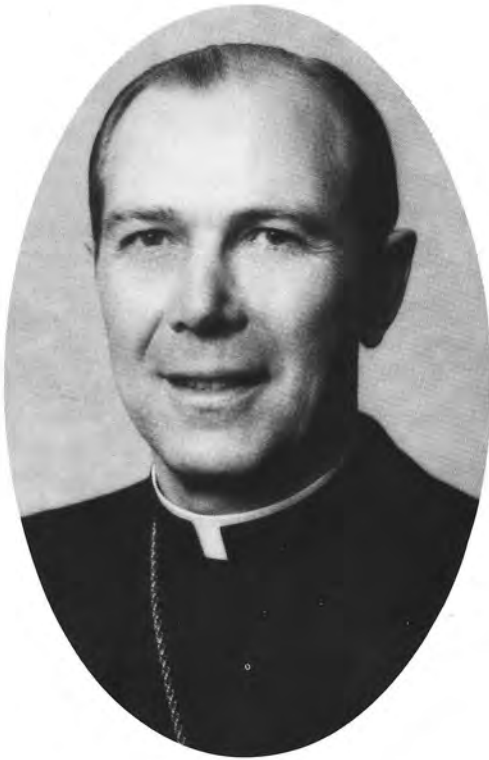
The Florence Nightingale Pledge

EARLY HISTORY OF MISERICORDIA HOSPITAL

In 1794 Marie Rose Codron was born at Lavaltrie, Quebec. She was of faithful Catholic parentage.

She married her childhood playmate Jean Marie Jette at age 17. Her husband died leaving her with six children. She withdrew herself from the world and began a life of devotion to the needy and weak. She began by devoting her time, house and wealth to fallen girls, the exiles of society.

In 1845 the Archbishop suggested she form a community where these poor, young, unfortunate girls would find refuge and spiritual help.

In a short time the Misericordia Community had its beginning. "Mother of Nativity" died April 5th, 1864. But the modest community had its beginning for the betterment of these shunned girls under the care and guidance of the sisters of Misericordia.



1898

In 1898 four sisters of Misericordia journeyed from Montreal to Winnipeg to open a Mission Caring for unwed mothers and fatherless children. The sisters first settled in a small dwelling in St. Boniface. Shortly after they opened their first home on Broadway Avenue.

In 1899 the sisters signed a contract for the building of a new Misericordia Hospital where the present hospital stands. The first building was completed in 1900.





In 1907 an addition was built.
 In 1915 the older Sherbrook and Maryland still existing today were constructed.

In 1916 the Misericordia General Hospital School of Nursing had its inauguration offering a diploma in nursing. The first class graduated in 1918. In 1927 a new north wing was added and increased bed capacity to 225.

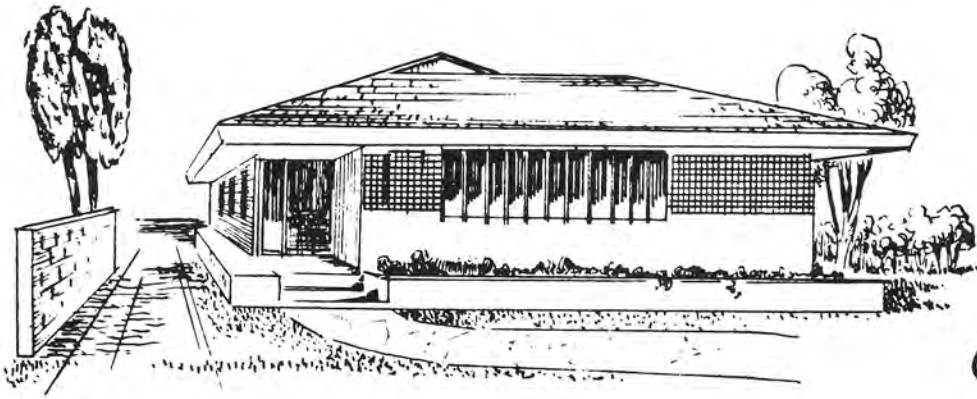


In 1950 the Maryland wing was added bringing the bed count to 305.

1957 completion of the Cornish wing brought the Misericordia General Hospital to its present capacity of 409 beds and 53 bassinets.

In 1971 the Riverview annex was added to provide the most up to date Emergency and Intensive Care Unit.

VILLA ROSA

The Sisters of Misericorde came to Winnipeg in 1898 specifically to care for young women pregnant and alone. They have provided shelter and nurturing care in a variety of settings through the years, first in the Misericordia Hospital site up until 1958 when the Hospital Commission came into effect. At that time, the girls moved to 27-29 Sherbrook, where we were waiting for the new residence called Villa Rosa.

In 1965, the present residence at 784 Wolseley Avenue was opened. Here the mother-to-be can continue her education, receiving full scholastic credits, including life skills. Prenatal medical care and prenatal classes, including Lamaze are provided.

Other areas of programming cover classes in self-awareness, human growth and development, child care, communication and family relationships, awareness of cultural differences, individual and family counselling.

