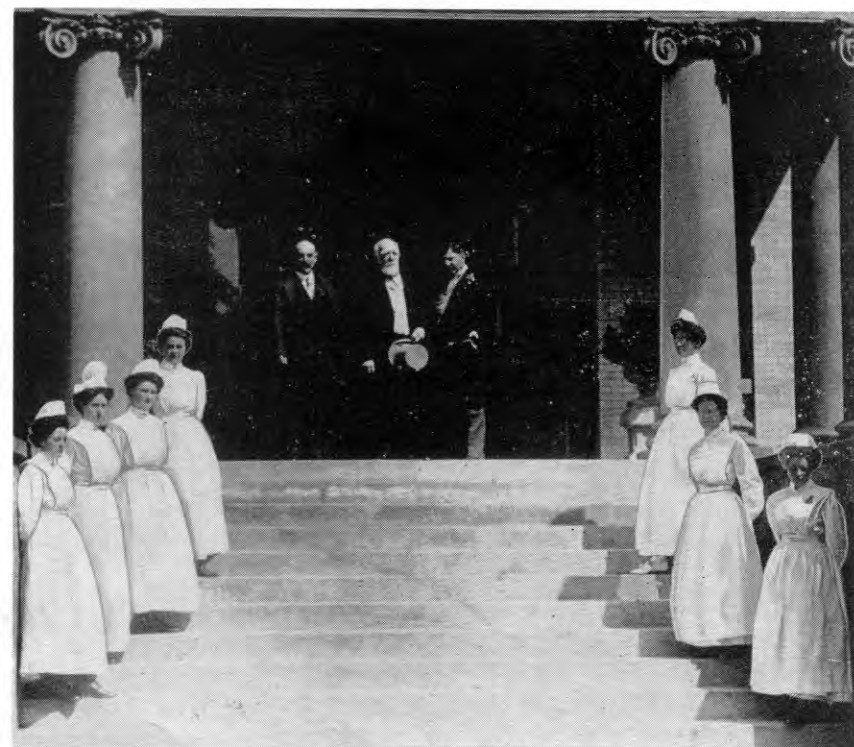

The Department of Radiology

Room 429 housed the first equipment in 1910 when radiographs were taken with a "gas" X-Ray bulb and an induction coil for excitation. In 1916 an adjoining room was taken over as a dark room. Dr. Geoffrey Jefferson, later to be the well-known London anatomist, used the apparatus for his research work, the findings of which were later published in the Mayo Journal. By 1919 its working space had become too cramped and four rooms on 2A with the sun room as office was the place of installation for the Victor Snook X-Ray apparatus and the Coolidge hot cathode X-Ray tube. It was at this time that the department began preparing students for qualification for registration through examinations set by the American Society of X-Ray Technicians.

Another ten years, and another major development. Up-to-date Deep and Superficial X-Ray machines as well as a cystoscopy table for X-Ray examinations, replaced the old and were set up at the present site in the newly erected wing. Separate fluoroscopic and radiographic units were installed and a portable X-Ray unit provided. In 1937 and 1938, the department was again modernized.

Among the radiologists serving the hospital in these years may be mentioned Dr. L. K. Poyntz, Dr. H. R. Nelson, Dr. B. R. Mooney, Dr. Andrew Turnbull, Dr. Kenneth Bibby, Dr. C. M. Henry and Dr. W. M. Carr.

Dr. Ivan C. Tchaperoff was appointed radiologist in 1946 and in 1948 he was joined by Dr. Roy Fraser. Meanwhile a new installation of X-Ray machines has been effected, making the department one of the most modern in equipment in Western Canada.

To keep pace with modern medical science and treatment, the Physiotherapy department functions separately, in a suite of rooms equipped for the purpose. A Clinical Photography Department under the direction of G. Francis Barker, R.P.S., marks a new feature of advancement, making the diagnosis and study of disease more effective and case histories and records more complete.