Recreation is not overlooked; there is swimming courtesy M.G.H., exercise and relaxation for fun and fitness. Crafts such as sewing, knitting, crocheting, ceramics and pottery are taught and cooking lessons are available.

Post-natally, mothers may now return to Villa Rosa with their infants. This enables the new mother to adjust to her role as a parent and complete her plans to move into her new environment.

On-going contact is maintained through support groups for moms and babes and for those who have chosen not to parent.

SCHOOL OF NURSING

1916-1984

The Misericordia General Hospital School of Nursing has developed steadily since inauguration in 1916 with maintenance of required standards for accreditation. Trends in nursing have changed considerably through the years and have resulted in completely new concepts for education of nurses who will be able to provide effective nursing care.

Today, our school continues to offer an academic program which is consistent with current educational advances. Instruction is provided by a well-qualified faculty.

Consistent with the changes in nursing, our curriculum has changed considerably since the inception of our School. In the late twenties, the curriculum - based on a medical model - consisted of the following subjects:

Today, we are once again revising our curriculum in accordance with the educational advances in nursing, and our new curriculum is based on a nursing conceptual framework, which is in keeping with the registration examinations, which consist of four integrated papers as opposed to the five papers based on separate subjects as previously written. Today's curriculum consists of the following topics:

One notable change is the inclusion of four university credit subjects in the current curriculum. This has been done to assist graduates of our program make a smoother transition into the B.N. program in accordance with the mandate that by the year 2000, the entry into practise will be a B.N. degree.

Teaching techniques have also undergone change. Lectures are now given by nurses instead of doctors, and small discussion groups are conducted frequently.

Throughout the years, the length of the program has also changed. Originally a three-year program, approval was received in 1969 to initiate a two-year program. Transition was gradual with two classes graduating in 1970 instead of one. Class 1970A, graduates of a two and one half year course, graduated in January, while 1970B graduated in June. It was this year that the first group of R.P.N.'s, who challenged the first year of the program, graduated. It was also in 1970 that L.P.N.'s were given the opportunity to challenge, and this "challenge" program for R.P.N.'s and L.P.N.'s continued until 1978 when it was phased out because of a change in the curriculum.

Another change that has occurred over the years is the number of classes being admitted each year. Until 1964, two classes had been admitted per year with one joint graduation being held, but since that date, only one class per year, consisting of approximately eighty students each has been admitted. To date, 2,617 (excluding Class 1984) nurses have graduated from our school, and can be found spread around the world.

Student populations have also changed throughout the years. Now, more mature students with established homes, as well as those who are changing careers, are entering the program. Male students are now a common sight around the school with each class having three or four males, which is a big difference from the time Walter Bohonis, our first male graduate, was studying nursing in 1961.

The physical location of the school has also changed. Classrooms and offices have changed from the main floor, Sherbrook wing, to the main floor, Wolseley East wing to their present location in the Wolseley West wing. In 1970, in conjunction with the need for expanded office space for some hospital divisions, and our own need for increased working areas, we moved to the former residence areas in the Wolseley West wing. School of Nursing administrative offices are now located on the fourth floor, Wolseley West, while teachers' offices are on the fifth floor and across the street in the residence. The demonstration laboratory, audio-visual rooms, complete with individual study carrels, and the demonstration room teacher's office, are now located on the sixth floor. Some of you will recognize that the demonstration lab has been located in various areas such as Wolseley 2 East, the basement and now sixth floor. As a matter of fact, at one point in time, during the late 1960's, the demonstration lab was thought to be no longer necessary so it was abolished, but then in 1977, it was re-established with one teacher being responsible to oversee all skills taught. Today, it is an important part of the learning environment for students.

Throughout the years, the physical location of classrooms has changed greatly: Sherbrook - main floor, Wolseley East - main floor, second floor - Wolseley 2 East, and now, besides the classroom on the sixth floor, the auditorium and the upper lounge are also used. Seminar rooms for small group work are located throughout the Wolseley West wing as well as in several areas in residence.

Residence accommodation for students has changed greatly throughout the years. The old residences on Sherbrook Street have given way to a paved parking lot for the use of staff and visitors, while the rooms in the Wolseley West wing that were once used by students, have given way to the School of Nursing administrative offices and

medical laboratory offices. Those students now requesting residence accommodation are housed in a six-storey modern building on Wolseley Avenue, which was opened in 1963, having been built around a stately elm tree which Mother St. Odilon guarded during construction. Students are no longer required to live in residence and because of the changing student population, ie. more married students, both male and female, it was found that less accommodation was required, and therefore, the one building sufficed.

Over the years, the graduation ceremonies have had many venues: the concert hall of the old Winnipeg auditorium, now the Provincial Archives Building; the Playhouse Theatre; the Hospital auditorium; Manitoba Centennial Centre; and more latterly, the Concert Hall of St. Mary's Academy. Despite where it is held, it is still a very moving experience as the curtains open to reveal "young ladies and men all dressed in white with red roses". Many of the traditions associated with graduation still exist, including the breakfast of steak and eggs that is held immediately following mass on graduation day.

So as you see, many changes have taken place in the School since its inception in 1916, and I am sure more changes are yet to come, which is consistent with growth.

WE WILL REMEMBER - ALWAYS

The Reverend Sister Ste Candide, R.N., s.m., was our Director of Nursing for nine years during the forties. Every nurse, student or graduate, who passed through the portals of the Misericordia Hospital during her tenure remember with love and gratitude, her kindness, her gentle guidance, her readiness to listen and help with the inevitable daily problems that arose.

She was indeed a beloved friend to all, and particularly to me, who worked closely with her during all those years. It was a privilege to name my only daughter, Candide, after my dear friend and colleague.

Sister St. Candide died March, 1983. A Mass was held in the hospital Chapel in June, 1983 and was well attended by her Graduates. Her name sake Candide Copeland Allen read the Eulogy.

MOTHER ST. ODILON

In 1952 she arrived from the United States to become Director of Nursing Service and Faculty. Her Assistant was Miss Marie La Croix and later Helen (Ferrara) Kelly. Mother St. Odilon was extremely kind and approachable. The Hospital functioned well under her keen pride and leadership. As a leader she got involved in Civic affairs.

Mother St. Odilon had a warm caring personality, she never passed by a patient in need. She had a good rapport with the Doctor's *and the Hospital functioned well under her leadership despite the changing times.* Mother St. Odilon often worked a sixteen hour day. Busy, but she was always available. Ever faithful to her religious ethics, she personally interviewed each student, their families and saw to their personal needs.

During her tenure she had major surgery, one week prior to a graduating class. On her third post-op day, Miss J. Grose and Mrs. H. Kelly wheeled her by stretcher to the school auditorium to “check on her graduates” and supervise the “pledge” and the singing of the school song. On graduation day, Miss Grose and Mrs. Kelly her assistants were sent to the Playhouse to make sure the graduates' uniforms were perfect and they carried their roses the right way. A tape was sent and played extending her congratulations to the graduates. The girls on returning one by one visited her and presented roses to her.

Many were saddened by Sister's departure in 1966. But this was not the end of her nursing career. She first went to New York and then to Oak Park, Chicago where she is presently nursing. (See picture of tree - page .)

EARLY ONE YEAR MATERNITY GRADUATES

First wings of the Misericordia Hospital were opened for obstetrical patients only about 1900 and 1907 with 140 beds. Few pictures and records are readily available here at this time. But through the courtesy of relatives we treasure these few details.

1910

FLORENCE LYS TIMMINS worked at the hospital and in Winnipeg. She was known to us as an active lady on nearby Furby Street until her demise in her nineties in August 1975. Nursed for 9 years - in those days of home delivery - not losing one baby. Her daughter was an R.N. and her granddaughter is an R.N.



1915

MILDRED MURPHY GRIER wrote that she finished her training in April 1915 and went straight to work. They did not graduate as a class but as individuals in a year and received their pin and diploma as they completed their courses. She was appointed a supervisor and admitted the First Male patient in the fall of 1916.

Mother Mary Immaculate was Mistress of Nurses and Miss Joanna Harty was their R.N. head nurse until she later became Lady Superintendent.

Their pins were the same as the graduates except they had no year at the top of the pin.

BRIEF HISTORY OF THE MISERICORDIA HOSPITAL SCHOOL OF NURSING ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Prior to 1924, the first five three year classes of nurses namely 1918-1920-1921-1922 and 1923 did not have graduation exercises. The first ceremony was held in 1924 at St. Mary's Academy. Right about that time a small but enthusiastic group of nurses had met on several occasions and decided that they should form an Alumnae Association to further the interests of the graduates. And after researching the pros and cons of other already formed organizations they met again in June 1925 to elect officers.

Miss Joanna Harty - Lady Superintendent and Miss Georgina E. Thompson were co-founders of the Association assisted by Miss Aulie Gunn. Miss Thompson became the first president and Miss Jane Wells the secretary.

The objectives of the association were to be:

1. To add professional dignity to the standing of the graduates of the Misericordia Hospital.
2. To promote the best interests of the nurses and to maintain unity of feeling and understanding among the graduates.
3. To give aid and comfort to any member in case of distress or illness.



In June 1926 - the bylaws were approved and Hignell Printers made up one hundred and sixty-six copies and all members were issued one. In the beginning the membership grew until in the early thirties times were difficult and interest lagged. But this period passed and after a period of time when no meetings were held some loyal supporters stimulated interest and the alumnae has remained a progressively growing body ever since.

The main interests are the Christmas Party and the Annual June dinner. While attendance at the in between meetings now is not too great, when the need is there the nurses are capable of arranging some interesting functions and to raise funds.

One of the interest holding projects in the Newsletter which was formerly the Bulletin. The out-of-towners seem to enjoy the contact with their Alumnae.

To name a few of the accomplishments of the Association from its beginning it has provided assistance in many ways both to their nurses - students and other charitable organizations.

1. In the depression years - a nurses' Unemployment Fund was established whereby nurses in need could borrow and pay back when able to do or.