As a school of radiography the department has recently revised its curriculum to include lectures in physics, anatomy and physiology as well as theoretical and applied radiology. The school is conducted in conjunction with the School of Nursing. Graduates are qualified for registration in both Canada and the United States.

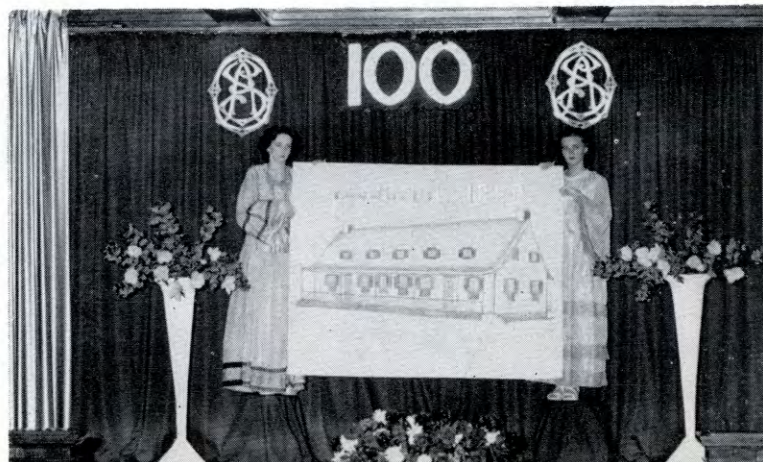


SCENE FROM THE COMMEMORATIVE PAGEANT PRESENTED AT THE ALUMNAE REUNION

The charming programme was a brief portrayal in musical pageantry of the Institute's development and the achievements of St. Joseph's Hospital and the School of Nursing in Victoria.



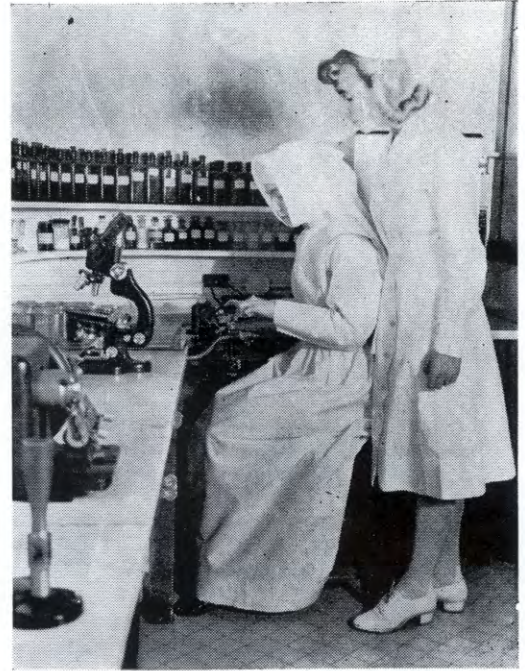
Department of Pathology and School of Medical Technology

St. Joseph's Department of Pathology was organized in 1917. In that year, when schemes for hospital standardization were in the air, Dr. J. H. Moore lent his scientific ability and keen spirit of leadership to the organization of laboratory facilities to meet current needs. He remained in charge for twenty years, while retaining his medical practice in the city.

Full-time directorship of the department was assigned to Douglas Brant Roxburgh, B.Sc., M.D., of Mayo Clinic, in 1938, but he was granted release for a period of war work in England.

From the first, the department, as a school of medical technology, offered apprenticeship training. Gradually a curriculum was evolved to meet examination requirements for registration under the American Society of Clinical Pathologists. When Canadian registration became available through the Canadian Society of Laboratory Technologists, in 1943, St. Joseph's adopted the double course whereby students may elect to qualify for registration in either or both Canada and the United States.

It is worthy of note that St. Joseph's Hospital School of Medical Technology was first among the schools of British Columbia to receive official recognition by the Canadian Medical Association Committee which, in 1944, made its initial investigation of training programmes for the Canadian Society of Laboratory Technologists.