2. There was also a sick nurses' fund where the nurses would take care of one another at a reduced rate until they were called to work themselves.
3. Parcels were sent to overseas nurses and many hours were given helping to make dressing bundles etc.
4. The alumnae provided funds for the private duty nurses' locker room, furniture and necessities and lockers for the nurses.
5. Funds to student nurses' yearbooks on request.
6. Donations to the Flood Relief Fund were given.
7. Honor roll for those in the services established.
8. A scholarship or medal provided for recipients at graduation time.
9. Funds were provided to assist ill and needy nurses.
10. Graduating classes were given a dinner and dance but now discontinued.
11. Donation to assist a student attending a Biennial convention.
12. Books given for the student nurse library.

13. Memorial plaques for deceased members put in the lobby of the Nurses Residence.
14. Providing of Honorary Life-memberships for graduating classes on their fiftieth anniversaries.
15. Drapes, curtains and chairs for auditorium.

With its growing strength and importance through good times and not so good, the organization has never lost sight of the vision and objectives with which it began.

The interest and support of all our members is invaluable to those in the city.

The convenors, Edith Shouldice McLaren and Velma Cockerill McCulloch were to be congratulated for the huge success of the project. Models included two alumnae members, Margaret Hatcher Chamick and Adene McGill Clay. Pianist was Miss Kay Bowyer accompanied by Mr. Eddy Walker.

The Alumnae Building Fund Committee undertook to pay for all the draperies and curtains on the stage, two tables and twenty blue and gold padded armchairs to a cost of \$2,150.00. The fashion show proceeds marked a down payment and an appeal was sent to all graduates for donations.

The fact that you didn't have the necessary dime was no deterrent. He never said "no" to anyone. He had a unique accounting system, a piece of cardboard under the counter and each customer entered their own charges. When you got your money allowance from home, your first obligation was to pay up at Sam's.

Many great decisions were made over a coffee at the "Queen's Cafe." Many romances flourished there.

"Thou shalt not wear thy uniform or any part there of at Sam's." An unwritten but well understood law in the residence. How many class late leaves were forfeited because of an offender. This restaurant was Sam's life and he enjoyed doing a little extra for the nurses, as they were very important to him. He and Mrs. Sam were always there to listen to our problems and encourage us to fight on. For some of us away from home for the first time it was a life saver.

Their children Raffelina, Frank and Rosemary were very much a part of it all. Frank married Magdalen Bednarek, a 1955 Misericordia graduate.

Sam died March 19, 1961.

Herta left for Panama in 1972, and has been ministering to the needs of the Chocoe Indians, a tribe that lives in the jungle. With a local doctor, Herta has been teaching young native people in first aid and elementary nursing. As well, Herta assists at a Mission Centre in Panama city, doing biblical teaching and counselling.

Herta also instructs newly arrived missionaries in the tribal languages, and orientates them to their new responsibilities.

Herta's health has been failing for some years, and she plans to retire in mid 1984.

Sister Maria du Rosaire (Maria Dupont) is a graduate of Class 1964A.

Many of us will remember the interesting presentation given by Margaret at an Alumnae Meeting in November 1958, detailing her nursing service in Formosa (now Taiwan) from 1954-1958. Margaret went to Formosa under the auspices of the Mennonite Central Committee, an organization consisting of all Mennonite churches in Canada and the U.S., for purposes of providing relief and rehabilitation after war or natural disasters, and supplying skilled personnel for teaching and assistance in underdeveloped countries.

In conjunction with the Doctor who was there, Margaret helped to plan, design and supervise the construction of a new hospital building. Margaret served as chief anesthetist at surgery. In addition, Margaret implemented a nurses' training program, and the first class graduated shortly before she returned to Canada, after three and one half years abroad. Margaret had planned to take a post-graduate course in Anesthesia, but ill health curtailed this plan. She underwent major surgery and after a time returned to M.G.H., and worked as general duty nurse and later on the Intravenous Team. In 1960 Margaret held the position of Assistant Science Instructress at the School of Nursing, Winnipeg General Hospital.

We are sad to report that Margaret passed away on October 30, 1976, after a lengthy illness.

MISS MARY STOBBE

Miss Mary Stobbe graduated in 1948.

The first Honorary Life Membership in the Misericordia Hospital School of Nursing Alumni Association was presented to Miss Georgina E. Thompson, class of 1922 - who was the first President and Co-Founder of the Alumnae. As well this award was given on a meritorious basis as she had given much of herself in helping to promote the best possible professional standings and assistance for our graduates and was herself an instructress for many years and served as alumnae president for five terms. Mrs. Alva Erickson Gardiner was president and the presentation was made by Mrs. Irene Thompson Stuart class of 1926.

In June 1974 when the Alumnae celebrated with a "Home Coming" - its Fiftieth Anniversary of its founding at the International Inn, three Life Memberships from the years 1918-1924 were given to mark the special occasion. They were awarded to Winnie Sinclair 1918 wearing a 1919 pin - Flora Breton 1922 and Sarah MacDougall 1924.

Then each year since 1925 the Alumnae has honored each class on their 50th Anniversary since graduation. Certificates are presented to those able to attend at the Annual June dinner, which is given complimentary for that time.

Owing to the interest of the Association as a special project and the appreciation of the recipients, these Life Memberships will continue to be given as long as circumstances within the alumnae permit. RONALD McDONALD HOUSE

In 1950 when a rural family was told that their child had leukemia --- they simply kept the child "comfortable" - and prayed. Barely 10% of the diagnosed children survived.

In 1978 when a rural family was told that their child had leukemia --- they travelled to Winnipeg for treatment - and suffered financial stresses in addition to loneliness and emotional strain while they waited here for months, undergoing treatment until remission was achieved. The survival rate of leukemia children had climbed to 50%.

As we glimpse into the (not so distant) future - the summer of 1984 --- when they tell a rural family that their child has leukemia - the emotional trauma will be the same, and they'll still pray. But because of the empathy, the caring and the sharing of special people like the Misericordia Nurses Alumnae who have donated \$500.00 and the Misericordia Class of 1966 who donated \$740.00, there will be a "home away from home" for these families. Your donations have helped to build our 14 bedroom Ronald McDonald House, a place of supportive refuge for rural families whose children come to Winnipeg for leukemia or other cancer treatment.

Drive by the corner of Kate and Bannatyne and see the house that's filled with love and hope. (Our children's survival rate is now about 65%.) It's the most beautiful house in town and YOU'VE helped to prove it's the "house that love built."

Agnes W. Wilkie



Mrs. Amy Stigant Botsford

Agnes W. Wilkie graduated from the Misericordia Hospital, Winnipeg in 1927. After dedicating many years of her life to the care of others, she answered her Country's call early and enlisted in the Navy.

She was appointed to the Royal Canadian Naval Hospital at St. John's Newfoundland where she became Assistant Matron. She had just completed her first leave as a Naval Nursing Sister with a visit to her parents at Carman, Manitoba when tragedy struck.

Agnes lost her life when the "S.S. Caribou", Newfoundlands' Ferry Ship was sunk by an enemy submarine in the Cabot Strait, October 14th, 1942, early in the morning. She and a hospital companion kept together clinging to a raft for several hours when Agnes lost consciousness and slipped away. Another Misericordia General Hospital graduate Olga Shandro Malones' husband took part in the rescue of the survivors.

Agnes Wilkie was the first Naval Nursing Sister to make the supreme sacrifice and was laid to rest in St. John's Mount Pleasant Cemetery with full naval honors. Medical Officers and nurses from all other services, including those of the U.S.A. were in attendance.

In 1945 the Nursing Sisters of Stadacona named their new residence "The Wilkie House" in honor and memory of Agnes.

On May 6th, 1953 at the Graduation Exercises of the Misericordia Hospital School of Nursing, the Agnes Wilkie Memorial Medal for General Proficiency was presented for the first time. Dr. Jack McKenty who was an interne when Agnes was a nurse in training established this lasting memorial to a fine woman and an excellent nurse.

Her picture hangs in the lobby of our newest nurses' residence as a lasting tribute to one of our graduates.

Last fall one of our nurses Mrs. Amy Stigant Botsford of Toronto attended her son's wedding and he took her to St. Johns Newfoundland to see Agnes' grave site. It is a very old well kept cemetery with mostly military graves. Amy's daughter-in-law's uncle was one of the survivors and he recalled the details of that sad day.

A new ship for C.N. Marione's Atlantic Gulf Service across the Cabot Strait, the Islands' lifeline to the North American mainland, is being built and will be named "Caribou" in honor of the ill-fated first S.S. Caribou.

AUXILIARY TO MISERICORDIA HOSPITAL

The auxiliary to Misericordia Hospital was formed in 1952 when Sister Superior St. Bertha called together eleven women. The first meeting was on November 5th. A president was elected and a constitution drawn up with the purpose "Service and Assistance to the Patient and Hospital". From these small beginnings came our present organization with a membership of 150.

In 1957 a gift shop was opened after research of other ventures in other hospitals, and a loan of \$400.00 from the auxiliary general account. A mobile cart was also

started.

Other projects to follow, in quick succession were baby pictures, t.v. rentals, annual teas, bazaars, all fund raisers.

Volunteers are involved with service to patients, flower and mail, library, and newspaper delivery, hydro therapy. Special projects are undertaken as requested to fill certain needs.

A name change was effected at the time of men coming on stream as members, which meant that "ladies" was dropped from our title.

In November 1977, the auxiliary celebrated twenty-five years of service by being honored by the administrator of the hospital to a dinner and presentation of a plaque, which now hangs in the waiting lounge at the hospital entrance.

We are particularly proud of the junior volunteers, a group made up of students of high school, both male and female. They take their work seriously and fit well into the schedule of work given them to do. It is a great training opportunity for them. By the notable increase of size in the donation given yearly to the hospital it is evident that the membership is fully aware of its purpose. The donation of \$60,000 given last June for needed equipment was done so with great pride.





LIFE IN RESIDENCE Nora Daly Harvey / 1945

For most of us, the old house, or the attached Cornish Court on Sherbrook Street, was our first 'home away from home'. It was a great adventure, but fell short on the freedom usually associated with leaving the parental nest.

DOCTOR - "Well, my good man, have you any temperature this morning?"