Plans for a thoroughly modern department are a part of the major expansion programme for St. Joseph's Hospital. In the extensive lay-out, convenient sub-sections, fully equipped with aids for modern laboratory diagnosis, indicate the scientific up-to-dateness which has been the aim of the directors of the department and of St. Joseph's Hospital, down the years.

The first graduate of the department was Sister Mary Bertholde, R.N., M.T., 1923. Sister Mary Anne de Sion, R.N., M.T., 1928 and Sister Mary Claire in 1929 when Fannie Wright (Mrs. D. J. Sutherland) also graduated. Sister Mary Albert, R.N., M.T., was registered in 1935.

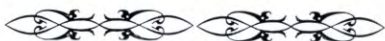

VALEDICTORY

“Life has Loveliness to Sell”

The hour of graduation is a charmed hour. For us,

*“Life has loveliness to sell . . .
All beautiful and splendid things,
Blue waves whitened on a cliff,
Climbing fire that sways and sings,
And children’s faces looking up
Holding wonder like a cup.*

*Life has loveliness to sell . . .
Music like a curve of gold,
Scent of pine trees in the rain,
Eyes that love you, arms that hold,
And for your spirit’s still delight,
Holy thoughts that star the night.”*

Three years ago, Class 1950 entered St. Joseph’s School of Nursing with ambitions pointing towards a special career. Some thought most of the white garb they would wear; some of the contacts with people and things; some weighed the social, or the monetary advantages; some were inspired by the service they would render humanity; all had joy in their hearts at the satisfaction they anticipated in the realization of their high profession of caring for the sick.

Were all so-gifted, we might have framed our ideals in rhythmic fashion as did Sara Teasdale in her little poem, “Barter.” But, poets we claim to be, at least in spirit, and so, grasping something of God’s beauty reflected in Nature, we all look to life, and to our profession in life, to give to us the “loveliness” we crave, if only we give what we should in return.

As we look back, as the sad days and the glad days of our school years crowd into vision,—as trial, success and failure . . . disappointment, satisfaction and surprise . . . contentment, desire and fulfilment . . . all blend in retrospect, we realize that life has been offering us “loveliness” as we went along, the loveliness that comes with the lights and shadows of our busy days. And so, with the poet, we conclude:

*“Spend all you have for loveliness,
Buy it, and never count the cost;
For one white shining hour of peace
Count many a year of strife well lost,
And . . . for a breath of ecstasy . . .
Give all you have been . . . or could be.”*

We may not take the poet’s words literally and think of this present hour of triumph, the culmination of effort and desire, as “our white and shining hour of peace.” Rather let us count our days at St. Joseph’s School of Nursing as personal adaptation to the “beautiful and splendid things” that come with a true vocation, truly fostered; let us see, through them, the value of all the “loveliness” that can be drawn from life if we so will it; let us determine never “to count the cost” when the fragrance and the beauty of life and the things of life are at stake. “For a breath of ecstasy, give all you have been or could be.”

As the hour draws near for parting and we realize that tomorrow will see us going forth from St. Joseph’s crowned with the laurels of Alma Mater and wearing her symbols of service, we rise to heights which the ideal of the Foundress proclaimed, and which her daughters have borne as a gleaming torch, through one hundred years. We go forth determined to “spend all we have for loveliness,” and, buying it, never to count the cost, confident that the “breath of ecstasy” that comes with “giving” will brighten and direct our ways.

But now we give thanks, heartfelt and sincere to St. Joseph’s School of Nursing, and to the doctors, supervisors, and all who have in any way led us to this “shining hour.” In this spirit of thanksgiving and rejoicing, Class 1950 recites the Florence Nightingale Pledge:



“I solemnly pledge myself before God and in the presence of this assembly to pass my life in purity and to practice my profession faithfully. I will abstain from whatever is deleterious and mischievous and will not take, nor knowingly administer, any harmful drug. I will do all in my power to elevate the standard of my profession, and will hold in confidence all personal matters committed to my keeping, and all family affairs coming to my knowledge in the practice of my calling. With loyalty will I endeavour to aid the physician in his work and devote myself to the welfare of those committed to my care.”