PATIENT - "No, the nurse took it."

A kitchen, a bedroom, or the living room of a former suite was where we, as Probies, emptied the precious contents of trunks or suitcases. The knick-knacks and photographs served as reminders of home. The beds rolled toward the centre, cockroaches poked their ugly heads through the drains, and mice had to be removed from traps upon occasion. The only men, allowed beyond the parlor, were those whose task involved repairing the numerous breakdowns in the heating system. We wondered if there really were that many! The basement contained many rooms and some important equipment. There were facilities for washing, and the windows in that room could, when necessary, and if one had the nerve, be used for illicit exits and entries. There was a little room where toast was made which was probably used more than any other spot in the building. Our freshly laundered and starched uniforms could be picked up in another corner. Beside the office, a small library was available for those whose study habits were well developed. The parlor was quaint, easily watched, and filled with adornments made by the deft fingers of the Sisters.

We were subjected to the watchful eye of Mrs. Klaus, who, 'for our own good', made sure that we were in at the proper times. She had to stay up an extra hour and a half on 'late leave nights', and an extra hour on the alternate Wednesdays, when those who were unfortunate enough to be working the week before, received a shortened late leave. We wondered about justice in those days too. Never to be forgotten, was the very handicapped little lady, who was often on evening duty. As she shuffled around on her rounds she gave ample warning of her approach and provided every erring soul an opportunity to be safely tucked into bed when her head appeared at the door. Although, I am sure there was no malice intended, she was the butt of many 'take-offs' by those whose talents lay in that direction.

Looking back to those very exciting days with eyes that are now thirty nine years older, the highlight of the experience would certainly still be focused on the many wonderful relationships formed by living together in such close quarters. Students today are shortchanged by missing that experience. There were frustrations and tears and colds that refused to produce temperatures. But these things were all offset by many many laughs.

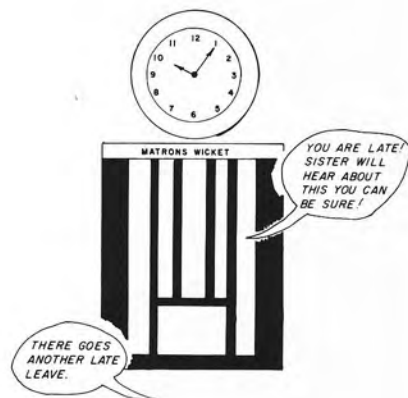

BLIZZARD HITS WINNIPEG MARCH 4TH, 1966

Winnipeg City paralyzed for transportation for 24 hours - Snowplows worked desperately to open main thoroughfares, so some services could be restored to emergency centres such as hospitals, food stores, police departments, fire departments etc.

In absence of the Director, (Mrs.) Helen Kelly was in charge of nursing service, she was transported to the Hospital in a Ski-doo driven by her next door neighbour Vern Hellofs. She was assisted by Helen Beath who took the last running bus at 7:00 a.m. down Portage and walked the remaining distance to the hospital. Other day staff courageously made it in. Night staff remained on duty, until such time replacement was available, other departments did likewise.

Patient care was extremely good. Doctors unable to leave the hospital were on hand. Everyone worked many extra hours, the rapport between all departments was exceptionally good. In spite of our winter elements everyone seemed happy and content that they were able to contribute and share their help in this event. Staff who reported were given an extra day off. It was an experience that alerted the city to be prepared for further emergencies.