St. Joseph's Nurses Organize Alumnae

From the Victoria Daily Colonist, May 21, 1920.

"The greatest enthusiasm was displayed by the fifty graduate nurses who assembled at St. Joseph's Hospital last evening on the invitation of Sister Mary Mark, Superior, to form an alumnae association. The plan was generally approved and the Alumnae Association of St. Joseph's Hospital Training School for Nurses was organized before the meeting was long in session. Sister Superior presided at the commencement of the proceedings and briefly outlined the aims of the proposed organization.

"Sister Mary Bridget, associated with St. Joseph's Hospital since it was opened in 1876, either as nurse or as superior, was unanimously elected honorary president. Sister Mary Anna, directress, Sister Mary Alfreda, Sister Mary Peter, Sister Mary Patrick, Sister Mary Armenia and Sister Mary Gregory were made honorary members.

"Amid profound silence, expressive of the deep respect in which she was held by all the nurses, the portrait of Sister Mary Gertrude, first superintendent and instructor of nurses, 1900-1913, was unveiled by the president, Miss Ethel Saunders, the entire assembly standing during the impressive ceremony.

"Before the meeting closed the members accorded a hearty vote of thanks to Sister Mary Anna and the other sisters of the training school staff, for their wholehearted interest and co-operation in inaugurating the association."

Since 1943, a Valentine and a Hallowe'en Party at the Nurses' Residence.

Candy sent at Christmas to St. Joseph's nurses in the Forces during the war. Gifts of candy and flowers to Nurses when ill in the Hospitals.

Since 1944, the Mary Thompson Memorial Fund for the relief of sick or needy members.

A double room furnished in C section of hospital as a Student Nurses' Infirmary, in honor of Sister Mary Gertrude and Sister Mary Anna.

A patient's room in St. Joseph's Villa, a bedroom and a Graduate Nurses' sitting room in the Nurses' Residence, and a sitting room for private duty nurses in the Hospital.

An anaesthetic machine for the Surgery (1925).

Electric clock and instruments, charts and demonstration equipment for the class-rooms, also educational films and a radio phonograph, linoleum, sewing machine, steam iron and ironing board, frigidaire, ice water container and many other things.

A shower was held for the Staff of St. Mary's Hospital, Dawson, Y.T., who lost everything in the disastrous fire of January 10th, 1950. Aid was also given to a member of the Alumnae, who had lost everything in the fire.