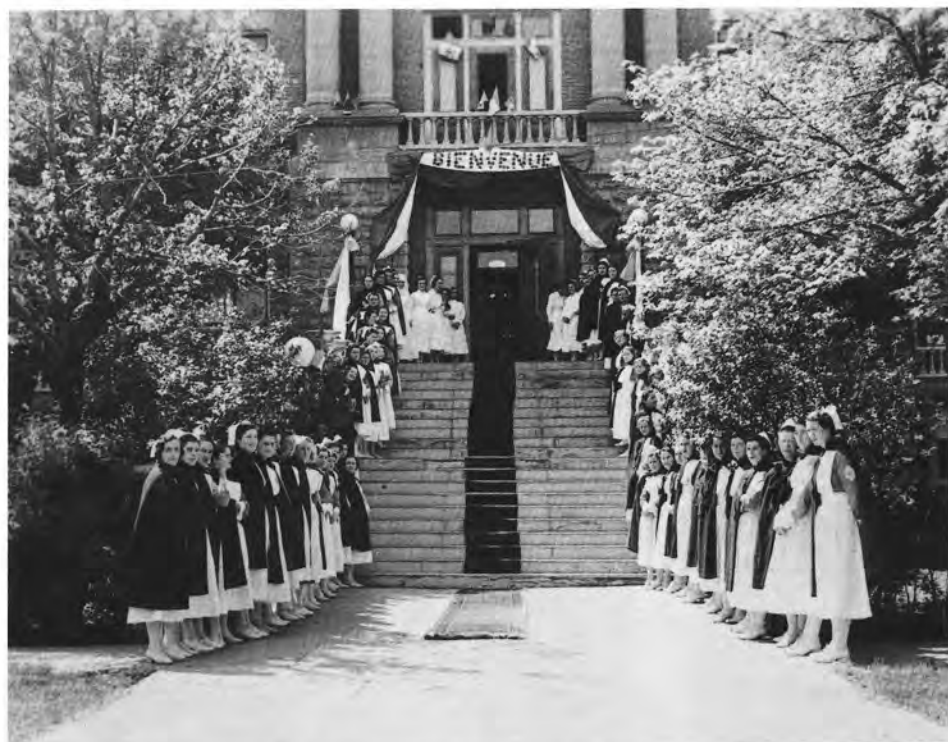

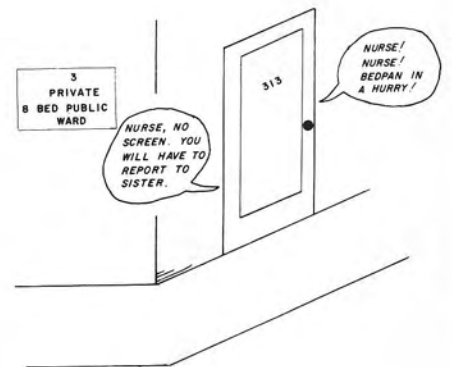




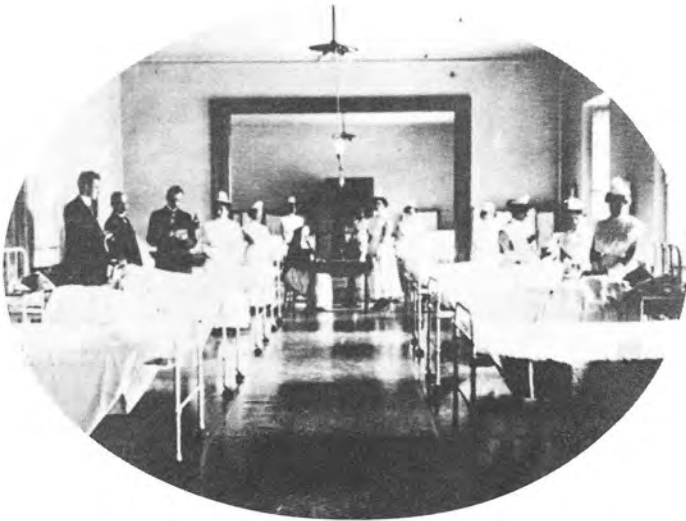

THE NURSERY

Someone said to me "You have spent the best years of your life here in the Nursery." I thought about that and replied "Everyone spends these years somewhere and what better place than the Nursery."

The Nursery and post partum were managed jointly by one head nurse until 1943. Erna Bauman was the first head nurse in the Nursery. I worked here as head nurse from 1943-1983 with a few years off from full time when our children were born.

There have been many changes over these years. The census has decreased from the wartime baby boom to a peacetime with family planning. The hospital stay has changed from a mandatory 10 days to 3-4 days. No longer do we sew an abdominal band to protect the cord. A common worktable for bathing and dressing has long since been taboo. Babies are not carried to their mothers at scheduled feeding times.

There is no steamy formula room now. No washing and boiling of bottles - no boiling (and burning) of nipples.

Proctoclysis have long since given over to intravenous fluids. Dexhostix were unheard of but then how did we survive apparently neurologically intact?

Yes, we have come a long way in understanding and caring for infants and I'm sure we all agree it is a big improvement.

One of the biggest changes, I think is in the role of the father. He no longer says goodbye to his wife at the hospital's front door but rather actively participates in the birthing experience and subsequent bonding and care.

RE: EVELYN MIRON - BURN PATIENT

I wonder how many can remember the little 6 year old girl brought into the Children's Ward, 2nd. West, one fall day in 1943. Her name is Evelyn Miron a patient of Dr. A.W. Hogg. A box of matches had been left lying around and playing with them resulted in her clothes catching fire. With a possible 60% body burn the Doctors said that she might not live. They were wrong. It is now 40 years since that happened and she is still going strong. She was married in 1958 and brought two normal babies into the world now ages of 21 and 24 years.

Growing up was not easy for Evelyn as she had to have several plastic surgery operations done to correct problems that have developed through the years. We tried hard to keep her arms away from the sides of her body, both burned, but she would cry and send her temperature up. This resulted in the loss of more fluid and the Doctors thought it better to leave her alone. The result of this was that her arms became fused to her sides. Later on in her teens she had to have five plastic surgery operations to separate the growth of skin between the inside of the arms and the chestwall to make armpits. This was necessary to enable her to lift her arms up and to have full use of them. After the birth of her second child she underwent six hours of surgery to loosen circle at waistline and to relieve tight pressure on rib cage. Further surgery to

relieve tightness and pulling with the change in body shape, plus, a Cholecystectomy, hiatus hernia and a hysterectomy have all been done since that time.

There were many who helped during my time on that ward. With the passing years some names escape me but the one Senior Intern who was always such a help with his care and concern was Dr. Tony Natsuk. Any time he was called he came quick and willing with his skill and knowledge to help us. Thank goodness for the Doctors who have compassion for others. I would like to mention Florence Menzies. Whether she was in the O.R. or looking after a child for us, no one could have given more of herself.

I have kept in touch with Evelyn on and off over the years. She has turned out to be a capable woman, clever with her hands, she sews, does crafts, crochets and is a good cook. Recently, having developed some arthritic joints I have had good reason to appreciate Evelyn as she has been quite a help to me. I would never have thought back in those days that she would be around to help me when I needed it.

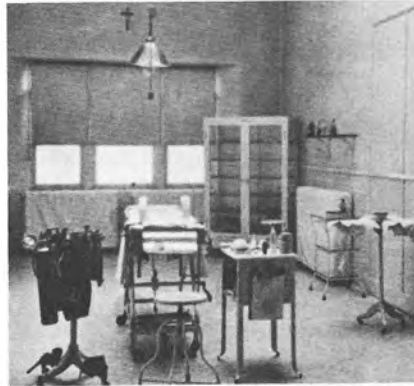
With todays specialized burn unit she would probably have had fewer complications but we did the best with what we had then.

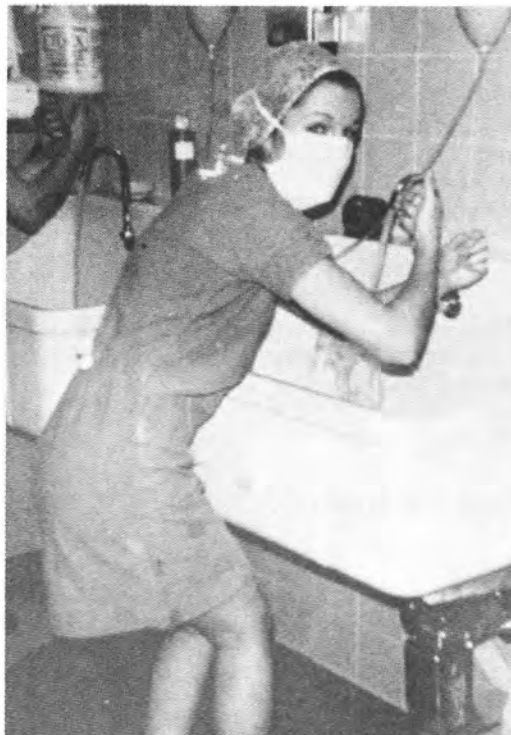

NURSING 1984 LAURA DICY

As August 29, 1983 rapidly approached, here I was, twenty-nine years of age, re-entering an educational system after an absence of over nine years. Not only that, but I may just be the oldest student in the class. What, I wondered, was I getting myself into.

Registration day finally arrived. Alone and nervous, I entered the school and timidly approached the auditorium from which exuded a tumult of noise. As I approached the doors, the number of people scurrying to a fro gradually increased. The auditorium door opened and there in front of me, mostly female, in a state of supreme chaos. Fortunately, when the initial shock wore off, it became quite clear that the chaos was organized. After several inquiries, I managed to queue up for registration. During lunch, I found the stores where I could buy my books and uniforms, thus bringing me one step closer to graduation in 1985.

After lunch, it was time to meet my "Big Sister." The class was presented individually to their "Big Sister", who presented us with a pink carnation.

I was also surprised to see male nursing students. What a wonderful thing to see. Up to this point, I had only met one male nurse. I thought doctors were males and nurses were females.

There also appeared to be a sense of unity, of human relationships, which developed amongst the students. We, whoever we were or wherever we came from, had a singular purpose and desire; to nurse. Why did I worry, I've only met mature adults who came in all shapes, sizes and even ages.

The months passed quickly, consuming our time with lectures, tests, and university courses. Skills had to be learned and practiced. Peri, one of our instructors kept trying to reassure us that we'd really enjoy giving intramuscular injections.

The lab day came when we had to give each other the injection. Some of us fainted, some quivered, and some of us weren't affected in the least. When we were finally allowed to give the injection to a real, live patient, we kept telling ourselves, "It's for the good of the patient," "We ARE going to like it," not really believing it of course. Guess what. Peri was right.

Not all of our time was taken up with study. As we got to know each other, it soon became evident that a lot of us had had some form of medical experience prior to coming to the school. At the same time, there was diversification in our interests and life-styles. We were from all over Manitoba and even Saskatchewan. Small towns, as well as large towns were represented. Married, single, engaged, and parents were all amongst us. Just about as wide a variety as you could imagine.

In the residence, there were parties, gabfests, study sessions; bitch sessions, attempts at aerobic exercises in the hallways, minor quarrelling, confidences and secrets were shared. Everything in other words that a family might be expected to provide. We even had "house mothers" who were always there if and when we needed them.

We as future nurses will be expected to take on the cloak of responsibility. Even now as student nurses, we are being given more and more responsibility for the welfare of those placed under our care. Even though we are under supervision, this task at times becomes a trifle overwhelming.

To know that we are liable and responsible for one or more human lives is truly a terrible responsibility but we are here because we care for and about people. In the end we will accept that awesome burden, which comes with the caring and nurturing of the sick and injured.