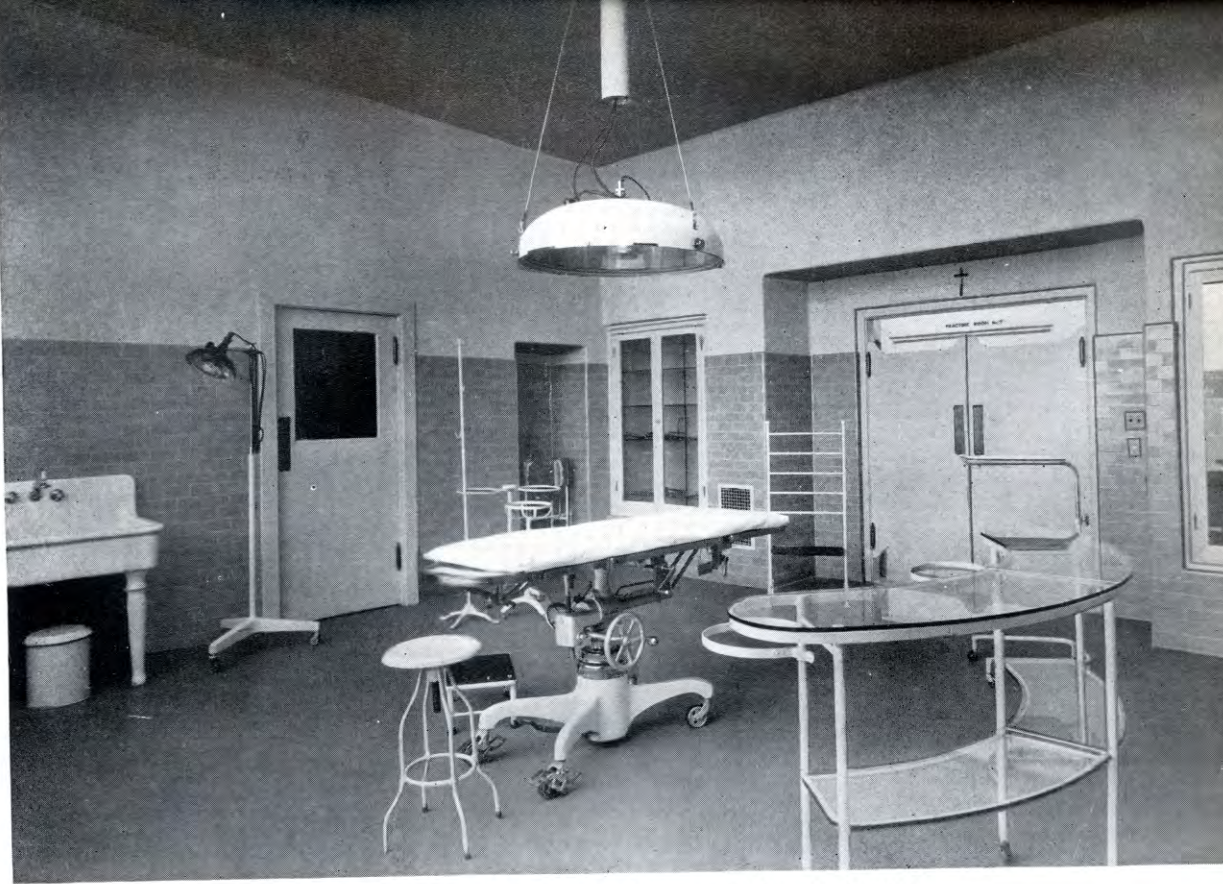

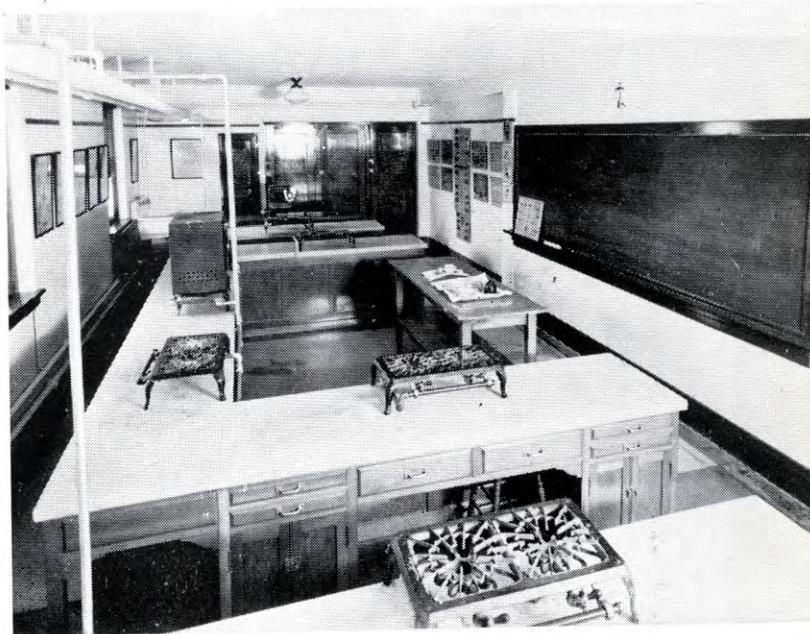

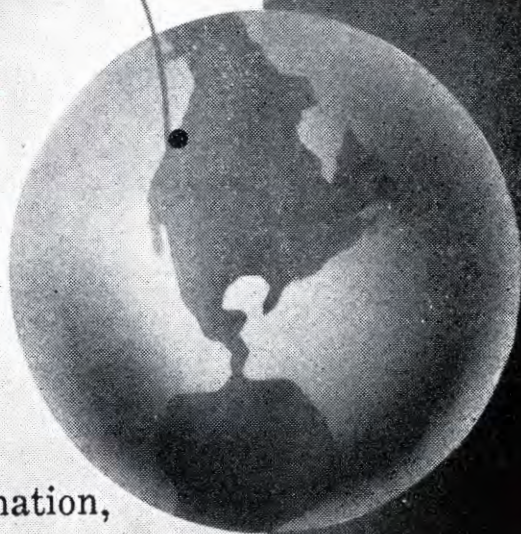

On Your Golden Jubilee

To Victoria in 1858

Early missionaries to the North Pacific Coast travelled from Eastern Canada by Hudson's Bay Company Fur Brigade. By canoe and portage they threaded the waterways across the prairies, to the foothills of the Rockies, then by horses and mules in cavalcade, through Yellowhead Pass to the headwaters of the Columbia, and down its treacherous course by barge, to Fort Vancouver. Father Modeste Demers, afterwards first bishop of the whole region now known as British Columbia and Alaska, and Father Norbert J. Blanchet, first Archbishop of the Oregon Territory, travelled this way in 1838.

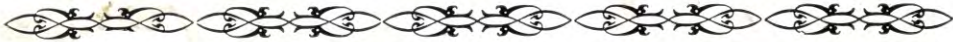
Alternatives to the land route were the long passage around Cape Horn, or, especially after the building of a railway across the Isthmus, by Panama. The first four Sisters of St. Ann coming to Victoria in 1858 took the latter route, in company with Bishop Demers and other missionaries for the Vancouver Island Diocese. The story of their journey fascinates in these days of anticipated "jet" travel . . . seven hours from Vancouver to Montreal. The missionaries were on the way almost two months.

By train from Montreal at noon, April 14th, the party arrived in New York at 7 p.m. on the 15th. Two days later they sailed on the "Philadelphia" for Havana and there, on account of a yellow fever threat, were transferred to the "Grenada" without going on shore. At Aspinwall they boarded the train for the Pacific side of the Isthmus, on May 1st.

There they were to take passage on the "John Ellis Stevens" for Victoria with 1700 gold seekers hurrying to the new-found fields of the Fraser and the Cariboo.

Waiting for two hours in the broiling sun for a chance to board the tender carrying passengers to the ship, and fearing that accommodations on board would be exhausted before his party could arrive, Bishop Demers engaged the services of some husky mulattoes to carry his party out to a boat and row them to the ship. The Bishop and the Fathers took the lead, but when it came to the Sisters it was not so easy. Nothing could be done about it though, and gathering up their skirts they mounted the bare black shoulders of their carriers, and clinging desperately they were deposited safely in the boat. The charge for Sister Mary Angele was double because, being conscious of her weight, she was not easily pleased with a carrier!

The vessel was crowded, the ship's boilers none too good, but the weather was fine and the "John Ellis Stevens" discharged its passengers at San Francisco on the 14th of May. Two more changes of ship brought the missionary party to Victoria on Saturday, June 5th, on board the "Seabird". The following day the Sisters began the work for which they had left their Motherhouse almost two months earlier. Their residence was a log cabin on the skirts of Beacon Hill Park. From such modest beginnings developed the schools and hospitals conducted by the Sisters of St. Ann, in British Columbia, Alaska and Yukon Territory.
